

Hatherleigh pays tribute to Gordon Reynolds.

20.08.1934 - 25.02.2021



At the age of 18, Gordon was called for National Service and was posted to Kenya. One day, during manoeuvres, an ammunition wagon Gordon was guarding caught fire. In order to save the lorry, Gordon alongside his commanding officer removed the burning ammunition, badly burning his hands. He was awarded a Queen's Commendation for his bravery.

He met Audrey whilst helping out on her farm and they were married in February 1960. They celebrated their Diamond Wedding Anniversary last year with their close family.

Gordon & Audrey spent 24 years working at Essworthy Farm, looking after cattle, sheep and Haflinger ponies. In 1989, Gordon took on the job of Estate Manager at Broomford Manor Estate, working for Noel and Helen Edmonds. He and Audrey moved into Garden Cottage where they spent many hours restoring the walled garden back to its former glory.

They retired in 1998 to their bungalow in Hatherleigh, where again much of their time was spent in the garden, or walking their dogs on the Moor. They enjoyed showing their vegetables and flowers and won many prizes.

Gordon was a true man of the countryside. Although he was a shooting man, he enjoyed looking for bird nests in Spring, watching fox cubs playing, listening for the cuckoo and keeping an eye out for the first swallow each year.

Gordon was diagnosed with vascular dementia in 2018. This was the beginning of three heart wrenching years for the family. In October a room was secured for Gordon at Halwill Manor nursing home.

Gordon was a wonderful family man, he was a fun person and so full of life. He was generous with his time and was always willing to lend a helping hand, or offer a word of advice. He will be greatly missed by all who knew him.





TUCKERS PLOT

Lots of people say they can't grow carrots in Devon because of "the dreaded clay" and the "dreaded carrot fly"... NOT TRUE I say! The clay is a bonus in the summer months as it retains the moisture and, as to the carrot fly, it is a stupid insect and easily foiled!

I have oceans of Devon clay in my allotment and I have never had a problem growing carrots with the aid of a sheep feed bucket with the bottom cut out (every farmer will happily donate sheep feed buckets as they don't know what to do with them all).

Dig over the area to be planted to a good depth. Slice the bottom off your bucket and make an imprint on the ground where you want to grow your carrots. In the imprint, dig out about 3 inches of earth, sprinkle a little bone meal and fill the imprint with good compost.

Sprinkle your seeds in the composted imprint, replace the bottomed out feed bucket and sprinkle a little more compost just to cover the seeds

If it is frosty lay something over the top of the bucket if the seedlings have started to emerge but otherwise, do nothing apart from water in hot dry spells.

The carrot fly only cruise around looking for "victims" about 6"-10" above the soil height so they will fly past your buckets and carry on to your neighbour's carrots who haven't been reading **The Parish Pump!**

Carrot and Raisin Tray Bake

Spare Carrots and oranges hanging about at the back of the fridge? It's time for a tray bake!

You will need:

175g soft brown sugar

175ml sunflower oil

3 large eggs well beaten

140g finely grated carrot

100g raisins

Zest of 1 orange (juice for the icing)

175g self-raising flour

1 tsp bicarbonate of soda

1 tsp ground cinnamon

1/2 tsp ground nutmeg

For the icing:

175g icing sugar

The juice of the orange (only use what you need to make the icing a good drizzling consistency)

Beat the oil, eggs and sugar. Add the carrot raisins and zest. Add the flour, bicarb and spices and mix well.

Lightly grease a 7" x 11" tray and line the bottom with a piece of greaseproof paper.

Pour in the mix and cook for 25 mins at 180 degrees

Carefully turn out while still hot and drizzle over the mix of orange juice and icing sugar. When cooled cut into slices and scoff!

C.R.A.P—Community Roadside Action Party



The end of March saw the marking of a year passing since the first lockdown started, we really didn't know then just how bad things were going to get in this country and the world. It was the day before lockdown that Dennis Bater, who was our Chairman, posted his last message together with a photograph of the Hatherleigh "Band of Hope," on his Facebook page. Dennis had many followers from all over the world as well as all the local people who eagerly awaited to see what photographs or notes of interest Dennis would post, (and with the usual spelling mistakes which his daughter Nicola would correct.) This particular day Dennis was struggling to think straight and said he didn't know what he had got but it was pretty grim! We had no idea that it was Coronavirus and the shock when it was announced that Dennis had died on the 13th April hit many, very hard. Suddenly in this small town, the pandemic was very close to home. His was the first funeral where people stood in the streets to pay their last respects as there were no church services allowed, we hoped there wouldn't be any more occasions like this, but unfortunately, there would be.

Hatherleigh banded together to keep their vulnerable safe, to give struggling families the support they needed, shopping and medication was collected and a foodbank started. The Community Support Group did an amazing job as did all the volunteers who came forward. There were many in town who were Doctors and NHS staff and Carers and were on the front line, some still are. The Co-op and all the staff were brilliant, the only crisis being a shortage of toilet rolls, pasta and flour! Just as wonderful was the Post Office and our butchers and other suppliers of produce locally, who went above and beyond to keep us well stocked in the months ahead.

The school teachers and parents had to learn a new way of teaching children and some of the key workers children were being cared for and taught in the school as well. "Zoom" was suddenly a word we were all becoming familiar with and it was being used for all sorts of meetings, businesses and forums and the Internet allowed us to keep in touch with friends and family, schooling and the workplace. But what of our local non-essential businesses, pub and hotel? Everything was shut down, when would they be able to reopen and would they be able to continue or survive even?

We were only able to feel our way along in April 2020 as no one had any idea how things would go and what we had to face in the days to come. But we were luckier than many others around the country. We had the open spaces around us in which to walk and nature was putting on a wonderful show.

EXBOURNE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN ARE YOU AN EXBOURNE RESIDENT? IF SO, THIS CONCERNS YOU.

As you may know, Exbourne is required to make room for about 30 new houses between now and 2034. Your Neighbourhood Plan Group has persuaded the Council to accept the 9 houses of the new Wood Close development as counting towards those 30.

Sites now have to be chosen for the remaining houses needed. It is an important decision, because unless the Community agrees on a solution, it is very likely that we shall have one mposed on the village by the Council. **Doing nothing is not an option.**

A number of sites have been proposed by local landowners and after an assessment by an independent, professional body, seven potential sites have been identified; one of these is already suitable for development and the remaining six potentially suitable. **YOUR** views are now needed as to which of these six sites should be chosen. It is **important** to have **your** views so that West Devon Borough Council understands clearly what the people of Exbourne want in **their village**.




