#### **Hatherleigh pays tribute to Gordon Causley**

#### 1922 - 2021

It is with great sadness that we have heard that Gordon Causley passed away on Saturday 22nd May, a great character who will be missed by all who knew him.

Gordon George Payne Causley was born in 1922 to Samuel and Ellen Causley, the family came to Hatherleigh in the 1920's where Samuel ran a grocery and cafe business and a young Gordon would run around the town delivering goods. He left Hatherleigh to join up with the King's Own Royal Rifle Corps (later to become the Royal Green Jackets) and saw service during WW2 up through Italy. On his return from service he spent many years in Launceston



where his love of fishing gave him much enjoyment and plenty of stories to tell! He and his wife Betty finally left Launceston and settled once again in Hatherleigh, close to his relations the Gooding's and Bater's who supported him after Betty's death and in these later years as his health began to fail.

Gordon loved to socialise and enjoyed nothing better than to join in with any event, meet friends in the pubs or the cafes or coffee mornings, play cards or go to visit friends and family. He was a staunch member of the Hatherleigh branch of the British Legion and one of the oldest Poppy Sellers, (always to be found outside the Co-op).

Gordon recently enjoyed a Covid Celebration of his 99th Birthday with friends and family, all with masks and standing across the road from his house singing `Happy Birthday`. "One of the best birthdays ever", said Gordon! He enjoyed life right to the end.





#### **Hatherleigh pays tribute to David Alan Jones**

#### 1936-2021



My Dad was a terrifically charming and handsome man. His sense of humour could be both silly; beans squirting out of his mouth while Mum wasn't looking and acerbic. He would be extremely pleased with my use of words with three syllables though he might find I had used them incorrectly.

Politics was his favourite instrument to illicit discussion amongst friends, family and strangers alike. His anarchic views were complete.

Dad's drawing and artworks reflected his love for the Devon countryside and architecture. As a child he was taught to draw and paint by a lady who he lived with when sent to Devon during the bombings in London. One of his most public paintings is in a pub in Topsham.

He was a man who appreciated beauty and loved to be surrounded by books, art and music.

While he could be difficult, my brother, sister and I are grateful to him for the interests and humour he bestowed upon us as we grew up. We are all creative people with almost as many wonderful ideas as he had.

I don't think Dad expected to die on the day he did, though he had been feeling a great deal of pain after a recent fall. He had much unfinished sorting out of his artwork to do.

I wonder how others might remember David Jones. For my own part it is as a creative force with good taste and a great sense of humour. I wish life might have been kinder to him in his later years.

From the bottom of my heart I thank you all for the help and company you gave Dad.

In the seventies we moved from London, as a family to Market Street, Hatherleigh. Dad and Val had been part of the Swinging Sixties but he never wanted to move away again.

I can hear his voice telling me to stop, as so much of his life was proud and private. Thank goodness you were all around to greet him, discuss and laugh with him. After all that is Devon life. Please raise a glass to Dave Jones on Thursday June 3rd 2021 as it is his birth day. "Here's to a man loved and now lost to us."

I am hoping to have a memorial service at Hatherleigh Church in the summer when restrictions are lifted and we can sing a hymn and say a prayer for him.

I feel privileged to have been his friend, and I do not want him to be forgotten. He did artwork for Michael Morpurgo's War Horse. He had been working on other art works for the area, and I am hoping that an exhibition of his work could be set up somewhere, for others to see what a very, very talented artist he was.

I consider myself to be about the most blessed person alive to have my wife Lynn at my side in life and in the near impossible task of 'vicaring' five parishes. I write this on the morning of Lynn having an op on her foot which will likely see her laid up for about six weeks; the prospect does not thrill me! For a start, this will land us on a carnivorous diet as my cooking skills are generally limited to that of the BBQ and frying pan variety. But there are countless things I rely on her for every day. Four a start she proof reeds everything I right bee four it gows to print four witch I am tr?ly grape full. See how much trouble I'm in? Don't get me wrong, even after 34 years we still drive each other nuts sometimes, but I wouldn't be without her for the world.

In the bible, there is a Hebrew phrase which is only used for two people. It is 'Ezer kenegdo' which roughly translates as; 'life saver, life giver, constant helper' and 'the one who completes me'. This term is only used of Eve [Adam's wife] and the Holy Spirit.

In the church, we have just celebrated the annual feast of Pentecost, which remembers the day that God poured out His Holy Spirit on His followers, giving them a new power to live out their faith, a new quality of life and a whole range of spiritual gifts. None of us like losing control, and that places a hurdle in front of us to deal with, but I have found it the most liberating of things to do. With God we are in safe hands, that can carry us through the worst of circumstances and I, once again, commend Him to you.







#### **TUCKERS PLOT**

#### **Sunny Position, Well Drained Soil**

Is it just me or does anyone else find it really annoying that nearly every plant you pick up and look at, at the garden centre has a label saying "sunny position, well drained soil". You never see a label that says "best in soggy Devon clay and loves being under water in the winter and baked solid in the ground in Summer"!





when I sell things at Hatherleigh Market I can say to people, with confidence, "yes, this plant will do well in our local conditions". For most gardeners who want to establish perennials in their gardens to make "a good show" less labour intensive and who buy larger perennials from the garden centres, a bit of "suck it and see" gardening can get quite expensive when plants can cost £10 - £20 each so, to save money and save the demoralisation of rotted, dead plants in your garden in year 2, do a bit of research on how the original natural species of what you are planting, grow in the wild.

## Here are a couple of examples and some things I have found to work really well:

Lupins in the wild are water margin plants, growing in the boggy areas around lakes. My 5 year old lupins have been mostly underwater for the last 3 winters and they are looking lush and in bud now. Lobelia Cardinalis also is a plant that loves swampy ground and I have found that Knautia Macedonia and Geum Queen of Orange also don't mind living in my swamp of a border all winter.

My North facing, shady, soggy clay border with just a token amount of compost added is the perfect dwelling for Arum Lily, Hellebores and Aquilegia and my 3rd border is also clay (surprise, surprise!) and at the mercy of strong cross winds so when I want some height, good old Verbena Bonariensis is as tough as old boots, Knautia, Gaura and tall border Campanula are great too.

As a last tip.... if you love Dahlias but hate digging them and storing them then, as a rule of thumb the darker the leaf the more likely you can leave them in. The darker variants of "Bishops Children" for instance, just seem to survive in the ground over winter.

Wildflowers







**English Bluebells** 

English bluebells are more delicate than the non-native variety, with tightly curled back petals and flowers all on one side of the stem.



**Early Purple Orchids** 

These look nicer than they smell! Found until June in woodlands and road verges, with purple flowers and spotted leaves.

Herring Gulls are large, with yellow beak and pink legs. The beak has a red spot. Their front and tail are white, the back and wings are grey, with black and white bars across the tips. They come inland and can be found around farmland, reservoirs and rubbish tips!



Birds

Both house sparrows and herring gulls are on the Birds Of Conservation Concern, red list.



House Sparrows tend to form flocks. Males and females look different. This is a male, they have a grey top of the head, with a black bar across each eye. Their tummy is pale with a black bib under their chin. Females have brown back and wings and pale front but don't have the striking markings on the head.

#### Reptiles

We'd like to hear about any reptiles you see.

Grass Snakes are often seen in gardens and near water. They are usually an olive colour with black bars, but colour is variable. They have a creamy-white collar just behind the head.



#### Mammals

Here are a couple of mammal species that are often seen, but not so often recorded.



#### Rabbits

Rabbits have a network of warrens often hidden in scrub. They will graze grassland around their warrens, leaving closely cropped lawns.



#### Moles

It is unlikely that you will see a mole but their molehills are unmistakeable evidence of their presence.

#### Amphibians

We'd like to hear about any amphibians you see, there are very few records of amphibians in the Conservation Communities Project area.



Palmate Newts At this time of year they are breeding in ponds. Adults are 9cm long. Males are easiest to identify as they have large hind feet (almost like they are wearing gloves) and have a filament at the end of their tail. For both sexes, their throat underneath is unpigmented and has no spots (unlike a smooth newt, which has a spotty throat).



#### Dear Hatherleigh folks,

Following our 5 yearly building inspection, a long list of repairs have been identified as being essential to preserve the church building in Hatherleigh. Now, it is with great trepidation that I bring this up; too



often the church has been seen as 'just after the money' which I assure you is not my view. That said, I'm very aware that the parish church building is precious to many of you for a whole variety of reasons so I wanted to make you aware of the challenge we're facing and give you the opportunity to join in if you so wish.

We have some leaky areas of roof, a lot of repairs needed to stonework [especially the tower], and downpipes to replace, plus our intention of adding a toilet and a little kitchen to the interior. An estimate for the works comes in at around £270,000. We have a good dollop in hand and are applying for grants, but to be clear, there is no government money for these things and the National Lottery fund no longer gives any money to 'religious buildings' projects, leaving us with a lot to find. If you have an interest and a desire to contribute to this work we would be delighted to hear from you. **Covid Volunteer Group:** As previously reported this group continues to wind down as its need has gradually dissipated.

**Allotments:** There is currently a waiting list. We are in discussion with landowners to see if there is a possible field for rent to provide more.

Market: A meeting was held with Kingswood Homes informing us the build of the new market phase is being brought forward. Demolition of the remaining building is to begin in June. All stallholders have been informed. An area of hardstanding for a marquee, individual stalls and car parking spaces will be provided for the market to continue. The Community Centre have been approached and could provide additional space if needed. Funding continues to be sought for additions to the new pannier building.

#### **Local Aeronautical Acrobats!**

Can you spot the difference between Swift, Swallow and House Martin?



Swifts are black all over, with a small, pale patch on it's throat. Looking a bit like a boomerang when in the air, it is very sociable and can often be spotted in groups wheeling over roofs and calling to each other with high-pitched screams. It is larger than swallows and martins and, unlike them, does not perch on wires, buildings or trees. Swifts gather flying

insects to feed their young. Each food ball contains between 300 and 1,000 insects. **Where to spot them** - Very fast flight with rapid beats of long, scimitar-shaped wings; frequently twist and turns in the air, and alternates between flapping and gliding.

**Swallows** are small birds with long, pointed wings, forked tails. Plumage is dark above and pale below. Migrating Swallows cover 200 miles a day, mainly during daylight, at speeds of 17 – 22mph. **Where to spot them** - They are fast and graceful in flight, they swoop and wheel in the air with ease. They feed on the wing and use their wide mouths to catch insects in the air. Perch on wires, buildings or trees.

**House Martins** are glossy black above, completely white below, and has a white rump and a short, forked tail. House Martins fly all the way to tropical Africa for the winter, yet find their way back to exactly the same nest the following spring. **Where to spot them** - The House Martin is a common summer visitor to the UK, arriving in April and leaving in October. It builds mud nests under the eaves of houses. They feed on flying insects and aphids. Commonly they perch on wires, buildings or trees.
