

The Night Sky November 2021

November is a good month for observing the night sky as the weather is more likely to be cold and clear. New Moon falls on the 4th of November. It is around the time of the New Moon that we are able to see fainter celestial objects. This includes galaxies and nebulae (clouds of gas and dust where stars are born). Full Moon falls on the 19th of November. At this time fainter celestial objects are much more difficult to observe as the light of the Moon washes them out.

The planet Uranus reaches opposition on November 5th. When a planet reaches opposition it is visible all night long and is also at its closest approach to Earth. This distant world is visible in a pair of binoculars and looks like a bluish dot. You'll be able to find it about 21 degrees above the eastern horizon. It will be in the constellation of Aries, the Ram. To give you an idea of how far away the planet is from Earth it will be about 160 light minutes away. That means that travelling at the speed of light it would still take you over 2 and a half hours to reach the planet!

Finally the Leonid meteor shower takes place on the night of the 17th-18th of November. You can see about 15-20 meteors per hour. Meteors are little grains of dust that burn up high in our atmosphere. They are termed meteorites if they hit the ground. The best time to observe this shower is between 11pm and 4am as it is during these hours that the night side of the Earth will turn into the oncoming meteor stream. There will be a bright moon which will wash out some of the fainter meteors but if your lucky you may catch the occasional fireball racing across the sky.





Conservation Communities - Wildlife Spotters Challenge

Autumn - Hedgerows

With an abundance of fruit and nuts in autumn, hedgerows are where many species gather to feed and fatten up before winter. Particularly hibernating species, like hedgehogs and dormice.

Places to look for wildlife --- Take a close look and see what you can find.

Blackberries are one of the most abundant fruits. These provide food for a huge number of species, including mammals, birds and insects.

Ivy flowers through autumn provid a much-needed nectar source. Mature plants produce greenish-yellow flowers . You can spot late-flying butterflies, such as the comma on this ivy.



Insects

Angle shades: This distinctive moth is often visible in the daytime. It uses camouflage to hide, resting with its wings folded along its body, resembling a dry leaf. Adults can be seen in early autumn. This species overwinters in the ground as a caterpillar.





Galls: Fallen leaves give a great opportunity to look closely at some of the galls that can be found, like these spangle galls, caused by a gall wasp. Galls most commonly form due to insects, forcing the tree to produce a growth for the benefit of the insect. Gall wasps are a common culprit, and there are many different species. They cause other commonly spotted galls like oak marble galls and robin's pin-cushions.

Birds

Redwings gather in large groups in autumn. They migrate to Britain in October and spend the winter here, initially feeding on abundant berries. Redwings spend most of the time in hedgerows, only visiting gardens in extreme weather. A small member of the Thrush family, they have a striking red colour to their underwing and a distinctive cream-coloured stripe above the eye. Fieldfares are another, larger, member of the Thrush family. They also overwinter in Britain, often in large flocks. Often seen along hawthorn hedges, feeding on the berries. Again, they rarely visit gardens unless snowy weather covers their preferred habitat.

Healthy Hedges make fine Dormouse Homes

Thank you to Rob Wolton for his amazing tour on Saturday 16 October for the Conservation Communities Project. Rob is Chair of the Devon Hedges Group and is keen to share his knowledge on the many benefits of Devon hedges to farmers and the general public, this walk focused on wildlife, particularly the adorable Dormouse.

We learnt that Dormice spend 75% of their lives either sleeping or hibernating. From spring to autumn Dormice feed on petals, pollen, insects, berries and nuts and they spend their entire time up in the branches of woodlands, hedgerows and scrub without ever touching the ground. In winter they



hibernate at ground level. We were all thrilled to learn how to identify dormice nests as it is very hard to spot a dormouse itself.

The best place to find a dormouse nest is to look for a hedge that is thick and bushy with field roses, brambles, hazel or hawthorns. Once the autumn leaves start to fall, the nests become more visible. They may be as high as your eyeline, or as low as your knees, but they will always be in dense hedges or undergrowth. A dormouse nest is loosely woven, long dried grass and dried leaves and they always build their nest on the supportive stem. They can be as large as a grapefruit or as small as a tangerine and they look just like a bird's nest but have no visible entrance (a dormouse pushes its way through the wall of its nest).

Reporting evidence of dormice (see this month's Spotters Sheet – hazelnuts)

The hazel dormice used to be widespread across the UK, because of their declining numbers they are now protected. Here in Devon their population remains strong. Please remember a license is required to handle a dormouse, but if you spot an old a nest this autumn, please do report it to **www.dbrc.org.uk**

Help assess the state of our hedgerows

Biodiversity audits will soon be re-written for our parishes, hedges are an important aspect of our landscape and a vital habitat for our local wildlife. <u>Tuckers Plot</u>

English Muffins

As the days get shorter and we, maybe, get up a little later, breakfast can merge into lunch and it's time for "Brunch". There's nothing better than a nice home-

made English Muffin with a couple of slices of local dry-cured bacon, a nice poached egg and a dollop of Hollandaise.

To make 12 muffins that freeze really well you will need:

250ml milk +250ml water warmed

1 tsp yeast

1 tsp sugar

60g of butter or cooking marg

750g of flour (half and half strong bread flour and plain flour)

1 tsp salt

2 tbsp of fine polenta for dusting (optional but gives them a nice crunch)

Chopped parsley for a garnish (optional)

If you have a bread maker then shove everything in on a dough setting but if not then combine the milk, water, yeast and sugar and let the yeast bubble in it for 10 mins and then put in the melted butter/marg, salt and flour and knead, rest and rise as for bread.

When the dough is risen then splat or roll it out to an inch thick and cut out muffins with a pastry cutter.

Drench the muffin shapes in Polenta (or flour) and leave to rise for about 30 mins. As these are not cooked in the oven I usually cover them with some muslin or a tea towel and let them rise on a thin plastic board or a piece of silicone on top of a hot water bottle..... works really well!

Heat a dry frying pan or griddle to a medium high heat and cook your muffins. They usually take about 8-10 mins per side but keep an eye on the first lot and how they are browning off on the bottom..... you may need adjust the heat or turn then over sooner and then turn them back again but if they have about 18 mins in total then they will be crispy on the outside and light and fluffy in the middle.

When you have lightly grilled, griddled or fried your bacon in the same pan then just toast the inside of the split crumpet a little in the same pan or grill, layer your bacon, your poached egg and your sauce, sprinkle with chopped parsley and put the top on and be ready for the squidge when your egg oooooooozes out!

The Trick To Successfully Over-Wintering Geraniums

Geraniums hate the damp more than the cold and we certainly get enough damp during the winter months in Devon!

If your geraniums are in the flower bed put them in a pot and bring all your potted geraniums into the greenhouse, a warm porch or conservatory. The plants will still need light so don't put them in a shed.

Take all flowers, buds, damaged leaves and odd bits of stalk off the plant and make sure the surface of the soil is clean with no fallen leaves or petals on it.

Leave the plant for a week or so to get use to it's new environment but keep an eye out for any leaves going yellow or brown and take them off.

When you have some time to give them a bit of TLC. Thin out the branches of the plant by cutting them down to a leaf node with a sharp knife and take off most or all of the big leaves. Don't cut the big branches down to stumps as rot may well get into the heart of the plant.

Throughout the winter check the plants once a month and take off any dead leaves. Removing dead bits, keeping the surface of the soil clean and don't cram plants into a small area together; these are the keys to their survival. Only water from below once a month or even less.... never water over the top with a watering can.

The plant will try to flower over winter but take the buds off as the plant will have enough to do keeping itself healthy throughout the winter without trying to flower too!

I have geraniums that are 5 years old and still going strong and with a bit of pruning at the beginning of each season they will go from strength to strength each year AND you can root the cuttings for more plants.



Saving Your Tomato Seeds

If you are getting a good crop of toms then why not save your own seed from the toms that are particularly to your liking.

If you like small sweet toms like Streamline then pick the biggest softest tom from the top of a truss on the most prolific plant. If you like big fat Coeur de Boeuf then pick the biggest ripest tom from the plant that is producing the most good sized fruit. You are looking for good genes so don't save seed as an after-thought from a small just ripe tom just because it's the only one left.

Cut your tom open and with the tip of a knife scrape out the seeds on to a piece of paper kitchen towel. (of course you can still eat the flesh!) Spread the seeds around with your finger tips so they are not all in a clump and leave lying flat until the paper and seeds are thoroughly dry. Fold up the paper and keep in a box in cool dry conditions and when you want to plant then just wet the paper and gently scrape the seeds onto your compost and lightly cover with soil






