The season of Remembrance.

Well, I'm not sure what happened to summer, a pretty brief affair in these parts, and here we are again seeing shorter days and cooler nights. It is at this time of year, in spite of such highlights as the Carnival to look forward to, that our minds turn again to Remembrance.

Traditionally, the church has marked 'All souls' and 'All Saints' on the days where October becomes November, but I have a special invite for you all this year.

We have been though dark days together, and many of our beloved folks have been lost from among us at a time when we have been unable to mark their passing as we would have wished. Limited numbers allowed at funerals and the forbidding of singing has made the difficulty of loss harder still for so many. Some families spoke of an intention to hold memorial services later when the rules allowed, but I fear the community would struggle to mark so many in a short time, although some of these may happen.

A Service of Remembrance for our beloved departed on Sunday evening, October 31st at 7.00 p.m. at St. John the Baptist church, Hatherleigh.

Together we will name those we have lost, have the opportunity to light candles, and sing of our hope in the resurrection. As a community we have suffered many collaborative losses; it seems appropriate to me that we mark those together and support one another in our collective grief, while looking with hope to a better future, both here on earth, and a final hope for eternity together. 



BEATING THE BOUNDS

The ancient tradition of Beating the Bounds of the Borough of Hatherleigh took place on Bank Holiday Monday 30th of August. The perambulation of the 71/2 - 8 mile boundary has taken place every 7 years within living memory, but the tradition goes back far longer, possibly to the 13th century, when the earliest known grant of Borough status was awarded to the town by the



Crown. In the early 20th century, records show that the walk was usually undertaken after the meeting of the Borough Court, where the running and business of the Borough was discussed and regulated. It is likely that this may have been the custom in previous centuries. Now the Beating of the Bounds is organised by the Town Council with help from the Hatherleigh Moor Management Committee (HMMC). This year approximately 220 people began the walk at Hole Court at 11am, a similar number to last time. They moved off through the churchyard to pass through fields, woodland and Hatherleigh Moor, over fences and hedges and through ditches to finish in the Town Square at around 4.30pm. Although the modern route has had to deviate slightly in parts over the years, it keeps as faithfully as possible to the oldest known map of the boundary dating from the 19th century.

On route were the customary breaks, firstly for the traditional group photograph at the Monument, followed by refreshments provided by HMMC on a lower part of the Moor. The final break was at Passaford Bridge, where members of the Town Council threw coins into the River Lew for the children.

This year, for the first time, modern concerns necessitated the creation of a risk assessment and appointment of stewards wearing high visibility etc., but this in no way affected the spirit of the event. And although a number of the older generation who had for years lead the walk had been sadly lost in recent times, their memory was carried by their children and grandchildren. In fact this years event was hailed by many as one of the best, with perfect weather and ground conditions and the joy of coming together again as a community to celebrate on of Hatherleigh's best loved traditions.





Hatherleigh Carnival

Less than 2 months to go until our hopeful date for Hatherleigh Carnival 2021, and a plan for the weekend is starting to take place- we know there are a few of you out there who are well underway with the crepe papering! Our first Tar Barrel Committee meeting of the year was also a great success, with a couple of new pullers getting involved this year.

However, Hatherleigh Carnival 2021 is at risk.

For the first time since its conception 118 years ago in 1903, Hatherleigh Carnival did not take place last year for the first time during a time of peace.

When the carnival first began, it was called the 'Hatherleigh and Meeth Hospital Association Carnival', which was set up to raise funds for medical care for folk from the parishes. We continue to fulfil our charitable aims raising funds for local and regional charities and organisations. We came in a full circle last year during our 'Carnival that never was', donating to the RD&E branch of the NHS Foundation Trust.

Due to the ever-changing regulations, we were forced to make our decision regarding Carnival 2020 in mid-August, with the safety of our community as the driving force behind this difficult decision. This in itself was a momentous decision to make, being the first time the Hatherleigh Carnival procession and flaming tar barrels had been cancelled since the Second World War.

Now, 13 months on, after starting the wheels rolling for Hatherleigh Carnival 2021, we have found ourselves at a standstill.

Year after year, we have complied with every request from our insurers, Devon & Cornwall Police, and the fire service in order to go ahead. This has meant altering the way Carnival operates over the years, such as walking sections of the tar barrel route for example, despite never once filing a claim against our insurance. Even this year, we are continuing to weigh up the risks and remove certain elements we feel could pose unnecessary face-to-face contact between attendees, such as the judging of the afternoon and evening processions.

Despite endless hard work from Gareth and the rest of the team at Richard Tidball's Insurance Service, who have been exploring countless avenues on our behalf, we have not able to acquire insurance from anywhere.

Due to the nature of the event, the Carnival needs to be underwritten to a value of £5 million, and without this, we cannot close the road and allow the procession and tar barrels to take place.

We are putting out a desperate plea to anyone who thinks they might be able to help us, either by suggesting a potential insurance provider, or an individual/s who can underwrite for us to the value of £5 million.

We are reaching out to local and regional press, our local MP, Mel Stride, and further afield if needs be, to keep Hatherleigh Carnival going.

Congratulations go again to this year's royalty, who were officially announced at a special event following the customary Beating of the Bounds for the Hatherleigh Parish on bank holiday Monday (30th), accompanied by a couple of sets of great live music from local funk/rock band Quattro.

Our Carnival Queen for 2021 is Charlotte Reddaway, and our Princess is Alicia-Rose Janoswki, and the Hatherleigh Carnival President for 2021 is Deb Laing-Trengove.

The meeting commenced with a minute silence in honour of our dear friend Norman Moorcroft R.I.P.

We would like to erect a fitting tribute to Norman and his long service to the people of Hatherleigh and will discuss this with the Community Centre.

Island Park: The zip wire has sadly been condemned. We felt this might be an opportune moment to canvas the opinion of Park users as to what equipment they would like to see there. Notices have been posted in the Park. It would be very helpful if users would please take the time to fill in the short survey.

The dead ash trees around Island Park have been removed by Devon County Council.

The broken bench outside of school will not be replaced as the Royal British Legion are kindly going to site a new bench in its place.

Sadly, the initiative to refund the parking fee to Co-op customers to try to avoid the illegal parking outside the store will not be going ahead. It was not supported by the relevant parties.

The grass verges around Moorview road junctions have now been cut to provide a good visibility splay. We continue to monitor but if there are any other areas causing concern, please contact one of your Councillors.

Approximately 250 people took part in The Beating of the Bounds. It was very successful and a good time was had by all. With thanks to The Moor Management Committee for their hard work and welcome refreshments and to the Carnival Committee for providing the band to welcome everyone home at the finish.

The Remembrance Day Parade this year will return to its usual full procession route down Market

Street and Bridge Street with the church service in between. Added safety measures mean the Town Council is applying for a road closure. Notices will be circulated and more details to follow in next month's pump.

The Market continues to operate successfully from the temporary marquee. Councillors have had a discussion on the Markets future and will investigate the implications on acquiring a long-term lease.

We have heard from the Stagecoach bus company that the route of the 5A bus will not be altered to connect with Okehampton Rail station when the new hourly train service to Exeter commences. We will continue to lobby for this.

There have been complaints about children playing on the bicycle racks outside of school. These are regularly in use by cyclists so please could parents ensure their children are aware they are not safe to climb on.

We have been contacted by people concerned that Skateboarders have been seen on the roads amongst cars on their way to the Skatepark. **THIS IS NOT SAFE.** Please wait until you are in the park to skate for your own safety.

We continue to collect information on blocked drains around Town. If you see one, please report to a Councillor with a photograph if at all possible.

North Devon Biosphere and Westcountry Rivers Trust call for volunteers to contribute to River Citizen Science.

The North Devon Biosphere's Pledge for Nature project is teaming up with Westcountry Rivers Trust's (WRT) Citizen Science Investigations (Westcountry CSI) to develop a network of river Citizen Scientists across the North Devon Biosphere.


The Biosphere's rivers and streams need monitoring as they are extremely vulnerable to pollution from issues such as run-off of nutrients and sediments from agriculture as well as domestic and industrial waste (e.g., from ball clay quarries, anaerobic digestion plants, dairy industry, road run-off etc.), with far-reaching environmental, economic and social consequences from source to sea. The Environment Agency's latest (2019) assessment of the ecological status of the 100 waterbodies in the Biosphere concluded that only 15 of these were in Good condition, a decline from 18 in 2016, while none had a Good chemical status.

Iconic species like the freshwater pearl mussel are at risk of extinction in the Biosphere and the latest assessments put the Atlantic salmon as "at risk" in the Torridge and "probably at risk" in the Taw. Lydia Deacon, Westcountry CSI officer, said: "We've joined forces with Pledge for Nature as the Biosphere's rivers and streams are in trouble and need our urgent help.

"By volunteering with Westcountry CSI, people can monitor water quality, record wildlife and invasive species, and identify pollution sources, all of which will support our charity's mission to restore and protect the rivers, lakes, and estuaries of the Westcountry for the benefit of nature, people, and local economies and the water bodies in the Biosphere."

The North Devon Biosphere Reserve's ambitious Nature Recovery Plan aims to improve the condition of the region's rivers and streams through habitat restoration and reducing pollution.

Mike Moser, Chair of the Nature Improvement Group said: "One way to achieve this is by increasing public participation and awareness so that there are more "eyes on the river" to monitor river conditions and identify pollution issues. "Collecting regular water quality samples not only produces good data to identify areas of concern, but also helps people to get to know their river and identify positive and negative changes, influencing action where needed."



Tuckers Plot

It's pepper and chilli picking season. I look forward to roasting my pointy peppers and pickling my Long Joe to have as pickles throughout the coming year but my FAVOURITE thing is Yemista (Greek stuffed peppers) This recipe is with an extra special filling: I made rather a lot as they are a big favourite in our house and they freeze and re-heat in the microwave really well but the recipe below is for 8 good sized peppers.

Wash and cut out the top of the peppers.

De-seed and cut off the pith but save the lid to fit back onto your peppers when stuffed.

Tightly fit the peppers in a tray or dish so they stand up and won't fall over.

In a big bowl mix the following.....

500g Paella rice or long grain rice, 1 large grated onion, 2-3 cloves of finely chopped garlic, a big handful of chopped herbs (parsley, dill, mint), a tin of chopped tomatoes or your own equiv, 2 tbsp tomato puree, 1 tsp sugar, 1 1/2 tsp caraway seeds (optional), sprinkle of cinnamon and nutmeg, a handful of sultanas, 1/2 a jar of pitted black olives sliced, a handful of very finely chopped celery, a handful of capers, half a jar of sun dried tomatoes chopped into pieces, some finely chopped bits of red / green pepper, courgette, aubergine (whatever you have to hand), 1 block of Feta cheese, 1 cup of water, the juice of a large lemon, lots of black pepper and a little bit of salt (not too much salt as when you have mixed the ingredients you will add a crumbled block of Feta which is quite salty).

When you have given everything a thorough mix add the Feta and gently mix in so you retain nice little chunks.

Cover and put this in the fridge for a least a couple of hours or overnight or anything in between.

Loosely fill your peppers with the stuffing.... don't put too much and don't pack it down as the rice will triple it's volume and split your peppers.

Add a small knob of butter to each pepper and put the lids on so they fit snug.

Pour a glass of water into the tray (don't get it in the peppers).

Lightly brush the peppers with oil

Cover tightly with a lid or with tin foil if you are using a tray.

Put in a pre-heated oven at 180 degrees for 35 minutes.

Remove the foil/ pan lid and cook for a further 30 minutes.

Your rice should be cooked but just remove the lid and test a bit of rice to make sure as ovens and the size of peppers vary and nobody likes crunchy rice!

If cooked, leave to stand for 10 minutes before serving.

These freeze really well too.

The Future of our Hedges

Here in Devon we can boast about our world class hedges, not only do they define our local landscape they are also hugely important for wildlife.

There are many benefits of a healthy hedge for wildlife habitat including food and shelter for pollinators, shelter and shade for livestock, wind protection for gardens and buildings, reduced water and soil run-off, flood prevention and to provide renewable energy in woodfuel.

Did you know, here in Devon, some 13% of carbon is locked up in our landscape hedges? By increasing the numbers or width of hedgerows by 40% we can significantly contribute to the UK carbon targets.

If you're considering planting a hedgerow (perhaps instead of a fence) or repairing gaps in existing hedges, the Devon Wildlife Trust project, Saving Devon's Treescapes has free trees available for public and private land. Anything from 1-500 trees to plant individually or trees for a hedgerow.

Hedges are always changing and it isn't possible to keep them at exactly the same point indefinitely, managing them on a cycle ensures their health and long term survival. Various methods and techniques need to be employed to care for a hedge during its long and dynamic cycle and a hedge that is out of condition, thin or gappy, can be brought back into favourable condition with techniques such as hedge laying or coppicing. **www.devonhedges.org** provides information about how to manage and maintain a healthy hedge over a period of several years.

Are our local hedges in their best condition?

Devon Biodiversity Records Center is working with the Conservation Communities Project to assess the state of the hedgerows in our parishes. This citizen science project calls on the help of people living in this area to record the state of our wildlife. This year we're asking people to help us learn about the condition of our hedges. We know where the hedges are, but we need your help to add information such as their height, width and the species they contain. We are launching a survey you can take part in, with a few simple questions. Brush up on your winter twig ID and join in! 
