Good day everybody!

Hope all is well in your world post-carnival and everyone is fully recovered.



Normally you would be seeing Leigh's message in this space, but this month the baton has been passed to me. My name is Olive and I have been a resident in Hatherleigh for 20 years. Some of you may even have bumped into me when I worked at the surgery when it was in Sanctuary Lane. So you might be thinking "that's a bit odd - why would she be doing the message this month?" Well, it's the result of a left-field adventure. Normally we talk about things being 'left-field' because we didn't see something coming - it was out of our line of vision.

Following on from Covid - which nobody saw coming - many of us have been left with a "what do I do now?" phase of life. And like everyone else in that phase, I started to look for some answers. What I didn't plan on was the new left-field adventure, 'Become A Lay Reader' So here I am, under Leigh's guidance, enrolled in the first year of the Lay Readership Training in Exeter, where all kinds of new adventures lay before me. I feel really unqualified to do this, but taking on a new adventure means leaving known things behind and moving forward in a new direction, even if it is out of your comfort zone.

On the course, the session that has impacted me most so far, has been the one about how the behaviour of people who live on one side of the world has changed the lives of those who live on the other. Especially when those people are already the poorest and most disadvantaged. When Creation Care Officer Lydia took us through some of the photos and changes she personally knew about, it really brought home to me the message in a much more personal way.

For instance, because of the way we live, drive, shop and cook in the west, people in the African nations are struggling to eat - because they have no rain to grow their crops. What was once green and fertile land is now hard, crusty, sun-baked and scorched ground. And they are hungry.

Becoming so much more aware how the choices I make affect the environment, I will try to make some better choices this Christmas.

Another new unknown lies before us, 2022, and with all the challenges of the last couple of years, we can either view it with trepidation or with courage.

If life has knocked you for six a bit and you feel in need of help or support for the year ahead, if you are new, if you are struggling with life alone, why not pop in and say hi to us at your local church?

You don't have to navigate the new year alone. We'd love to see you and extend a warm welcome in advance.

"It's an exciting feeling knowing you are pushing your limits."

Hi, I'm Florence, or as some people call me, Flo. I'm 9 years old (but almost 10). My No.1 top favourite hobby is skateboarding. I love the feeling when the wind blows your hair behind your back as you zoom down a ramp.

My skating journey began during lockdown in June 2020. I'd always had a skateboard but never really used it until my friend got one and we went to the square together and started messing around on our boards. I loved it! From then on, my dad began taking me down to the skatepark every day, so I made progress really quickly. My dad was a great skater (when he was young!) so I'm lucky because he can teach me well. He's an awesome coach!



My best trick is something called the wave. The wave is a ramp in the shape of yep – you guessed it – a wave! It launches you off the end like a cannonball. This trick takes a lot of precision and balance to NAIL it.

I'm currently working on an axle stall on the half pipe. If you have absolutely no idea what I've just said then listen up! First of all, the half pipe is two ramps joined together called the transition. An axle stall is where you have to drop in on the half pipe, then maneuver your board onto the coping (the coping is the metal part), then come back down into the half pipe again. I know – very confusing! But I am so excited to get that feeling when you land a trick – which in skater language we call 'stoked'!

The skateboarders who inspire me the most are Roxana Howlett and Sky Brown. Fun fact – Roxana is a local girl from Exeter who recently came 1st in the Skateboard GB National Championships for women's street skating. Sky Brown won bronze in the Olympics and I admire her because she encourages girls all around the world to skate. Girls skating is important to me because boys have taken over the sport in the past and girls sometimes receive sexist comments because they skate. So a message to any girls out there who skate – don't stop and believe in



yourself!

I love skating. It has taught me that I'm stronger than I think I am.

Am I too short to become a firefighter?

There is no minimum height requirement to become a firefighter.

Do I need to sleep on station?

No. On-call staff have a pager that alerts them when a call comes in. You will then go about vour daily life.

Could this help me to become a full time firefighter?

Last year we offered 43 full time positions to on-call staff. This will continue.

If I have to work out of town or take the kids to school, how do I do this?

At this station contracts range from 30 - 120 hours per week, you are only required o be immediately available during the hours you agree with us.

Dave works shifts while providing 96 hours per week split between days and nights earning £12,014 a year. Sarah has her own business and gives 65 hours per week including some weekends, she earns £8,669 a year.

The Night Sky December 2021

December nights are long and cold. This is an excellent time for stargazing. New Moon falls on the 4th. This means that faint celestial objects like galaxies and nebulae (clouds of gas and dust where stars are born) become more easily visible. The Orion Nebula is easy to view at this time of year. You can find the Orion Nebula (also known as M42) in the south eastern part of the sky. It is just three stars that make up Orion's belt. To the naked eve the nebula itself looks like a fuzzy patch of light. Binoculars will show more detail and make it more easily visible. The Orion Nebula is 1500 light years away. This means that the light now reaching your eyes left the Orion Nebula 1500 years ago. In other words the further out into space we look the further back in time we are seeing. On the nights of the 13-14th of December you can see the Geminid meteor shower. It's one of the best meteor showers of the year with over a hundred meteors an hour visible during its peak. However there will be a bright moon out at this time. You may still be fortunate enough to see the brighter meteors and even fireballs racing across the sky. 11pm-4am is the best time to see this shower because this is when the night side of the Earth turns into the oncoming meteor stream.

Full Moon is on December 19th. The Winter Solstice is on the 21st and it signals the start of winter in the Northern Hemisphere.

Recent news suggests that the UK is nature-depleted, with half its biodiversity left, far below global average of 75%. We are lucky to live in this wonderful area, rich in wildlife. That gives us even more determination to hold on to, and help the biodiversity that we have.

Despite this unusual year, here is what's been achieved locally in 2021

<u>Himalayan Balsam Pulling</u>: as beautiful as this exotic pink flower is, it is devastating our local wildlife and causing erosion along the river banks. By pulling it up we can stop its spread.

<u>Churchyard wildlife</u>: With a second year of wildflowers, the churchyard is a haven for wildlife. The sunny September weather provided the perfect conditions for helpers to rake up the cuttings. We look forward to seeing what grows in year 3 of this initiative.

<u>Celebrating Wildlife Summer Events</u>: A guided walk on Lower Moor saw a wildflower list of over 40 species. Moth trapping revealed just how beautiful UK moths can be (73 species were recorded). Bug hunting in the churchyard was great fun, families discover all sorts from spiders to grasshoppers and butterflies. A night time bat detecting walk discovered 5 types of bat on Lower Moor. Wildlife sightings were officially recorded with Devon Biodiversity Records Centre.

Education visits: Hatherleigh Community Primary School wildlife activities working with nearly 200 children, included river dipping where we learnt about all the important insect life that lives in the River Lew, and bug hunting in the school woodland area to discover how important minibeast are in the food chain (especially for bats!).

Nature guided walk topics included: Meeth Glow Worms, Healthy Hedges and Dormouse.

<u>A series of online lectures</u> were made available by the Conservation Communities Project. Subjects include: Hedgehogs, Track and signs, Winter Twig ID, Managing Devon Hedges for Wildlife, Meadow Mammals, Identifying Devon's Amphibians, Woodland Plants Identification, Devon Bat Talk, Dragonflies of North Devon. https://www.devonwildlifetrust.org/what-we-do/our-projects/conservation-communities-project

<u>Mini Meadows Challenge</u>: Having to work in isolation, we encouraged people to sow wildflower seeds in their patch (both big and small). The response was overwhelming, overall 15 acres of land was pledged to grow wildflowers in Hatherleigh and surrounding parish.

<u>Wildflower verges</u>: Volunteers helped throughout the year to maintain wildflower verges both at Moorview and Island Park. Space for long grass and native flowers to grow is becoming ever more important to support our depleting insect populations.

<u>Wildlife tasks and surveys of 2021</u>: Bat and bird boxes maintenance and surveys on Hatherleigh Moor, Harvest Mouse surveys, Wildflower surveys, Brown hairstreak butterfly surveys, Hedgelaying training and Hedge surveys. Meeth welcomed new volunteers at the tree nursery.

<u>Community Roadside Action Party (C.R.A.P</u>): launched on Facebook encouraging people to 'adopt' a section of road or footpath to pick up litter. This has seen many individuals taking action to keep our countryside litter free.

Publication contributions: When Hatherleigh Stood Still, Parish Pump, Wildlife Spottersheets.

Thank you to everyone who cares about our local wildlife, your attendance at events, supportive comments and feedback about your wildlife sightings is making a huge difference.

A very merry 'wild' Christmas to you!

Nature has always been an inspiration for our Christmas stories, decorations, and food.



Evergreen plants have long held symbolic significance during wintertime. The ancient Egyptians, Celts, Druids, Romans, and Vikings all believed that various evergreens would keep evil and illness away.

Christmas trees are evergreen conifers such as spruce, fir and pines, originating from Northern Europe. They can now be seen across our landscape, these trees retain their leaves throughout the winter and provide shelter for birds, insects and other wildlife. The Scots Pine is the only pine tree native to Britain (other UK evergreen trees are Yew, Holly, Juniper and Box). The tradition of decorating trees came to the UK from Germany, and was made popular in Victorian times by Queen Victoria and her husband Albert.

Robins have become associated with Christmas cards because postmen in Victorian Britain were nicknamed "robins" due to their bright red uniforms. Both male and female robins have the redbreast and is one of the most popular and recognised British birds. Have you noticed a robin's red-breast is actually orange? The bird was named before the English language had a word for the colour 'orange', which came about in England during the 16th century when oranges (the fruit) first appeared here.





Partridge - Although there are no pear trees, there have been sightings of a partridge on Hatherleigh Moor this year! Once common this bird has declined in England by 80% in the last 30 years. The partridge in the song 'The 12 days of Christmas', supposedly represents Jesus. This is because Jesus was prepared to die for his children, as is a partridge. The cock defends the young and has been known to fly at anyone or anything that might be a threat.

Tinsel - a.k.a spider webs! There are many versions this story ... a woman cleaned her house for Christmas. The spiders in the house learned about a beautiful tree in one room and took refuge. They danced all over the tree and left their webs behind. Father Christmas saw the beautiful webs and transformed them into silver and gold. In honour of that tale, people hang tinsel on their Christmas trees and some follow a custom to include a spider among the decorations. Spiders will stay active all year if inside our nice warm homes. Outside they survive the winter by seeking shelter in piles of rocks, leaves or wood. Once snuggled up, spiders enter a slowdown state called diapause.



Holly is a symbol of peace. The tree was seen as a fertility symbol and a charm against witches, goblins and the devil. It was thought to be unlucky to cut down a holly tree but Romans connected holly with Saturn (their god of agriculture) and hung boughs of it in celebration of Saturnalia, the festival that became Christmas. Christians adopted the symbol many years later, giving it new meaning, with the red berries representing the blood of Christ, and the leaves representing the crown of thorns.

An important part of our landscape, holly provides dense cover for birds and deep, dry leaf litter for hibernating hedgehogs. The flowers are great for our pollinating insects and the leaves are eaten by caterpillars of the holly blue butterfly and several species of moth. The berries are a vital source of food for birds in winter. Watch out for Mistle Thrush who vigorously guards the berries.

Ivy is a symbol of eternal life. Wearing a wreath of ivy leaves around the head was said to prevent one from getting drunk. The Roman god Bacchus (god of wine and revelry), was often depicted wearing a wreath of ivy and grapevines. Ivy was a symbol of fidelity and so priests would present a wreath of ivy to newly married couples. Today it is still the custom for bridal bouquets to contain a sprig of ivy.

Ivy is often accused of strangling trees, but it doesn't harm the tree at all, and supports over 50 species of wildlife. The nectar, pollen and berries of ivy are an essential food source for insects and birds during autumn and winter when little else is available. It also provides shelter for insects, birds, bats and other small mammals.

> Ashen Faggot – a.k.a the 'yule log', not the chocolatey sponge cake version! In Devon there is a tradition of creating a bundle of sticks, the <u>Ashen Faggot</u>. The practice would see a bundle of sticks bound with nine green lengths of ash bands burnt in a hearth on Christmas Eve. While it burned celebrations, singing songs, dancing and drinking took place.

Bundles of sticks placed in a sheltered spot in your garden are great for wildlife. Use your garden trimmings to bundle some stems together and leave them in a secluded place. Ladybirds, Lacewings, beetles, toads and small mammals will take shelter.

Apples - There's no shortage of apples in Hatherleigh and they are an all-round winner for wildlife - mammals, birds and insects all benefit from the trees and the fruit.

Medieval people liked to tell a Bible story by putting on a play. Adam and Eve was a popular subject and plays were performed on their name day: December 24th. Fruit trees are all leafless at this time of year so the solution was to cut down an evergreen, bring it indoors on Christmas Eve and hang it with fake fruit. So in

this case the Christmas tree represents the Tree of Knowledge hung with the forbidden fruit.

 Tuckers Plot

 Stollen Swirls Tear and Share

 I was looking through my recipes for Christmas and I found this one that I thought I would share. It's good to make and eat fresh but if you freeze the whole bake wrapped in paper and foil and put in a plastic bag it will keep well for up to a couple of months so, with everything else there is to do at Christmas it's good to have something lush and homemade in reserve and your visitors will never know you made it some days or weeks before!

 You will need:

 A straight-sided roasting tin, greased and lined with paper

 The zest and juice of an orange

 4 tbsp of spirit such as Cointreau, Brandy, Whisky

 170g of dried mixed fruit. Use the basic dried mix or add some chopped apricots, cranberries or anything else you fancy

 Soak the fruit in the juice and alcohol for a good while and leave until your dough is made.

 550g of strong white bread flour

 2 tsp easy bake yeast

 90g caster sugar

 1/2 tsp nutmeg

 1 large egg

 250ml milk (warm it if you are making the dough by hand) pinch of salt

 (If you have a bread maker then chuck all the dough ingredients in a normal dough cycle. If you didn't drop enough hints last year that you'd really like a bread maker then you'll have to make your bread by hand!)

 About 60g of nuts. You can use pistachio, almond, walnut, pecan. Break them up into smallish

About 60g of nuts. You can use pistachio, almond, walnut, pecan. Break them up into smallish pieces

250g-300g block of golden marzipan

However you have made the dough, turn out onto a floured surface when ready and roll out until it is about 70cm x 20 cm. Now think "swiss roll" method. Drain your fruit and spread evenly over the dough, sprinkle your nuts evenly too. Make a long thin sausage of marzipan and place it along the long side nearest you and roll the whole thing up so the marzipan is right in the middle.

Cut your roll into 12 even pieces and line them up in your baking tray cut side down so they are just or nearly touching. Cover in cling film and leave for 40-50 mins in a warm place to rise. ( a good trick is to put your tray on a hot water bottle if you don't have a warm place).

When risen, bake in a pre-heated oven at 180 degrees for about 15-20 minutes dependant on vour oven.

If you are eating that day then brush with a little melted butter, mix some / all of your soaking liquid with some icing sugar so it is just thick enough to drizzle over the top. Save the liquid in the fridge / freezer if you are freezing your bread.
