Hatherleigh pays tribute to Kenneth Westcott

1924- 2021

Kenneth (Ken) Leonard Westcott passed away peacefully at South Molton Community Hospital on 21st December 2021 aged 97. Ken was born in Exeter on the 14th of January 1924 and then later moved to Exmouth in the 1930s. He was 15 years old when war was declared in September 1939 and promptly became one of the first members of Exmouth's newly formed Air Training Corps. On his 18th birthday he applied to join the RAF as a pilot. Following progressive stages of training and examination in this country he travelled to Canada to continue his pilot training. He was one of 50 personnel in his training group and was one of the only 4 to be selected for further training in RAF coastal command as a pilot officer later to become flying Officer. Once he completed his training one of his first commissions was to choose an air crew and fly a liberator from Montréal in Canada to Karachi in India via Ireland, Scotland, Southern Europe, the Middle East and central Asia! He spent the next 18 months in the Far East. Returning to the UK in November 1945 before being demobbed in 1947. Now a civilian, and a keen sportsman (particularly as an excellent rugby kicker and cricketer) he qualified as a PE teacher and took a teaching post at Okehampton grammar school where he met fellow teacher Kay (Kath) Trenaman. They married in April 1952 and set up home in Hatherleigh, Kay's hometown. They continued teaching for a little while longer whilst setting up a nursery business originally at Winsford, Halwill before building their home "Suncrest" in Hatherleigh surrounded by several very large greenhouses where they specialised in growing carnations, roses and orchids. They later welcomed their two children David and Gill, followed by eight grandchildren and four great grandchildren. Once retired Ken and Kay enjoyed travelling to America and Australia visiting family and friends. They remained happily married for 64 years before Kay's passing in 2016. Ken often said he was aiming to get to 100 years old, he didn't quite get there but was close enough. Ken lived a long, full life and will be missed by many.

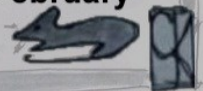

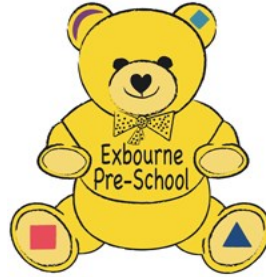

The Night Sky December 2021

Nights in February can be long and cold and so it is a good time for star gazing. New Moon falls on February 1st. It is around the time of the New Moon that fainter celestial objects like galaxies and nebulae can be observed. Full Moon falls on the 16th of February. It is not possible to see fainter objects like galaxies and nebulae at this time due to the Moon's brightness washing out the fainter celestial objects.

Just before the sun rises on the 16th of February you'll be able to spot the planet Mercury. It is the closest planet to the Sun. It orbits the Sun once every 88 days. If your up early you'll be able to spot the planet just above the eastern horizon.

The constellation of the month for February is Taurus, the Bull. It can be seen towards the southern part of the sky. The most well known deep sky object in Taurus is the Pleiades star cluster. In Japanese it is known as Subaru (also the name of a well known car manufacturer!). It can be easily spotted with the naked eye and it is an open star cluster about 444 light years away. A pair of binoculars will reveal many more of its stars. An open cluster is a cluster of stars loosely bound together by gravity.

Species of the Month

February — Frogs and Spawn



Conservation Communities -Torrington to Hatherleigh

Help build up a picture of the wildlife in our area by telling Devon Biodiversity Records Centre (www.dbrc.org.uk) about the species you have seen.

You might think it's still a bit cold for frogs and toads, but frogspawn starts appearing in February. In fact, where it's been mild here in the South West, you may have even spotted some in January! Frogs and toads can be hard to spot as adults, so getting records of spawn is a great way of knowing where they are.

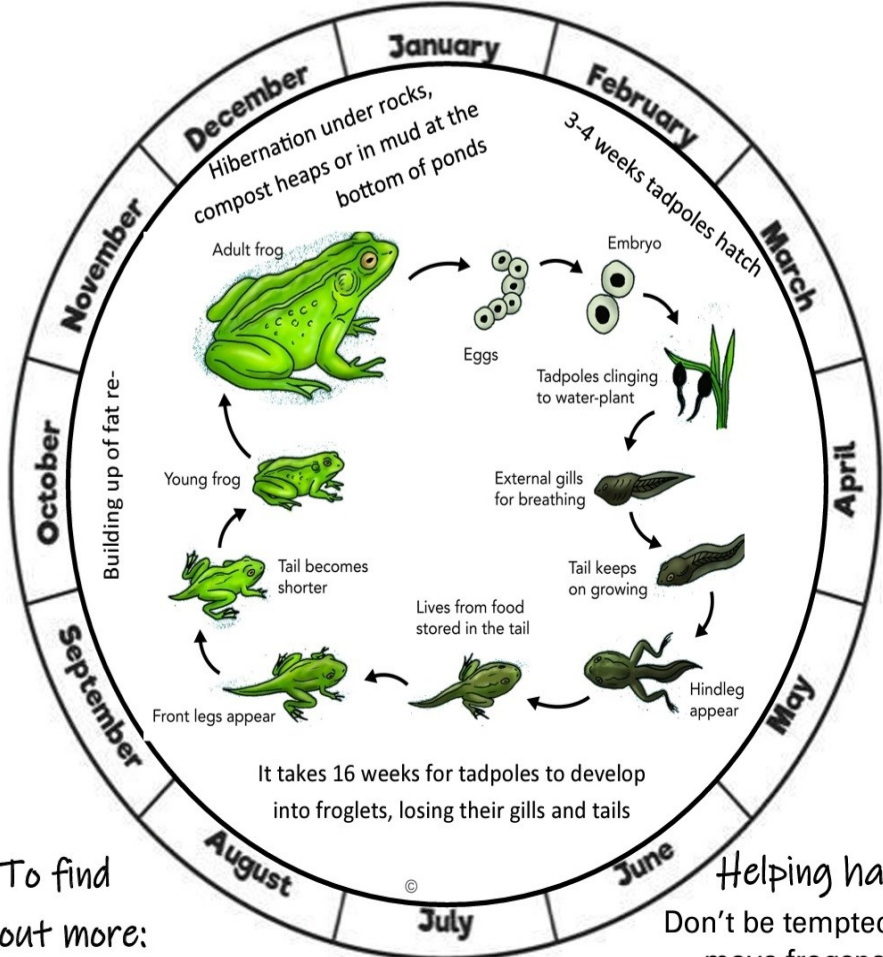

Did you know?

- It takes 3 years for frogs to reach full size
- One clump of frogspawn can contain up to 2000 eggs
- It's estimated that only one in 50 eggs will mature into an adult

Why DBRC need to know about amphibians in this area:

The common frog is not necessarily common - in many areas they have disappeared due to agricultural pesticides, draining of wet-land habitats and filling-in of small ponds. DBRC has very few records of amphibians in this area but we suspect there are a good number—help us to put these records right.

National Nest Box Week 2022

Valentine's day traditionally sees the start of this event. It was started by the British Trust for Ornithology to encourage people to put up nest boxes to help breeding birds. February is a great time to add a little wildlife home to your garden. Nest boxes come in all shapes and sizes, you can even make your own with some creative upcycling. They can be placed on the side of a shed or fence or hidden in a tree or shrubs.

Around our Parish we have a variety of wildlife nest boxes for bats, small mammals and birds. Not only do these help a variety of animals they also help us to survey and study which species live and breed here. Local volunteers monitor a series of nest boxes placed around Hatherleigh Moor and this year showed that we have a very healthy population of blue tits using the nest boxes in the wooded areas.



Who lives in a house like this?

House swap!

Wildlife is often full of surprises, alongside the expected residence of these bird boxes, there can sometimes be animals residing in them that they were not intended for. This year our recorders found shrews in the dormice boxes, evidence of owls (both tawny and barn) in the kestrel box, a stock dove in the owl box and a bat in a small bird nest box!

So, if you put up a small box, a large box, a purpose built box or a creative box you've made at home, you can pretty much guarantee some type of wildlife will enjoy the little home you have provided for them.

Tuckers Plot

We love a good curry at our house and although my husband can cook what he calls "bog standard" things like shepherds pie he hadn't explored cooking a curry because he thought it was all too complicated. In the summer I was very ill and couldn't do anything much. After he ate all the meals I had previously put in the freezer he just started eating rubbish so his new year resolution was to learn how to cook a proper curry. His first attempt was Butter Chicken and, I must say, for someone who doesn't know his way round herbs and spices, it was bloomin' delicious. Here's the recipe as I wrote it out for him (In stages with the ingredients in bold) If you love curry but have never cooked one then why not give it a go! You can prepare all the ingredients the day before or in the morning so you are ready to go later.

Prepare chicken - 2 large packs of boneless, skinless chicken thighs. Cut them in half and toss in 2 heaped pudding spoons of Tandoori Masala Powder. Cover and leave in fridge all day or over night.

Measure spices into a little bowl - 4 pudding spoons of Garam Masala, 2 pudding spoons of Cumin Powder, 3 teaspoons of Coriander Powder, 1 teaspoon of Turmeric Powder. 2 pudding spoons of Fenugreek leaves

Chop and grate - Finely chop 4 onions and grate 12 cloves of garlic and 2 fat thumbs of peeled ginger

Other ingredients

- 1 large tub of plain yoghurt (not Greek, it's too thick)
- 2 jars / tins of tomato sauce or pulp
- 2 pudding spoons of chilli sauce (whatever heat you like)
- 1 teaspoon of salt
- 1 pudding spoon of sugar
- 1/2 a block of butter



5 simple steps to cook the curry

1. In a large wide pan like a wok gently fry the onion, ginger and garlic in a little vegetable oil until they are golden. Remove to a plate.
2. In the same pan fry off the chicken pieces in 2-3 batches on a high heat. You want them to be gently browned. Remove chicken to plate. If you have got burnt bits of chicken stuck to the bottom of your pan pour in a little boiling water while the pan is still on the heat; you will easily be able to get the bits off the bottom and be able to tip them away before carrying on.
3. Put onions etc back in pan with all your other ingredients apart from the chicken and the butter. Bring to boil, turn right down, put lid on and simmer 20 mins.
4. Add chicken and mix in. Simmer on a low heat for 30 mins.
5. Lastly, add the butter chopped up into pieces and let it just heat through. Serve with rice or a naan bread

Top Tip: You can get all your herbs and spices from Beanfeast Wholefoods in Okey; they have a big range and are far cheaper than the silly little pots you get in the supermarket

Notes from the Council Meetings held on Tuesday 9th November 2021. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 7th December 2021 at 7pm in the Community

Your 8 Councillors are Clare Tyson (Chair/Mayor), Rachel Laycock (deputy), Deb Laing-Trengove, Kay Walters, Donna Lewis, Paul Bolland, Callum Entwistle, Ellie Holland, Mark Reddaway and Helen Orbidans.

At the start of the meeting Mark Reddaway and Helen Orbidans signed Declarations and were Co-opted as Councillors.

Sites for the new Town signage are still being sought from private land owners as we are not permitted to site them on Highways land. This will be discussed again at further meetings. It was reported that some of the Gateway Town signs may need replacing. This will be reported to Highways for their consideration.

A further Dog Poo bin has been requested on Lower Moor. WDRC have no capacity for emptying further Dog Poo bins at present. This request will be put forward again in a years time when the situation may have eased.

The Christmas Eve Carols Event in the square was very well attended. So much so that we ran out of Carol sheets. We printed 50 but plan to print 100 next year. We would like to thank all those involved and those who attended for making it such a successful evening. Thanks go to the Reverend Leigh Winsbury (and Alien helper!), the Silver Band, the Co op for the Donation of the mince pies and Richard Tidball for his special mulled cider recipe. Thank you to Andrew Orchard for the donation of the tree and to the Christmas Lights team for all their efforts. Some of the Christmas lights are only partly working so may need replacement next year.

The War Horse sign has been returned to the square after Carnival.

Queens Jubilee - The Carnival Committee are planning an event and HTC will discuss with them to offer our support. Plans will be discussed fully at the next meeting.

Hatherleigh Market – the market has moved from the building site and is now operating from the Community Centre due to safety concerns of the marquee and the rough ground until the new market area is completed. This decision was taken by the Market Manager.

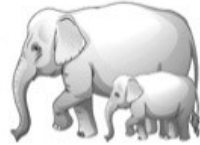

He will be talking about the Belgian Refugees of Devon and Cornwall during WW1. The meeting will be held in Old Schools on the 14th February and will start at 7.30pm, visitors and guests are welcome, £3 Includes tea/coffee and biscuits.

By the time this is published or goes online, we will have started posting photographs and items of interest to the Hatherleigh History Society Facebook page again after taking a couple of months off. We haven't been idle, there have been many enquiries regarding people who were born or lived here or burials over the centuries. It looks like there has been another surge of interest in building family trees, we try and help where possible but not all records are available to us.

The New Year sees the 1921 Census being made available but this is only on `Find My Past` at the moment, and for access I believe there is a charge. Other sites as yet have not posted details of when they will also have access, it will include libraries. This is quite an important census as it will give us an idea of how people were beginning to pick up the pieces after WW1 and the Spanish Flu epidemic that ripped through the country. The 1931 census was destroyed in the bombings of WW2 and with the knowledge that war was inevitable and men could be deployed anywhere in the world, the next census was taken in 1939 instead of 1941.

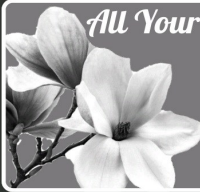

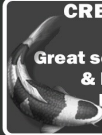
