The trouble is our minds really do get 'set' in a particular way [I could bore you with science here but I'll spare you that] so once we train ourselves to be moaners it's really hard to change, but what a tragic loss of joy!

Somebody once wrote; 'the past is history, the future is a mystery but the present is a gift' [or something like that]. We can't change the past although there are things we can do to heal it. Neither do we have any idea what's coming up next [although we can and should prepare for possibilities]. How differently would we live if we could see just an hour into the future? But we do have 'now', and the capacity to make it the best 'now' it could be, by celebrating the good and the gifts that are in it.

So until the spring comes, enjoy whatever the weather! (It might have arrived by the time you are reading this.)

National Nest Box Week 2022

Valentine's day traditionally sees the start of this event. It was started by the British Trust for Ornithology to encourage people to put up nest boxes to help breeding birds. February is a great time to add a little wildlife home to your garden. Nest boxes come in all shapes and sizes, you can even make your own with some creative upcycling. They can be placed on the side of a shed or fence or hidden in a tree or shrubs.

Around our Parish we have a variety of wildlife nest boxes for bats, small mammals and birds. Not only do these help a variety of animals they also help us to survey and study which species live and breed here. Local volunteers monitor a series of nest boxes placed around Hatherleigh Moor and this year showed that we have a very healthy population of blue tits using the nest boxes in the wooded areas.

Wildlife is often full of surprises, alongside the expected residence of these bird boxes, there can sometimes be animals residing in them that they were not intended for. This year our recorders found shrews in the dormice boxes, evidence of owls (both tawny and barn) in the kestrel box, a stock dove in the owl box and a bat in a small bird nest box!

So, if you put up a small box, a large box, a purpose built box or a creative box you've made at home, you can pretty much guarantee some type of wildlife will enjoy the little home you have provided for them.

The Night Sky March 2022

The March Equinox, which marks the first day of Spring in the Northern Hemisphere will occur on the 20th of the month. On this day there will be nearly equal amounts of day and night across the globe. New Moon falls on March the 2nd. It is at this time that fainter celestial objects like galaxies and nebulae are best observed. The light of the Moon would otherwise wash out these fainter

deep sky objects. Full Moon falls on March 18th.

During the spring our view of the night sky turns outwards, beyond the Milky Way. However all the stars that we see with the naked eye on a clear dark night are located within our own galaxy. It is, at this time of year possible, to spot a number of galaxies with just a pair of binoculars. One of the most well known of these galaxies is M51 also called the Whirlpool Galaxy. It can be found in the constellation of Ursa Major, The Great Bear. It is not far from an asterism (a pattern of stars that is not a constellation) called the Plough. The galaxy will look like a tiny smudge of light.

M51 is 23 million light years from Earth. The light that left this galaxy started its journey around 23 million years ago. This means that your seeing the galaxy as it was 23 million years ago. The further out into space we look the further back in time we are looking. This is known as look back time.

A star map or planisphere can help with locating M51. Ursa Major is quite high in the northern part of the sky at this time of year. The most important thing when it comes to observing galaxies is clear, dark skies free of light pollution. **By Kiran Chakravarti**

Hatherleigh Market Update

As the market development is progressing and with the Tuesday market temporarily operating at Hatherleigh Community Centre this brief update is to explain the situation particularly for people who do not have internet access.

It is understood that most of the houses built and yet to be built by <u>Kingswood</u>. <u>Homes **(KH)**</u> have now been purchased. There is currently a planning application that is 'live' where KH are seeking an amendment to the shop unit flats – to increase the number of flats by 3, and reconfigure the parking spaces behind these shops.

KW are soon to start building the new market area and they have stated they hope this area to be finished by summer.

The area includes a pannier building split into two (market/community space and auction room), open plaza space for outside stalls, and a rear 115 spaces carpark.

At present the majority of the building is open on 3 sides and <u>Hatherleigh Town</u>. <u>Council (HTC)</u> has been seeking ways to source grant funding for additional walls/doors. This has so far proved unsuccessful.

Following demolition of the sheep shed the Tuesday market was operating on the site with a temporary marquee, however with Storm Arwen causing it significant damage and the unsuitable surface underfoot, the market operator took the decision to use the Community Centre in the interim. This will also benefit KH as they will have more space to shift plant around the site and speed things up.

The ownership of the area will continue to be under KH for the foreseeable future. HTC requested investigative talks towards a long term lease but KH wish to continue leasing the market operations to the current market operator when the new site is available for use.

HTC will continue in a supportive role and will continue to monitor the situation. We are currently waiting on news on another grant for ancillary items in preparation to support our much valued and much needed local market's re-opening.

HTC will continue to subsidise the town carpark for visitors to Hatherleigh on market day. Please use and encourage others to use this car park as parking at the Community Centre is very limited..... and pavements are for people!

Species of the Month March — Brown Hare



Conservation Communities - Torrington to Hatherleigh. Help build up a picture of the wildlife in our area by telling Devon Biodiversity Records Centre (<u>www.dbrc.org.uk</u>) about the species you have seen.

First introduced to Britain in Roman times, the brown hare is considered naturalised. It is a different species to the indigenous mountain hare, which isn't found in Devon.

They live in grassland and woodland edges, eating vegetation, the bark of young trees and arable crops.

Seen at dawn or dusk, out in the open fields. Hares are most easily spotted in spring when it's the breeding season and males seek out females. During this time they can be seen "boxing". If a male is chasing a female too much, in his attempt to mate, she might turn around and try to fend him off.

Why DBRC are asking for reports of hare sightings:

DBRC has very few records of hares in the Conservation Communities area, especially over the last 10 years—is this because they are no longer here?

It is thought that nationally their numbers are declining. We know that hares are quite rare in Devon as it is a county that favours pasture over arable crops.

Hares have little legal protection and are classed as game animals. They are listed as a species of principal conservation importance, under the Natural Environment and Rural Communities (NERC) Act (2006).













Hares and Rabbits

- Golden brow fur
- Average 50cm in length and 4kg
- Long ears with black
 tips
- Runs at high speed, when frightened they lower their tails
- Solitary or live in small groups
- Lives out in the open, hiding in vegetation or shallow depressions (forms)
- Babies (leverets) are born above ground, fully furred, eyes open, ready to run!

- Grey fur
- Average 40cm in length and 2.5kg
- Ears proportionally shorter than hares
- When frightened, they expose a white underside of their tail
- Live in large social groups
- Live in warrens, a network of tunnels or burrows they dig into the soil
- Young (kittens) are born underground, blind and naked

Did you know?

- Hares can reach speeds of 45mph
- The female leaves the leverets all day, only returning at sunset to feed them. This reduces the risk of predation, particularly by foxes.





<u>Tuckers Plot</u>

It's definitely "stewy weather" so why not try this special stew for a Sunday dinner that you can mostly prepare the day before and then bring it all together on a Sunday for a relatively pain free Sunday feast!

Ingredients:

1 bottle of red wine

- 2 tbsp cooking brandy
- 1 small onion chopped
- 1 medium carrot chopped
- 2 celery sticks chopped
- 1 heaped tsp on mixed herbs
- 2 bay leaves


2 cloves

2 allspice berries

6 large cloves of garlic bruised but left whole

Salt and Black Pepper

15 or so shallots peeled (leave whole)



1kg of chicken thighs / legs bone in but skin off

150g of smoked bacon lardons

Lots of chopped parsley

A little plain flour

A little olive oil

Make your marinade the day before from the first 10 ingredients. Put all those ingredients in a pan, bring to the boil and reduce by 1/3. Leave to simmer with lid on for 15 mins after reduction and then cool. Drain through a sieve into a large plastic or glass bowl to remove all the "bits" Put all your chicken into the marinade, cover and leave in the fridge overnight.

Peel your shallots, wipe your mushrooms and then fry them off (in the pan you already used) with the bacon so they all get some colour and that pan can go in the fridge ready for the next day.

On Sunday drain your chicken over yesterday's pan for a while so all the liquid drains off into the shallots etc. and then start gently heating that sauce. Dredge the dried chicken with flour and fry in a non-stick frying pan to get some good colour on it. Pop the chicken in the saucepan with the sauce, pop the lid on and put in oven 180 degrees for about 60 mins. (stir half way) Salt and Black pepper to taste. Serve with lovely new potatoes or mash and loads of fresh parsley over the top.

Notes from the Council Meetings held on Tuesday 8th February 2022. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 8th March 2022 in the Community Centre. For

more information see our website www.hatherleightowncouncil.org/ Your 10 Councillors are Clare Tyson (Chair/ Mayor), Rachel Laycock (deputy), Deb Laing-Trengove, Kay Walters, Donna Lewis, Paul Bolland, Callum Entwistle, Ellie Holland, Mark Reddaway and Helen Orbidans.

It was decided that no increase would be requested for this years Council Tax Precept. Cllrs signed fresh copies of Register of interests and agreed to continue using the WDBC Code of Conduct.

The Royal British Legion group are awaiting further funds before their new bench can be situated outside school. In the meantime we will repair the old bench which could then be moved to another site once the RBL bench is in situ.

Moor View: Concerns have been raised again about parking issues at Moor View. We are now looking into options raised by residents -Devon County Council's Resident Parking Schemes: and West Devon Borough Council's grass areas being changed into car park spaces. Devon CC have stated a scheme would need majority support from residents and councillors. Please read information about the scheme on the Moor View noticeboard. Or search www.devon.gov.uk/ roadsandtransport/factsheet/residentsparking-permits/ Initial conversations show there is little support for a such a Scheme so if you are in support of this please let us know after reading the information.

Town Parking: West Devon Borough Council will shortly be repainting the Yellow lines on their section of road next to the Co op, they will then increase enforcement patrols to try to stop the illegal and hazardous parking there. Elsewhere in Town bad parking continues to be reported. Particularly parking on junctions, dropped kerbs and at pinch points. If you see hazards or blocked pavements please continue to take photographs and report to the Police or DCC at

www.devon.gov.uk/roadsandtransport/ report-a-problem/.

Hatherleigh Market: We have compiled a brief update and copy of the plans as the situation currently stands. Viewable in this Pump, on our noticeboard and Moor View noticeboard. Negotiations are still continuing on the design of the new building, hopefully we can provide a fuller update next month. Our bid to the WDBC Community Recovery Grant was unsuccessful. This was to support the market and new community building with ancillary items when the re-development is complete.

Island Park's Play Area fundraising campaign has begun in earnest with a donation received from Okehampton Rotary Club for £500. A National Lottery grant has also been submitted.

Other items: Clumps of grass covering pavements at Moor View has been reported to WDBC for clearance. And the condition of the phone boxes in town will be reported to BT.

The Town Council would like to give all Primary school children a Jubilee commemorative gift. Discussion was held over what this should be. Ideas will be sought and discussed again next meeting.



It was great to be able to once again hold a meeting in Old Schools in February and to invite a guest speaker along too. Ciaran Stoker spoke to us about the Belgian refugees of WW1 who had fled their country ahead of the German invasion, many of which found themselves distributed from London to towns and villages in Devon and Cornwall. Earl Hugh Fortescue 4th a former Captain and later Colonel of the North Devon Hussars Yeoman Cavalry, was in charge of finding placements and work for these people, many of whom were in family groups. Some 250,000 refugees escaped to England and money was raised for the Belgian Relief Fund as well as receiving Government money. After a clash of personalities between Earl Fortescue and the then Mayor of Exeter Councillor J Owen, the Earl was given sole charge of the Belgian refugees sent to Exeter and then relocated to Devon and Cornwall. Miss Clara Andrews from Sidwell Street in Exeter was secretary to the Relief League in the early stages but then went on to greater service in London and was later decorated by Belgium for her services to their refugees. Many of the Belgian people who were placed here married into local families, some returned to their homes at the end of the war, but it must have been a very different country from the one they had left.






