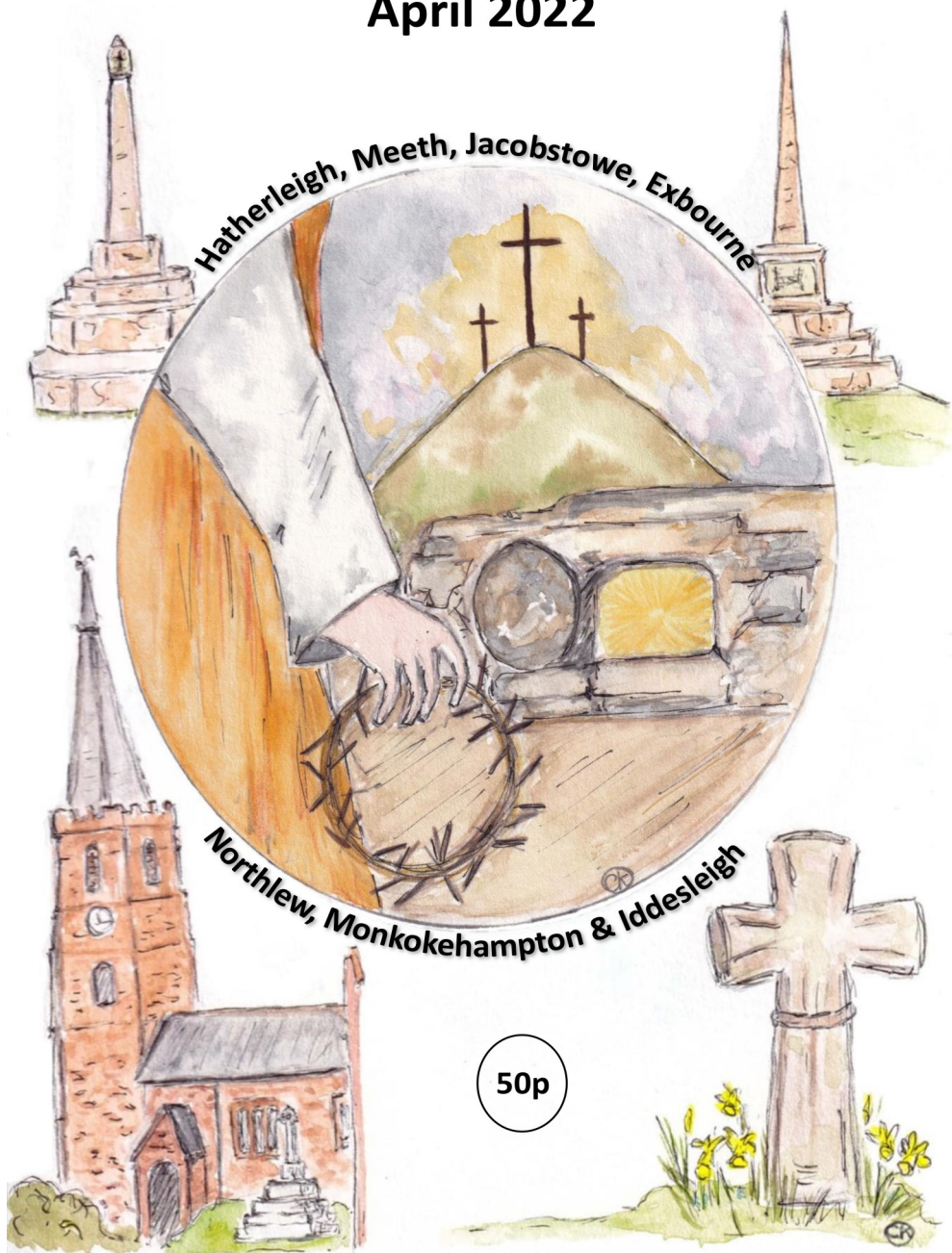

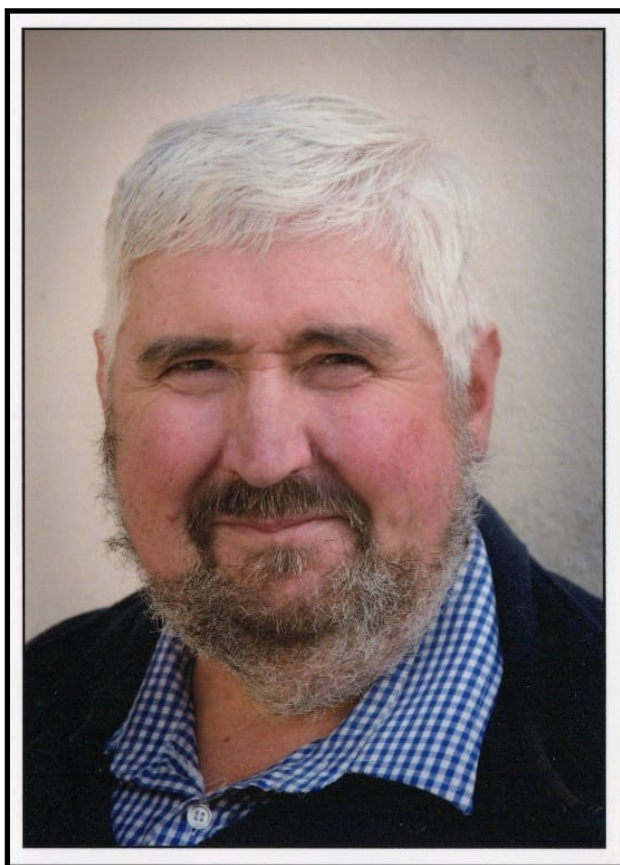
Sid loved gardening and was very proud of all the things he grew, but his greatest love was for his grandchildren.

Hello!



Since I wrote to you last month we have again witnessed in our continent the horrors' of war in Ukraine. In the face of such atrocity it is tempting to throw up our hands and give up; what can we do against such a situation? For myself, in this and every situation, I try to imagine a line drawn between what I can do and what I can't. What I can do, I give myself to achieving with all I've got. What I can't fix, I leave with God to deal with. I can't stop the war in Ukraine; I probably can't even understand all the reasons these things are happening. But where there are routes for me to bring some help [however small] to some people who are suffering, there I'll do what I can.

Responses so far across this nation including here have been amazing. Calling it a coffee afternoon somewhat diminishes what the event in Hatherleigh Square became a few weeks back. And people came out in droves to support the event raising over £3000 in an afternoon planned only in the week before. We are now [as I write] beginning our project to collect offers of aid materials from a specific 'needs list' to be regularly updated working via a contact in Ukraine connected to the church in Winkleigh. Please watch out for fb posts on 'Hatherleigh Building Community' and posters in the church porch and Old Schools notice boards.

There have also been a number of families thinking of offering space at home to refugees. At present, the numbers of people offering outweighs the likely demand so it's doubtful whether we will be called upon in this way, but it would be good to be ready if we are. Having lived in an international community, we recognise this will pose some big challenges, so if you're thinking of responding in this way, can I invite you to get in touch so we can gather to talk seriously about supporting each other please?

We can't fix the big problems on our own, but we can fix the little ones. War is a product of the brokenness in the human heart, and the potential for hatred and damage is in us all. Let's make the daily choice to reject the temptation of divisions in all their forms, and heal the rents in our own families and communities.

The Night Sky April 2022

There is a lot going on in the April night sky. New Moon falls on April 1st. This is the best time of the month to observe fainter deep sky objects such as galaxies and nebulae. April 16th is the night of the Full Moon. The Moon takes quite a high trajectory through the sky at this time of year and so is very well placed for observation with binoculars and a telescope. The night of April 22nd going into the

early morning of the 23rd is the time of the Lyrid Meteor shower. All the meteors from this shower appear to originate from a point in the sky located in the constellation of Lyra, the Harp. The optimal time to observe the meteors is between 11pm and 4am. It is at this time that the night side of the Earth will turn into the oncoming meteor stream. You'll be able to see around 20 meteors per hour at its peak. The trails of light are usually produced by particles no larger than a grain of sand and so burn up in the atmosphere. This burning up of the meteor results in what we then see as a "shooting star". Meteors can be seen in any part of the sky, you just need a location free of light pollution.

The innermost planet, Mercury is well placed for observation this month. In fact on April 29th Mercury will reach its highest point above the horizon and can be found low in the western part of the sky a little after sunset. There is also another new moon on April 30th.

Residents' parking permits

There have been comments raised by some residents that Resident Parking Permits may be a solution to the parking problems experienced in the Moor View area of town.

A parking scheme is managed by Devon County Council who will only consider introducing a new scheme to an area if it has majority support from its residents and its local council.

Here are some key points below to understand about such a scheme.

This is for information purposes only!

Hatherleigh Town Council will only investigate this further IF we receive lots of support in favour of such a scheme.

Taken from Devon County Council website:

Residents' parking schemes don't guarantee a parking space but help manage parking spaces for residents.

A permit does not guarantee a parking space outside the property.

The vehicle is only permitted to park on a road in the area or zone indicated on the permit.

Do not assume that because a road sign nearby show 'resident only permit holders' that every postal address is eligible for a permit, AND that every car owning person living at a postal address will be able to have a permit.

Costs

A resident's permit costs £30 a year.

Visitor permits cost £30 for a book of 30.

Properties are usually allowed two of each per year.

Once you have purchased a permit it is non-refundable, unless it is completely unused.

Resident permits may only be used by the named person it is issued to, who can provide upon demand evidence of ownership or tenancy of the address, along with evidence of car ownership or permitted use of the registration number stated on the permit.

Parking permits must be displayed in the windscreen of the vehicle so that printed details can be clearly seen and read by a civil enforcement officer or police officer when parked. Failure to clearly display a valid permit will result in a Penalty Charge Notice being served.

Your 10 Councillors are Clare Tyson (Chair/Mayor), Rachel Laycock (deputy), Deb Laing-Trengove, Kay Walters, Donna Lewis, Paul Bolland, Callum Entwistle, Ellie Holland, Mark Reddaway and Helen Orbidans.

The Business Group - The new Hatherleigh Gateway signs were agreed and the quote accepted. The new signs will be dark green with a rounded top. Kingswood homes have kindly agreed to allow one to be placed on their land near the entrance to the new development.

Work has started on the new Visit Hatherleigh Town website.

There are several jobs still outstanding around Town. These include Millennium corner, the bench outside the school entrance and the toilet door. With the better weather it is hoped to have these completed soon. The state of the BT phone boxes were reported to BT who will clean and inspect them.

As previously stated - concerns had been reported to Councillors by Moorview residents regarding parking issues there. The issue of a Resident Parking Scheme was raised by residents. HTC are happy to explore this but it would require support from a majority of the residents. Please look elsewhere in this pump for details of the scheme and put your views forward if in support.

WDBC have been asked if some of the grass verge areas could be used as extra parking spaces. We are awaiting a response.

Re-lining work in the car park and on the road has been stalled by the bad weather.

Councillors have signed the Declaration of Interests forms and these have been forwarded to WDBC. They can be viewed on WDBC website or by application to HTC Clerk Mrs R Lock.

The Mayor and Councillor Lewis attended the Okehampton Civic Dinner. Councillors wondered if Hatherleigh should host a Civic Dinner. This would raise money for Charity and raise Hatherleigh's

profile amongst other Councils. This was suggested as a future Agenda item.

The Mayoral Chain is missing 2 past and present Mayors names and terms of office. It was agreed to add 4 new shields to rectify this and leave room for future names to be added.

Hatherleigh Market - Kingswood homes have applied for a planning amendment to the Market Building to enclose the sides with glass windows and doors and to provide an internal toilet and office. This can be viewed on WDBC website Planning section under 'Hatherleigh Market'. HTC are seeking a meeting with the Market Management team on how to offer further support.

Island Park – We are very pleased to announce fundraising efforts received £500 from Okehampton Round Table and £10,000 from the National Lottery. HTC have also committed funds to this project. A special meeting will be called to discuss which items to purchase first.

Hatherleigh Pottery kindly sent samples of items for consideration as Commemorative Jubilee Gifts for Hatherleigh children. A sample was chosen and it was agreed to ask Jane if she could produce 200 items for this purpose.

Time Capsule - Hatherleigh Primary School pupils are producing individual booklets and items for inclusion. The 'When Hatherleigh Stood Still' book will also be included. It is planned to bury the box during the Jubilee Week Celebrations with The History Society and Local Press in attendance.

Cllr. Lewis was put forward for the WDBC annual Mayoral Awards for her book "When Hatherleigh Stood Still".

Species of the Month

April — Hedgehogs



Conservation Communities - Torrington to Hatherleigh

Hedgehogs are one of our most distinctive mammals. They are generally nocturnal, spending the daytime resting somewhere safe.

Hedgehogs can live for up to 7 years and can be found in a variety of habitats, including suburban gardens, woodland, farmland and parks.

They are known for eating slugs and snails but this only makes up 5% of their diet. They prefer to eat; beetles, earwigs, earthworms and caterpillars.

Did you know?

- The 5,000 spines that cover the hedgehogs back are 2-3 cm long and made of keratin, the same stuff as our hair.
- Hedgehogs have relatively poor eye-sight and rely on their sense of smell and hearing to get around and find food.

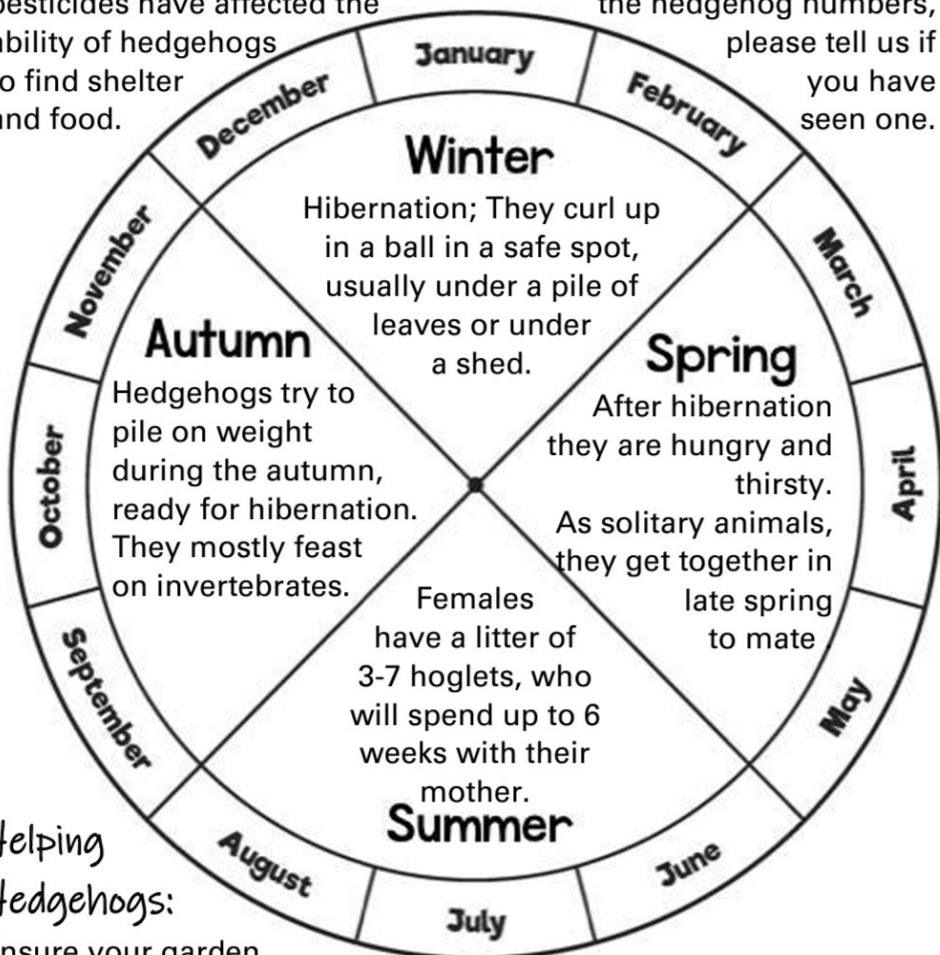

Why DBRC need to know about hedgehogs in this area:

Over the last 20 years, hedgehogs have suffered a serious decline, with up to a 50% loss in rural areas. Habitat loss and use of pesticides have affected the ability of hedgehogs to find shelter and food.

The majority of DBRCs hedgehog records are from the 1980s, we would like to get an up to date picture of the hedgehog numbers, please tell us if you have seen one.



Helping Hedgehogs:

Soil your Pants

We often hear concerns about fossil fuels and water quality but we also need to consider the importance of soil. Soil is home to a quarter of the Earth's species and provides nutrients that sustain plants for food and energy. While 95% of food production relies on the soil, it is in fact the microbes within the soil that feeds the plants.

It is important that we feed and nurture these microbes and not just the plants. The microbes are most abundant in topsoil, where their food sources are most plentiful. Topsoil is degrading due to poor land management, erosion or being washed away far faster than natural processes can replace it. Without quality microbes and topsoil, crop yields are reduced and nutritional value falls.



You don't need fancy gadgetry to test if your soil is alive with healthy microbes; just bury a pair of cotton undies 6 to 8 inches deep, dig them up in 5 weeks and if the soil is alive the undies should fall apart! Photo credit: Anthony Bly and igrow.org

What other benefits gained from improving soil quality?

Soil is one of our most important weapons in the fight against climate change! It can store more carbon than the atmosphere, and all of the world's plants and forests combined. Did you know that the UK's soil alone holds nearly 10 billion tonnes of carbon?! That's equivalent to the total global emissions created by the human population in one year.

Soil contains the bacteria 'Mycobacterium accae' that is absorbed through the skin of the fingers and palms when gardening, triggering a release of serotonin in the brain; the 'happy hormone', which is a natural antidepressant and mood lifter; it also strengthens the immune system and provides a general sense of wellbeing. Science now recognises that our health is affected by the activity of the microbes in our guts and in turn our gut microbes are positively affected by the microbes we ingest from the soil. 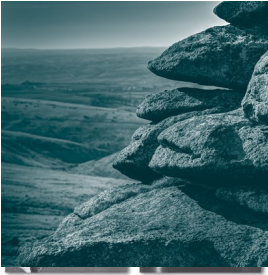

Tuckers Plot

It seems so many local people have been touched by the terrible injustice that has been inflicted on the Ukrainian people and they wish to open their homes to Ukrainian families. Ukrainian food is not something many of us have experience of. You might think it's all beetroot soup, dill pickles and stuffed cabbage!..... so as a tasty intro why not try these sweet cheese turnovers. What do they taste like?...Think cheesecake turnover and you will just about be there!

For The Dough

2 medium eggs beaten
150g caster sugar
200g sour cream
150g soft butter
2 tsp baking powder
360g plain flour
1/4 tsp salt



For The Filling

2 x 600g pots of plain full fat cottage cheese
1 tsp of vanilla essence
1 largish egg beaten
3 tbsp sour cream
1 tbsp fine semolina
1 tbsp plain flour

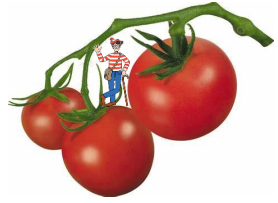
You will also need a beaten egg to glaze and optional icing sugar to dust when cool.

For the dough, combine the butter and sugar as if you are making a sponge. Add in the beaten egg, sour cream, salt and baking powder and beat well then add the flour and combine. You want to achieve a dough mix that you will be able to roll out on a floured surface. Cover the dough and leave in the fridge for an hour or so.

For the filling you need to make sure that ALL the water is drained out of the cottage cheese and then squish out the remaining moisture using a very fine sieve or a muslin. We don't really have the "Farmer's Cheese" the Ukrainians would use so this is the next best thing but you must drain and squish or you will end up with a soggy, lumpy mess!

Combine all the wet in ingredients and beat well then add the flour and semolina and mix into a smooth paste. The paste must hold on a spoon if you turn it upside down so if it's too wet then add a little more flour and semolina. Roll out your dough to about 1/4" thick and use your largest or second largest round pastry cutter to cut out circles. You can make them a size to suit you. Put a dollop of the filling to one side of the circle and just gently fold the other side over. Don't squish it, don't seal the edge. You should be able to see the filling and it just be covered by the pastry. Put your Sochniki on a greased baking tray (leave a little room between each), glaze with a beaten egg and put in the middle of a pre-heated oven 180 degrees, for 20 - 25 minutes. You want them cooked through and golden so you may need a little longer for larger ones depending on your oven. When cooled a little, dust with icing sugar. As an extra bit of lusciousness you can serve with a dollop of black cherry jam.

Dig For Victory!

There are very few people around now who remember the "Dig For Victory" slogan from World War 2. Every householder was encouraged to turn any bit of land or garden into an allotment to produce whatever they could because, with blockades and shortages, there was a very real possibility that British people could become malnourished.

My grandfather served during World War 1 but in World War 2 he started the habit of "grow your own" and my gran "made her own" from whatever he brought in from the garden and those habits stayed with them all their lives and got passed on to my mum and then to me.

Sometimes over the last couple of years with lockdowns, closed borders and shortages and now with soaring prices it can feel like the family budget is under siege and perhaps, if you have never grown anything before, it might be a good time to give it a go in whatever scrap of soil or recycled container you can find with a bit of "any old" soil from the garden.

Do you realise if, in your normal shop you are getting a pack of red, yellow and green peppers, a couple of salad items, a bulb of garlic, a small pack of chillis and a couple of bags of herbs then that is costing you at the very least £500 per year!

Do you also realise that fresh chillis, red and yellow peppers, tomatoes produce hundreds of seeds and you can pop them straight in to a pot of soil NOW, give them a little water, cover the pot with a tied up clear plastic bag, put it somewhere warm and wait for germination! You do not need to buy "special seeds" and the great thing is you would be buying these things to eat anyway!... if you've got a couple of scabby bits of garlic that have started sprouting..... shove the individual cloves in a pot and they will grow..... if you've got some potatoes in the cupboard that have started sprouting and are well past their best then you can give them a go too! There's plenty of advice online..... what's the worst that can happen?.... you might get some free food that's still got all it's nutrients plus a hobby for life.
