The Nobel art of Town Crying goes back to Greek and Roman times, sometimes we where called Heralds, as Town Crying has evolved each Town had a Town Crier who held a very important position, as they were the ones who could read and write and knew who was in town and if and trouble was caused they had the power to expel them from the town! They also went round at night to check all the fires were out and metal covers on. This was known as Coure Fai in Nortman French. Don't forget everything was wood and thatch then. As Town Crying has evolved the Crier went in front of the Fire Brigade and Police, they got the name as peelers. Today they lead processions and announcements for Birthdays, Weddings, Funerals, in fact everything as long as its not political, racist or rude.

Town Crying is on the up with 160 members of the Quild. Hopefully this gives you a small insight into Town Crying. This is the first profession to have men and woman as equals.

I have won and been placed at all the competitions mentioned and I won in Australia being the loudest female Town Crier at 98.3 decibels, so I think that makes me a <u>World Champion</u>. Anyway enough of all this waffle.

The Night Sky June 2022

Nights in June are short and we are fast heading towards the Summer Solstice. This year it falls on the 21st of June. The Summer Solstice marks the first day of Summer in the Northern Hemisphere. The Sun will have attained its most northerly position in the sky. It will be right over the Tropic of Cancer. June 14th will see a super moon. It's the first of 3 super moons that we'll get to see in 2022. It will look slightly larger and brighter in the night sky compared to how it normally does. June 29th is the date of the New Moon. It is at this time that fainter celestial objects such as galaxies and nebulae are best observed.

On June 16th Mercury will reach its Greatest Western Elongation. Mercury will be best placed for observation in the eastern sky before sunrise. Mercury is the closest planet to the Sun and orbits it once every 88 days!

David Jones, Artist. June 3rd 1936 to 25th April 2021

This photograph was taken at Bude in 2007 after a time of convalescence due to a quadruple heart bypass. As a family living in Hatherleigh, we had visited Bude often and Dad was happy and relaxed there.

Dad made art from the age of eight. He didn't have any formal training but was



taught by a 'fine lady' neighbour when he was evacuated to a farm at Instow. He learnt to draw well and his love of Devon came from that time. Dad read widely about many artists and visited galleries while living and working in London and abroad. He had a varied career as a journalist and businessman in London and Devon. Influenced by greats such as Rembrandt, Goya and Breughel he made art all his life. He recorded his home life and the scenery and architecture of Devon.

His large commissioned painting is still on show at the Lighter Inn, Topsham and there are further works around including some in the White Hart in Okehampton.

Dad moved to Iddesleigh in the late eighties and created a barn conversion that was his dream place to live; "In homage to the past." His contribution to War Horse in the area was a colourful card, which is on sale at the Duke Of York and the War Horse Country Park in Iddesleigh.

I am Dad's eldest daughter and have been putting his artwork in order. We value the original drawings and paintings he made during his eighty- four years. There are some pieces, which we cannot keep and would like to go into homes of those who would appreciate them. They have been left at the Salar Gallery in Hatherleigh for sale and the proceeds will go to Hatherleigh Primary School, where my brother and sister were educated. In that way Dad's memory will live on. He believed in education which is how I was encouraged to become a teacher. We are hoping the works will be bought by April 2023.



Species of the Month



June - Swifts, Swallows & Martins

Conservation Communities - Torrington to Hatherleigh Help build up a picture of the wildlife in our area by telling Devon Biodiversity Records Centre (www.dbrc.org.uk)

Swifts, swallows, house martins and sand martins are all fast-flying summer visitors to the UK. It's easy to tell the difference once you know how:

Swifts

- Dark brown all over
- Larger than swallows & martins
- · Long, curving wings

Swallows

- Glossy, dark blue-black above & creamy-white below, with a dark red forehead & throat
- Long, deeply forked



- Glossy, blue-black above with a bright white rump
- Short, forked tail



Sand martins

- Our smallest member of the swallow family
- Brown above, white below & a brown band across its breast
- Short, forked tail



Swifts: Nest communally, high up. They are often heard in the early morning and just before dusk and can be spotted high in the sky catching insects. They very rarely come to the ground and spend most of their time on the wing.

House Martins: Nest communally in cup-shaped mud nests usually just below the eaves of a roof.

Swallows: Build nests of mud and moss in cup shapes. They usually build these inside barns for extra protection.

Did you know?

Sand Martins are the only species of these 4 that have show an upward trend in numbers. This species, winters further north in Africa and nests in burrows here in the UK.

Why DBRC need to know about these birds:

Recently the British Trust for Ornithology (BTO) updated the list of Birds of Conservation Concern (BoCC). The red list is for birds deemed most in need of help. Both swifts and house martins have now been moved onto the red list. Both species have shown a population decline of over 50% between 1969 and 2018. Swallows are on the green list, but even these have declined by over 30%.

All these birds are migratory so understanding the causes of decline can be difficult, with factors affecting both their summer breeding grounds in the UK (such as loss of nesting sites) and in their wintering grounds in Africa.

Having as much information as we can about where these birds are, can help in their conservation, by keeping professional ecologists and our conservation partners informed.

Mrs. Phyllis Cobbledick attends the Royal Maundy Service

Mrs. Phyllis Cobbledick has lived in Meeth for 65 years and is well known as a great supporter of the village and local area. She has been a member of Meeth church for over 55 years, serving as a council member, Secretary and latterly as Church Warden. Her life-time dedication of Christian service to the church and her help and support to the community for decades was noted by the Bishop of the Diocese of Exeter, who nominated her to be a recipient of Maundy money from the Sovereign. 96 men and 96 women are chosen




from all over the UK to attend the Annual Royal Maundy Service and receive Maundy Money. The precise number of Recipients is equal to the Queen's age and the first recorded Distribution was by King John in 1210.

The service this year took place at St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, on 14th April 2022. Phyllis travelled to London with her son Peter and daughter Janet and Janet was able to accompany her to the special Maundy Thursday service. This year the Distribution of the money was undertaken on behalf of the Queen by Prince Charles.

Maundy Money started with an updated issue of hammered coinage (attributed to Charles II) in 1662. The first full set was issued in 1670 and were sterling silver. In 1971 when the UK currency was decimalised, the face values were raised from old to new pence. Each recipient receives two purses. This year the Red Purse contains a £5 coin and a 50p coin portraying The Queen's Platinum Jubilee and were minted in 2022. Historically, this sum of £5.50 in the Red Purse is made up of £3 for clothing, £1.50 in lieu of provisions and £1 for the redemption of the Sovereign's gown, which before Tudor times, used to be divided between the Recipients. The White Purse contains uniquely minted Maundy Money, in the form of one,two,three and four silver penny pieces, the sum equaling the Monarch's age. This year, 96 pennies of silver coins (9 sets of 10p and 2 threepences were distributed.

After the service Phyllis and Janet were taken to Windsor Castle by buggy and enjoyed drinks and Canapés in one of the State rooms. Phyllis says she remembers looking out one of the windows and could see the Queen's private apartments. She had a wonderful day and enjoyed the special time with her son and daughter. Phyllis said the best part of the day was shaking Prince Charles' hand and receiving the special money, an experience she will never forget.

Tuckers Plot

Grow Your Own And Buy Local

Friends of ours who visit occasionally always comments on how hard we work in our allotment and greenhouse and they say "why do you put all that time and effort in when you can just buy the stuff already chopped, packed and ready to cook from the supermarket!?" They would never dream of buying carrots or potatoes with mud on or a fresh lettuce that you have to wash. Putting your wellies on to go out and cut / pick your dinner instead of driving to supermarket is an alien concept to them but then they are the first to say that they've never tasted tomatoes, cucumbers, asparagus and strawberries like ours. They also love eating our warm beetroot greens blanched in olive oil and lemon and wonder why they can't get beetroot with lush tops on from their supermarket at home. We are grateful every day to have the time and space to grow our own produce and I never fail to be delighted by picking the first ripe tomato or strawberry and popping it in my mouth and remembering how tasteless what I bought from the supermarket was compared to ours.... never mind that I have had to drive to the supermarket and queue up for the "pleasure" of tasteless food! I know that not everyone can "grow their own" and be self-sufficient in veg but we are lucky to be in an area where lots of people do and you can avail yourself of their produce at all of our wonderful local markets. If you only have a small garden or a few pots then growing a few of the things you love and which are expensive at the supermarket can be so rewarding and the benefit to you and your family from either buying at the market or growing your own are huge. Never mind the food miles plus the chemical preservatives, cold storage and carbon dioxide, shrink wraps or plastic bag that keep your supermarket fruit and veg "fresh"... none of it is "fresh" to the point of ripeness. All veg loose 30% of their nutrients within 3 days of picking. If veg is washed, chopped and bagged then it can have lost 90% of it's nutrients before it ever gets to the shelves, let alone into your fridge and then your cooking pot and fruit and veg only has the most nutrients when it is ripe and we never get ripe produce in the supermarket because the supply chain cannot sustain ripe produce. Your bagged lettuce can be nine days old before you even get it. Your shrink wrapped cucumber can be 2 months old and your tomatoes a month old and some fruit and veg can be stored for 9 months or more before it ever gets to you!

From my last visit to the supermarket you would think that Savoy cabbage is supposed to be yellowy-white and 5 inches across!... You would also think that spring onions are supposed to be less than the thickness of a pencil and taste of nothing!

Why not explore the local produce available at Hatherleigh Market and other markets during the summer months. You will find that things are more flavoursome, NOT more expensive than the supermarket, have far more nutrients because they are picked within 24 hours and also tick all the boxes with regard to food miles. My cucumbers are never "shrink wrapped" because I go out in the morning on market day and cut them!!!! If you can experiment with growing some of your own stuff then you will find it rewarding, fun and you also will not waste ANYTHING as you have put the effort in to growing it. Even if it's a few tomatoes or peppers, a bit of lettuce, some chillis, herbs or beetroot.... it will never taste as good as when you have grown it yourself. It is a sad fact that the veg we eat now from the supermarket is, on the whole, for various reasons, lacking 80% of the nutrients we would have expected from our veg 80 years ago..... so grow your own and buy local, if not to save the planet then just to save your taste buds from the bland and mediocre!

Tuckers Plot

Fried Chicken

1.5 kg chicken thighs trimmed of excess fat and flaps of skin. If your thighs are odd sizes then you may need to cut the larger ones so you have pieces all the same size. You can halve the recipe if you wish but this chicken is so good it usually gets munched up or you can freeze it cooked then defrost and heat in a moderate oven.

marinade the chicken for 24 hours in the following ingredients blitzed:

300ml butter milk

- 2 eggs
- 6 cloves of garlic chopped
- 1 large onion chopped
- 1 small piece of ginger mashed
- 1 small hot chilli
- 5 sage leaves
- 2 bay leaves
- 2 tsp salt
- 1 desert spoon of sugar

Make your coating

- 2 cups of plain flour
- 2 tsp each of mustard powder, ground ginger, white pepper
- 1 tsp salt
- **2** desert spoons each of paprika, mixed dried herbs, all purpose seasoning (such as Dunn's River)

Spread out your coating in a large dish or baking tray and coat your chicken pieces, making sure that the coating gets into all the nooks and crannies. Leave the chicken in the coating for about 30 mins (not in the fridge) so it adheres to the moist chicken as much as possible.





Notes from the Annual Parish Meeting followed by the Annual General Meeting held on the 10th May 2022. The next meeting will be held on

Tuesday 14th June 2022 at 7pm in the Community Centre.

Your 10 Councillors are Clare Tyson (Chair/Mayor), Rachel Laycock (deputy), Deb Laing-Trengove, Kay Walters, Donna Lewis, Paul Bolland, Callum Entwistle, Ellie Holland, Mark Reddaway and Helen Orbidans.

One member of the public was present.

Mayor Clare Tyson read her Chair Report to the meeting. A full transcript can be seen on the HTC website.

Matters raised during this meeting were the preference for a 20 mph speed limit through the town. A zebra crossing outside of the school entrance. A graffiti board in the Skate Park to try to stop illegal graffiti appearing in other parts of town. These ideas will be investigated and discussed at future meetings.

The Annual General Meeting followed with Councillors roles being allocated for the year. Clare Tyson was again elected Mayor/Chair with Rachel Laycock as her Deputy. A full list of Councillors roles can be found on the HTC website.

The Business group reported that the new Gateway signs are in production but have not yet been erected.

The Millennium Corner wall has been repaired but further work may be required to level the pathing slabs.

The broken bench outside of school has been removed which the Royal British Legion will replace with a new one. It was agreed to contribute £300 towards their costs.

The toilets have been refurbished and are looking very smart.

Hatherleigh Pottery has completed the Commemorative Jubilee gifts ready to be given to the primary school children.

The problem of access to the rear school entrance and staff parking places has been passed to WDBC and DCC Planning Officers. We await further information.

The missing former Mayor names have been added to the Mayoral Chain.

The quote to set up and run the "Visit Hatherleigh" website was accepted and we look forward to this going 'live' shortly to promote Hatherleigh and it's businesses as a place to visit.

It was agreed to spend the money raised so far for the Play Park on a unit to bridge the gap between the age groups. The quote from Rhino Play was reviewed and accepted.

It was agreed to draw up a list of priorities each month for our Town Caretaker so urgent items can be dealt with swiftly. Urgent for this month is to ready the Jubilee footpath for use.

With the sad death of Charles Dumpleton the Visitor Information Centre was under threat of closure. HTC agreed to give a grant of £5000 to keep it open for the year. It is hoped to make it self-sustaining in the future.

The Hanging Baskets will be appearing around town shortly. We are looking for volunteers to adopt and care for the baskets near to their homes.

The Market continues to successfully operate from the Community Centre. Kingswood Homes have recently posted that it is hoped the new Market Quarter will be completed by the end of the summer.

The new hourly Train service from Okehampton started on Sunday 15th May. Timetables available from the Information Centre

The new bus timetables are in the process of being printed and will be available from mid June.

Hatherleigh Environmental Forum Taking action to support wildlife and the environment in Hatherleigh and surrounding parishes

Make your own compost - Black gold for free

We are all experiencing increased food bills, and growing your own food is a fantastic way to reduce costs. The key to growing your own food is the quality of your soil. Most of us have a clay soil and the best way to improve this is to add organic material. The cheapest way to do this is through making your own compost. A compost heap uses natural processes to speed up waste decomposition into food for soil and plants. It reduces the household waste going to landfill and is a great habitat for wildlife, and they will help to break down the materials too. Increasing your organic matter through adding more compost to your soil also helps the soil soak up water and release it more slowly for the plants. This means your garden will be more drought resistant and you won't need to water so frequently, also less topsoil will be washed away when there is a downpour. It also helps rebalance your soils pH. If you use the No-dig-Method you only need to use compost material as a mulch. You don't need to dig it in. The easiest method for creating your own compost is the Add-As-You-Go method by layering up a compost pile (or you can also make a bin, 1 meter square using pallets).

Start with a layer of coarse browns (cut up twigs, stalks, plant stems, straw/hay) about 10cms deep. This will help with the drainage and ventilation of your pile/bin. Add a mixture of greens and browns onto the compost as it becomes available, **make sure to balance your greens and browns**, 10cms of green to 20cms of brown material. Use a layer of soil as your top layer. Initially, water your compost pile thoroughly to activate the microbes. As it composts, it should feel moist, but not waterlogged. Cover if getting too wet from the rain. We don't put our kitchen waste directly into the compost. We use a hot bin, which accelerates the breakdown of the kitchen waste without attracting vermin.

Green ingredients are soft, leafy and rich in nitrogen (*some especially rich), and they are usually moist and are low in fibre. The greens are a source of nitrogen which build cell structure. For example:

- Grass clippings*, removed deadhead flowers, cut flowers (be careful if they have been sprayed with chemicals);
- Coffee grounds* and paper coffee filters;
- · Tea bags* (best to rip them open and remove staples) and loose leaf tea;
- Uncooked vegetable (always ensure they are cut down to small pieces (onions are thought to be too acidic);
- Fruit scraps (cut citrus peel up finely), banana peel* (will add calcium, magnesium, sodium and potassium);
- Old herbs and spices;
- Trimmings from perennial and annual plants, houseplants and hedge trimmings;
- Annual weeds (that haven't set seed yet) (please check if they are invasive);
- Avocado stones, stale seeds and pips (chopped up so they don't sprout);
- Old jelly, jam or preserves;
- Animal manures (cow, horse, sheep, chicken, rabbit);
- Seaweed* and aquarium plants:
- · Feathers, human hair or animal hair or nail cuttings.

If you don't have much green waste available you can add a compost activator (manure from a grass grazing animal, alfalfa meal, bloodmeal, bonemeal, coffee grounds, male urine or just healthy soil from your garden. Of course, you may be able to get some additional greens from your neighbours!

Brown ingredients are fibrous, drier and more woody than leafy. The browns are rich in carbon (* some especially rich) and act as a source of energy. For example:

- Shredded dead leaves*, pine needles (if you add a lot of pine needles or a christmas tree you will create ericaceous compost);
- Dead plants (if there are no sign of disease or pests), twigs, chipped tree branches/bark (Do not use diseased wood, make sure you chop and break them up to small pieces);
- · Wooden chopsticks and toothpicks (broken up);
- Straw or hay* (please check that the hay has not been sprayed as this will suppress your plants);
- · Sawdust (only from untreated wood);
- Eggshells (preferably crushed, they will add calcium);
- · Corn cobs, nut shells;
- Paper newspaper, writing/printing paper, napkins, paper towels* and paper bags (ripped up and avoid heavily printed or coated in inorganic materials, do not use till receipts);
- Cardboard and paper plates (ripped up, avoid heavily printed or coated, remove tape and staples);
- Wood ash (do not use coal and charcoal ash, use up to 10% in your compost);
- · Home brewing wastes (spent hops and malt);
- · Old envelopes (minus the plastic window);
- Old rope and twine (plastic free);
- Old cotton or woolen clothes (cut into small pieces or shredded).

Do not compost

- Dairy products, meat or bones, fish scraps;
- · Bread or cooked food;
- Walnuts or black walnut tree debris (contains a natural growth suppressant for many plants);
- Cat litter, dog or cat waste (due to bacteria and parasites);
- · Cooking oil and grease (attracts vermin);
- · Diseased plants or insect-infested plants;
- Invasive weeds:
- Plants or wood treated with pesticides or preservatives.

Any weeds that are dominant we place in a compost bay that has no contact with the ground and we leave it a year to dry out and rot down, for example ivy, brambles and bindweed, any roots from ground elder, couch grass, docks and dandelions.

It is possible to produce compost in 8 weeks, but for garden use we recommend a slower method which should take 4 to 12 months depending on the season. We are building our compost heaps all year around. Plan on your compost being ready in three seasons, e.g. a compost heap started in spring, should be turned in summer and it should be ready by end of autumn. Check weekly to ensure it is moist and aerated by turning over periodically (we do once a season roughly) As the edges of the heap won't compost as well as the middle because edges are often drier..

You can tell when it's ready - It should smell earthy, sweet and fresh. Your new homemade compost should have a texture that is coarse, crumbly and spongy. We use it directly onto beds, but sift it if we are using it for seedlings, where we will mix it 50/50 with good quality, peat-free seedling compost.




