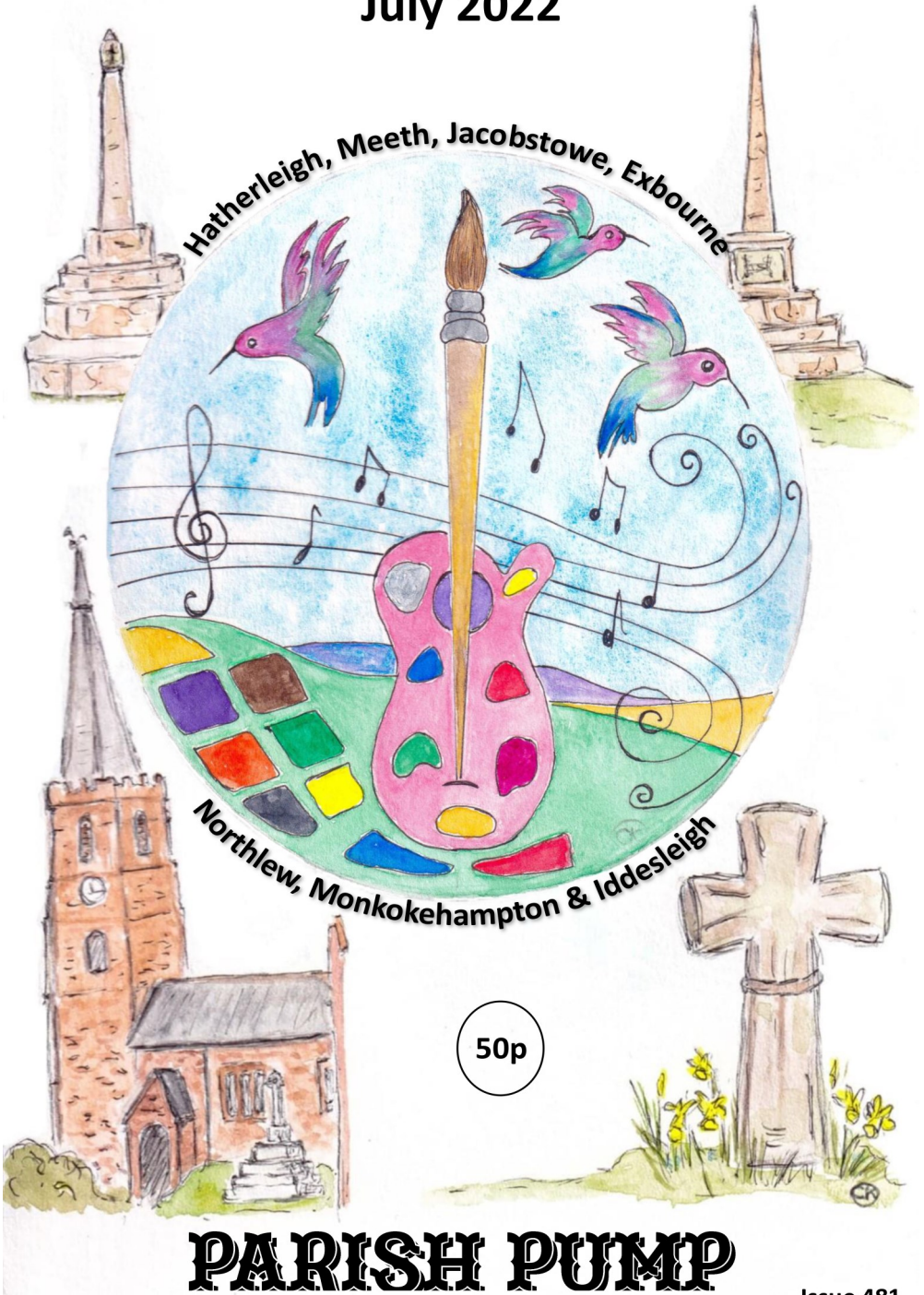

There may be other goodies on offer too as we'd love to make an event of it to celebrate our collective bravery.

On a reflective note, I wonder if you remember my lockdown video's? Looking back I seem to remember suggesting we 'face our fears' more than once as it is a principle I try to live by. Well, the pigeons have come home to roost, but here's the thing; the first time I went up that tower I was terrified. Since then I've been up a number of times, and more of late since planning this escapade. Each time the horror fades a little with exposure; to quote Jethro Tull on the subject; 'Stare that beastie in the face'. Maybe heights hold no fear for you, maybe nothing does. But many people find their lives limited or crippled by fears in a way they can't control. I'm hoping [and praying] that I'll find a sense of being held by Jesus as I go down the rope; I believe Jesus is available and would want to hold us all by the hand as we face the things that terrify or haunt us. And with a bit of exposure, those things which cast such shadows over us from behind as we run away so often shrink to a manageable proportion when we do turn and stare them in the face.

The excitement and enjoyment generated by the Platinum Jubilee celebrations was so lovely to experience. On the last day before the half term break the children came to school dressed in Red, White and Blue and gathered together as a whole school for a garden party on the school field, trees were also planted on the school field as part of the Queen's green canopy project.

During the half term break many children from school participated in the Hatherleigh town celebrations including singing and dancing.

Platinum jubilee mosaics created by each class to commemorate seven different aspects of the Queen's life during the last 70 years were displayed in the church during the celebrations and these are now becoming a permanent display in school for generations of children to enjoy.

Back in school the children have been very busy as we move towards final assessments of the school year including Y1 Phonics screening and the Y4 Multiplication tables check.

Over the next few weeks our Y6 children will be making visits to their High schools in preparation for leaving Hatherleigh Primary school as they move from Y6 to Y7. Preschool children will be making their first visits to school ready to begin with us in September and children currently in YR-Y5 will be visiting their new classrooms to meet their new teachers and teaching assistants as they move up a year group.

Other activities and events planned for the remaining weeks before we finish for the Summer break include Y2 and Y6 residential trips, Sports day, the PTFA Summer fayre, a whole school walk and more class trips out.

As always, I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone in the Hatherleigh school community; children, parents/carers, school staff and the governing board for all of their hard work and support. I would also like to extend a big thank you to the Parish Pump for their kind and generous donation to school which will be used to purchase play equipment for our break and lunch times.

I started ringing about 14 years ago relatively late in life and, although it was a challenge, I soon realised that ringing brought me friends, plus a sense of belonging and contributing to the community and church. Bellringing helps keep me fit and gives my brain a workout: it requires total concentration plus good physical co-ordination, although not huge strength. I also enjoy our practice night 'second half' in the Tally Ho!.

Bells have rung in Hatherleigh for over 600 years. When my creaky old hands finally protest 'no more!' I want to retire knowing the bells are secure for future generations, ringing out for services, weddings, national events and commemorations and helping people feel they are 'part of something'.

Is camping out on the ringing floor such a big deal? Not really, unless, like me, you have a lifelong fear of spiders. There are a few hefty ones in the tower and I undertake to co-exist with (and not squish) my eight-legged dormitory mates.

Am I too short to become a firefighter?

There is no minimum height requirement to become a firefighter.

Do I need to sleep on station?

No. On-call staff have a pager that alerts them when a call comes in. You will then respond to station within five minutes. The majority of the time you will continue to go about your daily life.

Could this help me to become a full time firefighter?

Last year we offered 43 full time positions to on-call staff. This will continue.

If I have to work out of town or take the kids to school, how do I do this?

At this station contracts range from 30 - 120 hours per week, you are only required to be immediately available during the hours you agree with us.

The Night Sky July 2022

Nights are still short in July and for most of it there is an absence of astronomical darkness. Astronomical darkness is when the Sun is 18 degrees below the horizon or more. It is during astronomical darkness that we can see most faint celestial objects.

July 13th is the night of the Full Moon and also a Supermoon. This will mean that the Moon will look somewhat larger and brighter than it normally does.

July 28th is the night of the New Moon and it is at this time of the month that we can spot fainter celestial objects including galaxies and nebulae due to the bright moon being out of the way.

As well as being the time of New Moon we can also observe the Delta Aquarid meteor shower. The moon being out of the way will mean that we can see many more of the fainter meteors as they shoot across the sky. The best time to observe the shower is between 11pm and 4am. This is because the night side of the Earth turns into the oncoming meteor stream. You can see the shooting stars whichever direction you look although their tails will appear to point back to the constellation of Aquarius, the water bearer. The point in the sky where a meteor shower appears to originate is called the radiant. The source of the meteors for this shower are debris left behind by comets called Marsden and Kracht.

Hatherleigh Silver Band News

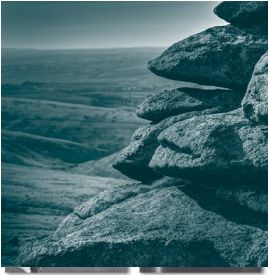

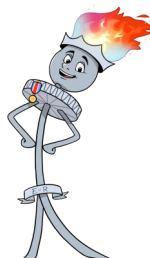

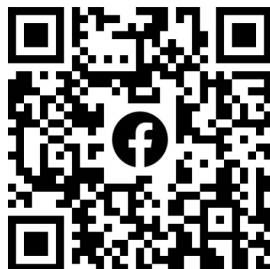

Species of the Month

July — Glow-Worm



Conservation Communities - Torrington to Hatherleigh

Help build up a picture of the wildlife in our area by telling
Devon Biodiversity Records Centre (www.dbrc.org.uk)

Glow-worms are not a worm at all, but a beetle. The females are famous for emitting a greenish light from their bottoms, caused by a chemical reaction to attract males.

Females are larger than the males and look like the larvae. They have no wings. After mating, a female will stop glowing. She will soon lay her eggs, then die.

Glow-worms stay as larvae for 2-3 years, the larvae also glow, but much more faintly.

Did you know?

- A glow-worm only lives as an adult for 2-3 weeks
- Males can glow too, but it's very rare.
- They feed on small slugs and snails.

Where to look: You can see them glowing between June and August, look just after it gets dark—they glow for a few hours.

They prefer open grassland or heaths, but can be found in gardens, railway embankments, cliffs and open woodland rides. You will see them at several of DWTs nature reserves, including Meeth Quarry.

They are often found as larvae, look in fields with a diverse species of grasses and plants. If you do find a glow-worm, don't move it. You can take a quick photo to send to us, but otherwise leave it be.

To encourage glow-worms into your garden, make a mixed patch of long grass, bare ground and short grass. A sunny spot is ideal with a log pile or rocks. Leave the cutting of long grass until autumn, when the mating period is finished.

The smaller males look more like typical beetles.

They scan the vegetation at night looking out for a glow that gives away a female's position. The males then fly over to her.



Why DBRC need to know about glow-worms: Glow-worm numbers have been falling. It's not always clear why. Maybe habitat loss, or more lights in the countryside at night. Keeping track of sites with glow-worms is really important. And of course, they will be affected by the use of pesticides and herbicides.

Tuckers Plot

As gardeners we all know that whatever we grow to eat or look pretty in the garden is always prey to something before we ever get to enjoy it.

Whether it is cabbage root fly decimating your brassicas, flea beetles munching holes in your radishes and swede leaves, carrot fly larvae making holes in your carrots, not to mention greenfly, whitefly, slugs, snails, wood lice, bunnies, deer, squirrels, mice and voles all munching on your produce, it can sometimes seem like an uphill battle to keep anything growing! Of all the pests, I count the miniscule Red Spider Mite as one of the worst pests, especially in the greenhouse or polytunnel. If you get it in your greenhouse it can travel from plant to plant across the greenhouse like a wave of death and if you are not aware what is causing the problem you may call it blight or wilt or think that something else is causing it but, bet your bottom dollar, it is the pesky spider mite!

Spider mites are, at the very most, 1mm across, but they are usually 0.25 - 0.50mm or less. When they hatch they can be even smaller and transparent, only turning red after a couple of days. They like hot and dry conditions so if you have a slab of concrete or a step then get your best reading glasses out on a hot sunny day and have a really close look..... if you have needed to go to Specsavers for a while then you may not even spot them but if you wipe your hand over the surface and there are orange smears all over it then you have squashed some spider mites. Spider mites seem SO small you would think they couldn't do any harm but, unknown to you they will lay their eggs on the underside of your leaves (any plant is vulnerable) and then the transparent hatchlings will travel out over your plant, sucking and sapping the goodness out of it. You may see a "web" with little white things in over leaves and canes and think you have beneficial spiders but this is probably not the case unless you see "a" web with "a" recognisable spider. Affected plants will soon develop marbled, yellowing leaves, leaves will drop off, the whole plant will fail to thrive, not produce fruit and then wither and die and eventually dripping webs of spider mite babies will feast on your plants.

what to do?

Keep your soil moist, Keep your greenhouse or tunnel well ventilated

Inspect your plants and canes (with your best glasses or a magnifying glass if necessary) and squish anything that doesn't belong.... especially if it is red.

Be vigilant! Look at the whole plant or bed of plants. Are any plants not growing evenly in the new growth? Are any plants yellowing compared to others? If a plant seems really suffering then pull it out, being careful not to let any infestation drop on to other plants but just a sprinkle of ant power on the tips may do the trick.

Liberal sprinkle your hard surfaces with ant powder, Spray affected plants with a garlic and soap solution. DON'T be complacent..... thinking they are so tiny they can't do any harm is a recipe for disaster.

Queens Jubilee Weekend: Firstly we would like to say a huge well done to everyone involved who contributed to make the weekend a spectacular success! Especially to the Jubilee Committee and Moor Management Committee. From the beacon evening, the street party, the food, the teas, the exhibitions, the fun day, the music, the commemorative bowls and of course to the bunting! I hope this includes everyone. It was all a fantastic community achievement! Well done all!

To briefly add for those people not on facebook and on the *Hatherleigh Building Community* page, there was overwhelming public support expressed to keep the street bunting up through summer.

Hanging Baskets: Thank you to those residents who are watering the hanging baskets. Can we please ask that you continue to regularly keep them watered and ask some one else to step in for you if you're going away.

Hatherleigh Market PARKING: As you know the Market continues to operate successfully from the Community Centre but again parking there is still an issue.

Can we remind people the Town car park is FREE on Market Days and therefore subsidised by your town council. There are reports of the carpark being underused. We subsidise the carpark at considerable expense to ease the parking congestion for market visitors – Use it or Lose it! Parking on the pavements around the community centre is inconsiderate and causes problems for others. We will be discussing with the market and community centre to have disabled only parking within the grounds. We all need to work together with this – please walk from the car park if you do not have disability issues.

Other traffic issues: WDBC Cllr. Kemp is co-ordinating a joint meeting with Devon Highways to look at problem areas around town. When this

meeting takes place we will raise the issue of yellow lines opposite the vets; box parking at Moor View; the 20 is plenty campaign; and re-visit some other outstanding issues.

New Purchases:

The new 'Visit Hatherleigh' website and new town signs are a step closer and coming soon. As are the new items of play equipment for Island Park – with the £25,000 raised it was agreed to purchase a multi-use climber and multi-swing unit. Works will start as soon as we have managed to get the old equipment removed. A new zip wire remains outstanding as further fundraising will be needed.

Bench Outside School: The old bench has been removed and when repaired we plan to re-site it on Jubilee footpath. A new British Legion bench will be fitted by the local RBL branch when ready.

Hatherleigh Visitor & Information Centre: this is going well and is very busy. New artists are being showcased and the Beacon Trail event was popular. Thank you to the volunteers that keep this running, the centre is a great asset to the town. Ice-creams are also on sale so pop down and show support!

Hatherleigh Fire Service: Currently the station is running on minimum capacity, which means when a firefighter is off sick or on leave there aren't enough crew to run the appliance. New recruits are desperately needed to join the team in order to provide full cover for the Hatherleigh area.

Meeth Cycle Path: we were informed that there is still no progress on the connecting link for the Hatherleigh to Meeth Cycle Trail.

Okehampton Community Transport: it was reported that charges have to be increased for journeys made by car. The community bus and wheelchair vehicle will remain the same charge.

Space is short here. A full account of meetings is available in the minutes on the Town Council website and notice board in Millennium Corner.

The book "When Hatherleigh Stood Still" that Donna Lewis and Tamsin Carter produced and was dedicated to Dennis Bater was included, this contained words, pictures, poems and photographs by Hatherleigh people during 2020/21. There was entertainment from the Primary School with singing and dancing and also our Hatherleigh Silver Band playing during the afternoon. On Saturday there was a wonderful organ recital in the church by four organists and cream teas were served from the Bell Tower.

It should be mentioned that a Flower Festival in the church ran for the four days with a theme of 'The Seven Decades of the Queen's Reign' and the arrangements were brilliant. The History Society also joined the floral displays with an exhibition of photographs and posters from our archives of Coronations and Jubilees of past Kings and Queens as well as the Coronation of our present Queen. It gave us the chance to speak to many people who follow our Facebook page and those who were interested in Hatherleigh history.

Many thanks to the Moor Management, Carnival Committee members and all who helped to make this a Jubilee to remember in Hatherleigh's History.

Hatherleigh Church Volunteers

Grants are being sought from various charities and lotteries and although some of these have been granted, we are still short by a great amount. To this end, some brave people (including myself and the vicar) have said they will get sponsors and abseil down the Church tower on Saturday 6th August. Please help to support this – if you see a sponsor form, please give generously. If you have any

other means of fundraising, we would be delighted to hear from you.

We are lucky to have many volunteers who give their time to keep the Church looking its best – a huge thank you to them all. If you would like to join us, please do get in touch.

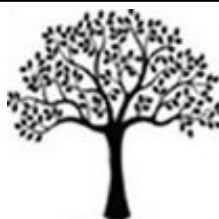
