Hello again,

Once again, Donna has just pinged me to tell me that tomorrow is 'Pump deadline day' [sorry Donna] and I'm left thinking 'surely I've only just written last month's piece'; where does the time go? The months fly by and yet each week seems to have at



least a month's worth of activity in it; the whole thing feels strange. Cutting edge physicists will tell you that reality requires at least ten dimensions to function and that several of them relate to time, so maybe there's more going on than we realise. And yet, God has decreed, that in our part of creation at least, we experience simple, linear time; there is a past that we remember, a present that we experience, and a future we know nothing of [I often think how differently we would live if we could see just an hour into the future, I can only guess that God knows that would not be good for us].

So it seems to me, the only part of time that we can take hold of and enjoy is the present. Too often we neglect the present, looking, waiting and hoping for a better moment in the future while wishing away the only moment we truly own; now! 'When the children are older', 'when we have more money', 'when we have more time on our hands'; it is likely if we live like this, the things that matter will never happen, the moment is stolen away, often with trivialities. After all, none of us have any guarantee that we will still be here tomorrow.

Jesus said 'Do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes?... Therefore, do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own'.

Being the vicar, it falls to me fairly regularly to officiate at funerals, and it doesn't matter how old the person is that we're remembering, the people left behind would give anything for just a little more time with the person they've lost. And very often, they lament the missed opportunities that have passed them by while they were busy trying to believe this day would never come.

When I take couples through marriage preparation, I invite them to write a priority list of all the things that are most important to them, then, to keep a diary for a week noting down how they actually spent their time. Usually the difference between these two things is alarming, and displays how little attention we give to the things [and the people] who truly matter.

Well it is summer; long days to enjoy, and for some, a slackening of the pace. Why not consider your own priorities, and make sure you give time, in the present, not an imagined future, to those things and save yourself from regrets later on?

King Solomon wrote; 'there is a time for everything and a season for every activity under heaven', so let's seize the day, live mindfully in the present, and enjoy what we have without leaving room for regrets.

The Night Sky August 2022

Nights are starting to get noticeably longer. August 12th will see a super moon. It also happens to be the same day as the Perseid meteor shower. This is one of the best meteor showers of the year. There are many bright and easy to spot meteors. The Moon will be full but you'll be able to easily pick out Perseid meteors flashing across the sky. It's a great time to look out for fire

balls. These blaze across the sky and often leave a smoke trail behind that is sometimes visible for a few minutes before it dissipates.

The best time to see the meteor shower is between 11pm and 4am. It is between these times that the night side of the Earth turns into the oncoming meteor stream. It doesn't matter which direction you look in. Your bound to see numerous Perseid meteors even though the Moon will be up. If you trace their tails back you'll see that they originate in the constellation of Perseus. The cometary debris that produces this shower moves through the atmosphere at about 36 miles per second! As its vaporized we see the streaks of light as meteors. A meteorite would be a meteor that has hit the ground. At its peak you could see up to 100 meteors per hour though the bright moon will wash out the fainter shooting stars.

New Moon Falls on August 27th. Saturn also reaches opposition on the 14th of August. It will be at its brightest for the year and will be visible all night long. A small telescope will easily reveal the beautiful rings.

Transformation Yoga - less is more

I've been teaching Transformation Hatha Yoga & Relaxation at Hatherleigh Community Centre for over ten years. Over that time, students have come and gone and many have continued to come for several years, developing their own practice, as I have developed mine as both practitioner and teacher.

Hatha Yoga is gentle relative to most other kinds of yoga. Moving into and out of positions/postures is taught and practiced slowly, carefully and mindfully. There are two wonderful benefits of moving and stretching in this way:

- 1) slower is stronger: slower moving and stretching means you engage your muscles more deeply and build strength that way, avoiding lots of fast repetition (and therefore wear and tear); it also makes it safer;
- 2) connection with peace the source of wellbeing within you through focus on harmonising slow movement with steady breathing. Focus on these two things and the development of that focus puts you 100 percent into the present moment. It is only with our attention fully in the Now that we can free ourselves from negative thinking and the emotions it fuels, allowing us to connect with the peace of our essence. That peace is precious indeed in our troubled world.

Over time, your practice will enable you to build that connection, that inner peace, so that it makes your mind strong and resilient, as well as your body.

Whilst standing on your head or doing the splits may look like 'more' in yoga (neither of which I teach by the way!), in my experience, it is moving and stretching comfortably and steadily with care for our bodies (which may appear to be 'less' on the surface) that gives more on a mental, emotional and soul level, as well as the physical one.

Guided relaxation always features strongly in my classes. It is so important for us to build our relaxation skills – for they are valuable skills indeed in our stressy age – enabling us to manage and master stress and there again reconnect with peace, happiness and wellbeing.



Species of the Month

August— Kestrel



Conservation Communities - Torrington to Hatherleigh Help build up a picture of the wildlife in our area by telling Devon Biodiversity Records Centre (www.dbrc.org.uk)

Kestrels are one of the smaller birds of prey, slightly smaller than a pigeon. Females are brown, with dark bands on the tail. Whereas males have a grey head, a more gingery back with a paler underside.



Kestrels are most often observed hovering. They have the ability to keep their head totally still, even in strong winds. They have fantastic eyesight and use it to look for their prey – small mammals.

Why DBRC need to know about kestrels in this area:

By sending in your sightings of kestrels, you can help us put them on the map and contribute to our knowledge of where these birds are.

Having kestrels in the area can also tell us about other species. It's likely that there is a good population of small mammals in areas with kestrel records, which often suggests a diverse habitat.

Did you know?

- Their favoured prey are field voles.
- They like to hunt over open countryside.
- Kestrels can see ultraviolet light, meaning they can detect urine trails of small mammals.



- Kestrels don't build a nest, but use holes in trees or cliffs.
- Their eyesight is excellent and can detect tiny movements whilst hovering 20m up in the air.



Decline in Numbers

Kestrels are on the birds of Conservation Concern Amber List. Their declined is thought to be due to changes in land use, amongst other factors. Kestrels have a high mortality rate. Of the 5 eggs

usually laid, only one is likely to survive for 2 years, when it reaches breeding age. Starvation, collisions, poisoning and disease are factors.

Although the species had a small recovery when pesticide use reduced in the 1980s, there has been a decline over the last 15 years, the cause of which is unknown.









Meg's Ten(ish) Tors Challenge

Back in February 2022, I started my journey as a trainee with the North Dartmoor Search and Rescue Team (NDSART). Our call-outs of course include lost walkers or injured hikers on the moors, but more and more frequently, we are responding to people suffering mental health crises. Very few of these were on Dartmoor over 2021-as a team, we operate in rural mid-Devon, from Exeter to Bude, and from Lydford to Great Torrington, so Hatherleigh and its surrounding parishes are firmly at the centre.

On the first weekend of October, several fellow trainees, full team members, and I will be completing a 55 mile expedition, replicating that of the Ten Tors event, in an effort to raise some vital funds to replace our current Incident Control Unit (ICU).

The current ICU is an extensively modified IVECO Daily light commercial van which serves as a mobile base during callouts. It was first registered in 2002 and purchased second-hand by the team in 2006. The vehicle is equipped with sophisticated electronic equipment which is used to co-ordinate searches and to maintain mobile communication links with operational search teams when on a call-out. It is also used to store vital medical and rescue equipment, as well as providing shelter for exhausted team members and casualties during bad weather.

However, the ICU is now twenty years old, and is in urgent need of replacement.

Our expedition will replicate the annual Ten Tors 55 mile event, with the team setting off at 7am on Saturday 1st October, and arriving back at the finish line by 5pm on Sunday 2nd October. We will be fully self-sufficient, and be adhering to the Ten Tors regulations, such as carrying full team kit and not receiving our route until the day or two before.

I never thought I'd sign up to walking 55 miles across Dartmoor again, after (only just!) completing the 55 mile event with Okehampton College back in 2016, so this will be a real challenge for me.

This is a truly worthy cause, for a charity I hope nobody reading this will ever have to rely on, so please do give generously. The new Hatherleigh gateway signs have been erected and look very smart.

The Town Caretaker Mr Chris Peters has resigned for health reasons and HTC would like to thank him for his hard work. We will be advertising for a new Caretaker to fill the vacant position. Please look elsewhere in this issue.

Weeds are a constant problem on our streets and if attached to someone's property cannot be dealt with by the Caretaker. Please could we ask all residents to weed the frontage to their own property to keep our Town looking cared for.

Millenium Corner still needs some repairs but will need to wait until the adjacent building work is completed.

The old broken bench has been removed from outside the school entrance and is awaiting repairs to then be sited elsewhere in Town.

HTC are aware that the Perspex on the Moor View notice board has deteriorated and will need to be replaced.

Planting Herbs Now

At this time of year when you are starting to crop your vegetables you always get to thinking "what could I put in that empty patch?" It's always nice to keep your veg patch or tubs full and productive and my answer is always, if you do nothing else, pop in some herbs and lettuce.

If you love cooking then you probably end up spending "a small fortune" on a bag of herbs here and a pot of herbs there. When you buy potted herbs from the supermarket you think the pot will be better value than the bag of herbs but really the supermarket gimmick of selling you "fresh growing herbs" is just to extend the shelf life of what they sell you; the exceptions being Rosemary and Mint. A bag of herbs will last just a few days and is filled with Co2 to stop it wilting. A pot of herbs will have at least twice the shelf life of the bag but because the pots are so packed with seed and forced in a controlled environment they will never grow on because the roots are so compacted and the stems are so fragile.

Coriander, Dill and Basil will all grow well now but you might find that Basil likes some shelter from wind in a sunny corner but all three are quite fast to grow and happy in our summer climate. You could easily start from seed now or come down to Hatherleigh Market and buy a pot or modules that are designed for growing on. You could start some Chives, Oregano, Marjoram, Thyme. Rosemary and Parsley; they are slower to get going but will grow on for a year or more. Don't forget, if you grow your own herbs then let some go to seed and you will have seed for next year instead of buying.

Good firm headed lettuce such as Cos or Romaine can be started now and I usually

find that if I plant any kind of "cut and come again", I can still be picking it in November or even December. If you have a shady patch that you can keep moist then you can even grow a crop of Watercress.


Taking action to support wildlife and the environment in Hatherleigh and surrounding parishe

The benefits of native grasses in a meadow

If you are growing a wildflower meadow and you are disappointed that it consists mainly of grasses, you are still achieving a wonderful habitat for wildlife and it can be just as beautiful in its own right. During the growing season, many species of moth and butterfly caterpillars feed on the blade of native grasses, such as skippers, marbled white, meadow brown, gatekeeper, ringlet, and speckled woods. Grass seed heads provide food for songbirds, insects, and small mammals.

In the autumn and winter, grasses provide protection and nesting material for birds, small mammals, and insects. Native grasses are especially useful to the overwintering larvae and adults of beneficial insects, ground beetles and spiders, which prey on pests such as aphids. A rich insect population will support many species of birds, and a variety of mammals like bats and hedgehogs.

There are 160 species of grasses in the UK and Ireland. A species-rich grassland can support between 20-40 different species of grasses. If you would like to learn to identify some of the grasses it is recommended to start with the most common species, in this area that will be Crested dog's-tail, Cock's-foot, Yorkshire fog, Meadow foxtail, Timothy, Bent grasses, and Sweet vernal grass.



Perennial rye-grass is a common grass, it grows vigorously and is used on football fields, it also has a high sugar content and is good to fatten up grazers. Because rye grass grows well in high nutrient soils it is not recommended in a native wildlife meadow where grasses that prefer low nutrient soil are preferable.

Sedges, rushes and plantain flowers also grow in our local meadows, at a glance these can be mistaken for grasses. If you would like to learn how to identify grasses, sedges and rushes please visit https://www.devonwildlifetrust.org/wildlife-explorer/grasses-sedges-and-rushes

By the time you read this we will have attended the `Mini Fest` at the Community Centre, raising funds for aid to Ukraine, where we showed old photographs of Hatherleigh. Whenever there is an opportunity to show these photographs, which were donated many years ago by townsfolk now long gone, it gives people the chance to see the fetes, bazaars, parades and other fund raising organisations that made a difference to lives in Hatherleigh and also supported other parts of the world. The people in Hatherleigh have always been generous with not only money but with time and physical work when needed to aid good causes and so it continues in these tough times of rising costs for us all.

Just to give you an idea of some of the charities and benefactors of the past centuries, here are a few listed in the Almanac first produced by Rev. Banks in 1884 and then updated by Rev. Norman Hillier for the Millennium Year 1981. (The Almanac listed an event for every day of the year.)

January; 1763 The Union Benefit Society formed. 1816 Parish Church decided to support and educate an African youth in Sierra Leone named after Craddock Glascott, £30 sent. February;1813 Church Missionary Society branch formed-first in Devon. March: 1736 Church Houses leased for 21 years. £5 p.a. to Overseers of Poor. 1830 Date of first Bill of the Benevolent Society. 1888 Bishop of Exeter sent 3 guineas to the Church Restoration Fund. April; 1743 Walter Bennett beguests £100 to Poor of the Parish, he set up the Bread Charity. 1837 171 children in Sunday School, two guineas allowed for rewards and 1 1/2d cake for each child. May; 1793 Charles Luxmoore left in will £100 to educate young persons in the Christian Religion. 1879 Penny Bank commenced. June; 1863 Centenary celebrations of Union Benefit Soc. 1868 Festival of Union Benefit Soc. And Female Benefit Society. 1847 Plans made to dispense food to poor. (Food riots in Exeter.) July: 1777 John Eddy left 8 shillings p.a. to be given in bread to the poor on Christmas Day. 1707 John Lethbridge left £100 for the poor. 1928 First sale of work on behalf of the Bible Churchman's Missionary Society. 1845 The Loyal Rock of Friendship Lodge of the Manchester Unity of Oddfellows established. August:1923 Souvenir Recipe Book published for Parish Church Restoration Fund. September: 1870 Sermons and collections for poor soldiers in Franco-Prussion War. 1877 Collection for Indian Famine £15. October; 1876 collection for Bulgarian Christians surviving massacres by Turkish troops. 1852 Mary Hollinshead died aged 33, she founded the Childrens Clothing Club. November; 1817 Sick Man's Friend Society established. December: 1851 Clothing Club formed.


