Dear all,

I'm writing today, the day after the funeral of her majesty Elizabeth our Queen. Like many of you, no doubt, I'm still absorbing the sad news and pondering the changes it will mean for our nation, and the world. Our Prayers have very much been



with our new King, Charles III as he takes up his new position as monarch. We are also praying for the whole Royal family as their various roles and responsibilities are rearranged whilst they deal with their own grief and loss.

Turbulent though the times have been, our everlasting King has been constant and unchanging in his goodness and grace, and I for one am very happy to be standing on the rock-like security of knowing that he has all things in hand and every final outcome covered.

I know I have said this many times in these letters, but I encourage you again, in the midst of whatever you are facing, good or bad, to look to the King who enabled our Queen. Ask Him for help as she did. If you don't know where to start with that, please get in touch and I'll gladly point you in the right direction.

Finally, I'd like to express my personal thanks to all those who made the effort to recognise the gravity of these events; our bell ringers, Jeff for taking care of the flag, the silver band for their spontaneous action, Rev. John Hall for so ably taking the services in my absence, and all the churchwardens around the parishes for ensuring there was a means for people to express their feelings and respond.

Air Pollution in The Home

Most of us are concerned about air pollution when outdoors, however we also need to consider indoor air pollution. Levels of indoor air pollutants can be two to five times higher than outdoor air pollutants. Indoor air pollutants include:

- particulate matter (PM) (dust, soot, dirt, or dust mites);
- gases (carbon monoxide, nitrogen oxide, and sulphur dioxide);
- vapours of toxic chemicals (formaldehyde, benzene, nitrobenzene and methylene chloride).

Some of these harmful substances are from outdoor air pollution coming inside but the majority are from items already in our homes. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), around 3.8 million people a year die from exposure to household air pollution. Poor indoor air quality has been linked to a range of illnesses including asthma, pneumonia, lung cancer, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and cardiovascular disease. To reduce indoor air pollutants, experts agree that both source removal and ventilation are key. It is also important to understand everyone's home is different and everyone's reaction to the indoor air pollutants can also differ.

Heating and cooking with gas releases tiny particles of nitrogen dioxide (NO2) and carbon monoxide (CO) into the air you breathe. Carbon monoxide is a poisonous gas with no smell or taste. It's recommended you have a carbon monoxide alarm in every room where fuel is burned and electric is seen as the cleanest form of heating and cooking. A study found that cooking a Sunday roast could produce higher levels of PMs than are found on the streets of Delhi, one of the most polluted cities in the world. These particles pose a particular risk to the respiratory system. Burning wood and coal in a stove or on an open fire also release PMs. Experts recommend using an extractor fan or opening a window when cooking.

Harmful airborne particles called volatile organic compounds (VOCs) are found in vapours from many commonly used household cleaning products. A study recently revealed that lung function was impacted similarly to the effects of having smoked 20 cigarettes a day for 10-20 years in people who were regularly exposed to cleaning products. Be cautious about using cleaning products and don't over use them. There are a number of eco-friendly green brands that contain far lower levels of VOCs. Protecting your hands with gloves and applying a moisturiser regularly can really help too.

A damp home encourages mould and other fungi to grow. Exposure to damp and mouldy environments may cause a variety of health problems including respiratory infections, allergies or asthma. Mould allergies can produce similar symptoms to hay fever. Regularly check and clean surfaces and keep humidity levels as low as you can—between 30% and 50%—all day long. An air conditioner or dehumidifier may help reduce dampness. Good ventilation can help and fix any leaks!



The Night Sky October 2022

Nights are noticeably darker now that we are in October. October is a good month for stargazing as nights are often clear. New Moon falls on October 25th whilst Full Moon is on October 9th. On the night of the 21st going into the early morning of the

22nd vou'll be able too observe the Orionid meteor shower. The meteors appear to originate from a point in the sky located in Orion. The Moon will just be a thin crescent so many meteors should be visible. In fact at its peak you should see around 20 meteors per hour. The best time to observe the shower is between 11pm and 4am. This is because the night side of the Earth will be facing into the on coming meteor stream. The grains of dust burning up in the atmosphere were left behind by Halley's Comet

Around the time of the New Moon is the best time of the month to observe fainter celestial objects such as galaxies and nebulae. This is because the absence of moonlight means fainter celestial objects will not be washed out.



October - Galls



Conservation Communities - Torrington to Hatherleigh Help build up a picture of the wildlife in our area by telling Devon Biodiversity Records Centre (www.dbrc.org.uk).

What is a gall?

Galls occur on plants (usually trees and shrubs), they are produced as a response by the plant to insects feeding or laying eggs inside the leaves or branches (these insects and the galls cause little damage to the host plant). Although this activity usually happens in spring, it is often not until autumn, when the leaves fall, that galls become apparent. Galls come in all sorts of shapes, colours and sizes.

Did you know?

- There are around 70 different types of gall wasp for oak trees in the UK?
- Gall wasps have a complicated life cycle, often producing more than one type of gall on a tree.
- Adult gall wasps are rarely seen, but their galls are easily spotted,

Common galls that you may find on oak trees this autumn.

Oak marble gall

This is caused by the small wasp (just 2mm long), Andricus kollari.
Clusters of these oak marble galls can be found on twigs of oak trees. They mature to a brown colour. Inside the gall, larvae feed on the host tissue. The adults emerge, leaving small circular holes in the gall. The empty gall remains, and it is these

that we see in the autumn.

Spangle galls are caused by the common gall wasp, Neutroterus quercusbaccarum. After mating, fertilised eggs are laid on the underside of oak leaves. The galls (which look slightly flattened) are formed by autumn and the wasp larvae remain

inside the gall among the leaflitter, throughout winter, emerging in spring.

Silk button galls are also found on the underside of oak leaves. These are caused by the wasp *Neuroterus numismalis*. The galls are raised, with a dent in the centre.

In each of these cases, these galls form only one part of the fascinating life cycle of these two species of gall wasps.



At the start of the meeting a 2 minutes silence was held to Honour our Late Sovereign Queen Flizabeth II.

We wish to thank the Towns folk who have all come together to mark the occasion appropriately. With special thanks to the Silver Band, The Bell Ringers, our Town Crier Ros Chard and the volunteers who removed the Jubilee Bunting at short notice.

Remembrance Sunday plans for the rolling road closure for the parade have been authorised. Mr Paul Wilkinson will be contacted to provide the wreath again this year.

The Royal British Legion have had delivery of the Bench to be placed outside the school entrance. There will be an unveiling ceremony at a time organised by Mr Wilkinson.

The old bench metal work has now been repaired, thanks to Right Angle for this. Mr Mark Wonnacott has kindly offered to replace the woodwork. A suggested place for the restored bench is the Jubilee Footpath.

We have received no expressions of interest for the Street Caretaker role following the resignation of Mr Peters. This will be readvertised. Please contact the clerk.

Queen Elizabeth's Favourite Flower

There is a little flower that has long been one of my favourites as it smells like heaven and the little blooms can be chanced upon in the most unexpected places. I have some in my garden now and it always gives me joy to see the leaves of the little plants forcing their way through the



undergrowth under the trees in spring before the flowers appear at the beginning of May. I used to live in Ascot, near the racecourse and there was (and I presume still is) a long chain fence with scrubby trees along The New Mile and in the undergrowth is an absolute sea of Lily of the Valley in early May and as you walk by the smell is quite overpowering.

My grandmother had Lily of the Valley in her wedding bouquet and always grew it in her garden. This tiny little flower, that isn't even a real lily; it is actually a member of the asparagus family, has long been associated with wedding bouquets as a symbol of luck in love, constancy and to ward off evil spirits. Queen Victoria, Princess Astrid of Sweden, Grace Kelly, Kate Middleton, Meghan Markle and Princess Eugenie, all had this little scented flower in their wedding bouquet. After it was used by Queen Victoria, every young girl wanted it in their bouquet and as it was so easily found in the hedgerows it was not beyond the pocket of the average bride and had probably been put in the bouquet or hair of many brides before Queen Victoria.

The Queen Mother also had Lily of the Valley in her bouquet but it was not featured in any of the photos as when she walked into Westminster Abbey she laid her bouquet on The Tomb Of The Unknown Soldier in honour of her brother who was killed during World War I. This tiny plant is a native to many continents and has been used to make dyes, perfumes and also to combat sickness, particularly gas poisoning during World War I and also in medicines to combat heart disease, epilepsy and burns.

This little gem is also mentioned in the bible as springing from the tears that dropped on the ground when Eve was expelled from the garden of Eden and many poems have been written about it. Even Queen wrote a song about it. The little bell-shaped flowers were also thought to be fairy's drinking cups in medieval times.

If you want to make a very special tribute to our late Queen then, in a shady place, find some room for some Lily Of The Valley and every year they will fill you with joy.

Hatherleigh Bellringers

Part of History: Hatherleigh's Bells, September 8th – 19th 2022

Mourners and well-wishers from all over the nation have queued to pay their respects to the late Queen this last month. Queen Elizabeth reigned so long that only the elderly remember the death of her father in 1952. The significance of this loved and respected Queen's death has been deeply felt by countless people. From those enormous crowds and queues many of them told interviewers, 'I wanted to feel part of history.'

Ceremonies after a monarch's death, leading to a state funeral, follow some ancient historical procedures and protocols. Processions, proclamations, prayers and church services, flags, uniforms, and the 'Lying in State' are part of a vast programme of what happens when a king or queen dies. The ringing of church bells is no exception.

At times of national importance Hatherleigh's bellringers (along with other towers) receive advice and instructions through the Central Council of Church Bellringers, which takes advice from the Church of England. The Church of England has liaised with the Royal Household about dates and times of events.

It is traditional at solemn times of remembrance and mourning for a bell tower to half-muffle the bells. Covers are placed on the bell clappers so that only one side strikes loudly. The other side is muffled, and makes a softer, echoing sound. Hatherleigh residents will have heard the bells ring half-muffled on Remembrance Sunday and, occasionally, at funerals.

On the death of a monarch, however, all except the tenor (the heaviest bell and the lowest note) are fully-muffled and the entire clapper is covered so it cannot strike loudly. The tenor remains half-muffled. The effect is beautiful, but sombre.

A fully-muffled 'ring' is the traditional way to mark a monarch's passing and will have been heard throughout the country. Many who listened in Hatherleigh's Square or churchyard on September 9th told us how moving it was to hear the haunting, ethereal sound of fully-muffled bells. Following the proclamation of King Charles III on 10th September, muffles were removed so that the bells rang 'open' for Sunday Service on 11th. The bells were later re-muffled until after the state funeral on 19th September. They were rung for an hour before the funeral.

As bellringers, we felt privileged to be 'part of history' this September, bringing a community together to remember and to mourn.

Ringers over this historic period were Mark Wonnacott (Tower Captain), Richard Harrison (Ringing Captain), Garry Bater, Lily Bater, Ian Grantham, Alex Harrison, Sadie Harrison, Jess Lewis, Mark Reddaway, Simon Squire, Isabella Whitworth, and Natalie Wonnacott.

The last month was a month full of history as we mourned the passing of HM Queen Elizabeth II on the 8th September and then of history in the making with the proclamation announcing the reign of King Charles III.

Hatherleigh like villages, towns and cities and the world were in shock as the news filtered through of the Queen's deteriorating health, this was just days after receiving the new Prime Minister Liz Truss at Balmoral. When the announcement came that the Queen had died many felt the need to do something, the Hatherleigh Silver Band went to the Square and played the National Anthem and some appropriate hymns and were soon joined by townsfolk.

At a time like this ancient tradition declares that the church bells are rung fully muffled which means fitting leather pads to both sides of the bell's clapper, this reduces the volume. Only the tenor bell is fitted with a half muffle so that one side of the clapper strikes normally. And so, our bell ringers rang the bells on Friday 9th September at 12 noon, many people braved the rain showers to listen for 45 minutes to the solemn, haunting and very moving sound that the muffled bells made to mark the passing of our Queen. We are so lucky to have this wonderful group of bell ringers. The muffles were removed for the normal ringing of bells calling people to the Sunday Service and official Proclamation but were returned once again to be rung on the 19th September, the day of the State Funeral.

Monday the 12th September and the Town Crier Ros Chard first went to the Primary School and read the Proclamation of King Charles III and then came to the Square and read the Proclamation once again, she was joined by the people listening with a shout of "God Save the King"! This still sounds strange as most of us have only ever heard "God Save the Queen" called.

The Town Council provided a `Book of Condolence` in the Community Centre where people could write their thoughts or a short message and the churches were left open for private prayer or the lighting of a candle as well as special services.

Whether you watched all that unfolded at home or managed to actually make a trip to London, over the 12 days since the Queen's death and up until the State Funeral Hatherleigh came together in different ways to show its love and regard for a Queen that served us all so well for 70 years.




