The Remembrance Sunday parade and Service was also very successful and moving. With thanks to Royal British Legion, Reverend Leigh Winsbury, Hatherleigh Silverband and all those involved.

The Royal British Legion bench outside of Hatherleigh School was unveiled by Mr Michael Morpurgo and representatives from the Royal British Legion with the Reverend Leigh Winsbury. It really is a beautiful addition to the Town.

A sample of a metal poppy was brought to the meeting. It is too late for this year but will be investigated for next year to provide a sustainable wreath.

The Night Sky December 2022

December nights are long and cold. There is a lot too see in the night sky at this time of year. The opposition of Mars takes place on the 8th December. Mars will be at it's brightest and closest to Earth for this year. You can discern the polar ice caps on mars using a

small telescope. However if the planet is covered in a global dust storm, as it sometimes is you won't be able to make out any surface features at all! Even to the naked eve Mars will be bright and easy to spot. It is currently located in Taurus the Bull.

Species of the Month December—Redwing



Conservation Communities - Torrington to Hatherleigh Help build up a picture of the wildlife in our area by telling Devon Biodiversity Records Centre (<u>www.dbrc.org.uk</u>)



Redwings seen in Devon over the winter are usually from Scandinavia or Russia. They migrate to the UK in autumn to feast on berries in hedgerows, favouring hawthorn and rowan. Once the berries have all gone, they can be seen searching for earthworms on the ground. They stay throughout the winter, heading back to their summer breeding grounds in spring.

Did you know?

- The redwing is the UK's smallest true thrush.
- They are often seen in large flocks, sometimes mixed with fieldfares or other thrushes.
- The migratory flight made twice a year, of 500 miles across the North Sea, is a dangerous journey for a small bird!
- · 8.6 million redwings visit the UK in the winter.

Redwing and Fieldfare

- Redwings are our smallest true thrust, measuring 21cm from beak to tail. A similar size to a song thrush.
- They have a distinctive creamy eye stripe (supercilium).
- The rusty-red underwings help when identifying redwings.

- Fieldfares are bigger than redwings. Similar in size and shape to the mistle thrush.
- They have a distinguishable grey head and back.
- Fieldfares have a long, black tail, that you can spot, if looking at a mixed flock.

Why DBRC (www.dbrc.org.uk) are asking you to tell

them about redwings in this area:

Redwings favour open countryside, but they will also venture into gardens, particularly if the weather is harsh. This makes it a great bird to try and spot over the winter as you may see them out of your window. With all migrating birds, keeping track of their numbers not only helps us keep track of the health of our local wildlife, but also helps to track changes across the planet.

Christmas Dinner is just a BIG Sunday Roast so don't stress!

Christmas should be fun but there is always a lot of emphasis on Christmas Dinner and someone very often gets up at the crack of dawn on Christmas Day to get dinner started..... stresses about timings...... thinks they've got to do 47 types of veg..... stuffing...... pigs in blankets...... all sorts..... then dish it up for 12 people...... keep it warm...... and from past experience...... by the time it come to EAT Christmas dinner you are too tired... too hot and too stressed and had too much sherry to be bothered! I don't want to "do a Nigella" but here's a few simple tips to make life easier AND Cheaper.

1. Pigs in blankets are "a must" but don't buy them..... well ahead of time buy some ordinary chipolata and some smoked streaky bacon. Twist each chipolata carefully in the middle so it turns into 2 little sausages, cut a rasher of bacon in half length ways and wrap it round the sausage. If you are not too far ahead leave them in the fridge or you can do it really early and pop them in the freezer.

2. Stuffing is also "a must" but "stuff" expensive stuffings or boring old Paxo. Well ahead of time get 500g of sausage meat, 500g of good bread crumb you've saved from bits of bread left over, a little butter, a beaten egg, massive handfuls of chopped herbs such as parsley, sage, rosemary, thyme, 2 large onions grated, lots of salt and pepper. Mix everything together. Roll some into balls (to oven cook with the pigs on the day) and leave some to put in the neck of the turkey. Keep in fridge for a couple of days or freeze well ahead of time.

3. Gravy is REALLY important but well before Christmas keep a stock store going. Whatever I cook beef, pork, chicken, beef, steak, the bones and any leftover juices, gravy and veg always get made into stock. If you have meat juices, bones, onion, carrot, celery and herbs then you can always make good stock and the gravy for Christmas doesn't have to be made just from turkey stock. Make the stock and thicken it with cornflour and freeze well ahead of time and then just add some turkey juices to the finished article, some salt and pepper and a squeeze of lemon juice to lift.

4. Roast potatoes are the icing on the cake for a roast dinner! Par-boil some nice golden peeled and halved spuds and beat them up in the saucepan until the edges are all fluffy. Toss in some fine semolina and roast as normal and your spuds will be lush. You can do the same for parsnips.

5. All the veg...... get a big jug and fill it with frequences and microwave..... sorry!..... shop bought frozen peas done in the microwave are the best! The rest of the veg all goes down the same way so can be cooked together the same way! Carrots, sprouts and leeks. Chop some diagonal pieces of peeled carrots and par boil them, then add in some little sprouts to par boil and lastly add some diagonally sliced pieces of leek. When all are a little tender, drain and then toss in browned butter with salt and pepper. Get a little golden and pop in a dish, cover in foil and put in the oven to cook through on Christmas Day.

6. Bread Sauce is THE BEST. No Turkey Christmas Dinner can be had without bread sauce and this is something you can do the day before and gently heat on the day.

3/4 pint of milk (semi or full fat)

1 medium onion chopped into large bits

5 cloves

sprinkle of nutmeg

big pinch of salt

8 peppercorns

1 very small clove of garlic lightly squished (optional)

1 large bay leaf (optional)

8 heaped tablespoons of fresh breadcrumbs (If a have a bit of a loaf that I don't want to use then I always crumb it and put it in the freezer for bread sauce, scotch eggs, fried fish, croquettes, thickening stews and loads of other things!)

1 tablespoon of double cream (you'll probably have some for the pudding so 1 tablespoon can be sacrificed for the bread sauce!)

Add all the ingredients apart from the breadcrumbs and cream to a pan and warm for 10 mins but don't boil.

When cool, put in fridge overnight to steep.

On Christmas morning remove all the bits, add the breadcrumbs and stir over a medium heat until it thickens. Add the cream and adjust the seasoning to suit.

Keep warm in a covered bowl and serve.

Last tip. When you have cooked your turkey. Turn it upside down so all the juices can run into the breast before you turn it right way up to carve.

Remember.... Christmas is about fun and family..... not slogging over a hot stove..... Remember when we couldn't meet, hug, share and love so just do all those things and be full of Christmas cheer X
