

Hello again everyone,

Well, what a summer so far; so different from last year's drought conditions. I only hope some of the water is ending up in our much depleted reservoirs.



Spirits have not been dampened however, at the marvellous summer events so far. My thanks and congratulations to all involved with putting on this year's Hatherleigh Festival: so much to enjoy over the long weekend for all tastes, and wonderful to be back in the square for the open air service on the Sunday.

Our summer Fete in our garden was a slightly damper affair and due to the high winds we had to cancel the bouncy castle but the day provided and enjoyable chance for friends to meet up and enjoy the atmosphere again. Thanks to everyone who supplied cakes, teas, books, beer and cider and the BBQ.

My big announcement this month is that the long awaited work on St. John's church is now scheduled to begin at the end of August when scaffolding should appear around the tower. After the abseil event which so many of you participated in, we have been awarded a grant just over £245,000 by the Heritage Lottery Fund enabling the largest of the jobs in hand; the restoration of the tower, to proceed. Many thanks to the folks who administer the fund, and especially to Marian Southwick who has tirelessly pursued funding from many sources to see this work achieved.

We're expecting the scaffold to take a month to erect followed by stone works through till Christmas with a break then as lime work cannot be done in freezing temperatures, and all being well, re-starting in March to complete by the end of April, although it's hard to be sure with a project of this size.

While all this is happening, the replacement of the bell frame should also be going on to coincide with the tower work, hoping that the bells will be out of action for as short a time as possible. Please see Isabella's piece elsewhere in the pump for more details of the bell work.

So once again, my thanks to all who have supported getting this off the ground; we would not have got this far without you!



The Night Sky August 2023

There are 2 supermoons in August. One is on August 1st and the second is on August 31st. When you get two full moons in a single month the second one is known as a Blue Moon.

On the night of August 12-13th is the Perseid meteor shower. The maximum hourly rate is around 60 meteors per Aoux. The moon is at a crescent phase so skies will be fairly dark and you should see a lot of shooting stars.

New Moon is on the 16th of August. It is at this time that deep sky objects like galaxies and nebulae are at their best. This is because the bright moon is out of the way.



We have exciting news. After over three years of planning (we started just before lockdown) and 18 months of fundraising, we now have a timetable for our project. A fortnight ago we received formal paperwork from the Diocese which gives us permission to remove the bells from the tower and proceed with the restoration work.

Our eight bells will be lowered from the tower in early October 2023 and taken to the Somerset workshops of our bellhanger, Matthew Higby and Co. The old 1883 oak bell frame, in which the bells are currently set, will also be dismantled and removed. Higby and Co. will make a new steel frame which will house the bells when they return to the tower. The bells do not need to be recast, but some refurbishing will take place and new fittings supplied for them. Ringing will eventually restart on a higher floor: we currently ring from the ground floor.

The bellringers have been fundraising separately from the church, who have their own plans for repairs and improvements both in and outside the building, and these include the tower. The scaffolding for the tower will go up in late August so that stonemasons can get to work on repointing and repairing the structure.

We currently anticipate that the bells will be back and ring again by October 2024. We need to wait until tower work is complete and the repointing has had time to set properly through next summer.

Realising this project would not be possible without the hard work of the ringers, the co-operation and efforts of Rev. Leigh and the PCC, and the generosity of all our donors and grant-funding bodies. Thanks to everyone who has helped get us this far.

Our deposit for the bells project was paid to the bellhanger last year but we still have a considerable amount to raise – we estimate £25,000 will be required to finish the job. So we will continue to apply for grants, welcome new donations and organise events. Our next fundraiser, a ringing competition, will be on August 12th and is a chance for visiting ringers to come to Hatherleigh and ring our bells for a final time before they are lowered for the restoration and rehang. As our bells are well-known for their quality and fine tone, we hope for good attendance.

Bellringing Competition

The competition will take place on Saturday August 12th and the bells will ring through the afternoon, from approximately 3 pm until around 7.40 pm. The ringers will be preparing a 'Ringers' Tea' to raise additional funds for our project, and Hatherleigh residents are warmly welcome to join the ringers at Old Schools in the afternoon for tea, cakes and bakes.

We need your help to protect our Rivers

Would you like to have fun catching and identifying waterborne invertebrates to help monitor the health of our local river at Hatherleigh? You only need to spot 6 main species, they are called indicator species and the health of their population can tell scientists all they need to know to help them protect the water quality of our rivers. It only takes an hour once a month, the survey site for Hatherleigh only needs surveying from April through to and including September. This is a nationwide voluntary project where your data helps the experts conserve the habitat for many other creatures that rely on the river for their survival. Your observations will give the scientists an early warning if there has been a serious pollution incident or if any of the invasive species like killer shrimp are decimating our native species. This is great fun for all ages and could be a great family project and it is interesting to observe the changes through the seasons. Our current Hatherleigh volunteer surveyor is stepping down after 6 years. It is vital that we can continue to collect the data to help wildlife cope through the changes in the weather patterns we are all facing.

Save Seeds and Save Money!

Sometimes, it may seem that all plants want to do in your garden is what you don't want them to do; they want to either get frosted, die by various other means, take over, go over too quickly, get blown over, drown and rot off or get eaten and enjoyed by ever pest or vermin known to man before you get even a moment's pleasure from them!

With the price of seeds and plants from garden centres now becoming so costly, it can really knock you in the pocket and



with the paltry amount of seeds in some packets that $\cot \pm 3 - \pm 4$ (and then they fail to germinate) it can be an expensive pain. However, the goal of every plant is ultimately, if it's successful, to propagate itself for the next generation by means of seed and from now to the end of the season, it's your opportunity to cash in on that and save your own seed in copious quantities.

I realise that many seasoned gardeners out there are already doing this and have done it for years. I don't want to teach grandmas to suck eggs but if you are new to this gardening thing then here are a few tips and ideas. If you are looking at collecting your own flower seed then you want to do it on a dry day and when the seed heads are already opening and seeds starting to come out. Collecting seeds too early when they are still green will mean they probably will rot or will not be viable.

I collect my seeds or seed heads in old mushroom punnets and let them dry out further in the greenhouse or on a sunny window ledge. Obviously make sure you label them. When they are completely dried out sort the seeds from the pods and other debris. I store and label my seeds in those little brown envelopes you use to get your cash wages in (remember that!?) and then I just store them in a cool dry place until I are ready to plant.

There are plenty of garden favourites that produce copious amounts of seed such as Sweet Pea, Cosmos, Nasturtium, French Marigold, Pot Marigold, Poppy, Pinks, Cornflower, Snapdragon, Pansy and Lavender to name just a few; these are all easy to collect, save and germinate. Some others are a bit more fiddly or need special treatment. Astrantia, Scabious, Mecanopsis all need to be stored in the fridge for 3 months or they won't germinate without that cold snap.

There's always plenty of info on the internet about germinating certain seeds but If you are at Hatherleigh Market anytime and you want some free advice about saving seed and other types of propagation for your flower border or allotment then do come and have a chat with me. I don't know everything but what I do know, I'm happy to share.


