

The Night Sky July 2023

Nights in July are very short and days long. However there is still a lot to see! July 3rd will see a supermoon. The moon will look slightly bigger than normal and it will be a truly full Moon. We only get up to 3 true full moons in a year. This is when the Moon is illuminated 100% by the Sun. This is equivalent to midday on the Moon!

July the 1st will see a conjunction of Venus and Mars. The planets will look close together in the early morning sky but their true distance from each other will still be very great.

July 17th is the time of the New Moon and this is the best time to see the fainter deep sky objects like galaxies and nebulae.





How Are Your Toms Doing?

I know quite a few people who are growing tomatoes for the first time this year. Growing all salad and veg is a bit of a "suck it and see "exercise but if you can grow your own, especially tomatoes, then the flavour is just out of this world compared to cold stored shop bought ones. There is nothing like the first tomato, straight off your own vine that you have nurtured and loved! Pick it off, wipe it on your T-shirt and shove it in your mouth before anyone else sees!



So, what do you need to be doing to ensure healthy plants and a good crop? I'm only looking at vine, not bush tomatoes as that's all I grow but some tips still apply. Make sure your plants are tied in to canes or sticks

Feed and water regularly; that's watering twice daily with a tiny splash of feed each time. If you feed according to instructions on tomato feed then you use a lot of feed and wash it out of the soil between feeds so a little splash in the water every time; much less than what is said on the label, is the way to go.

Tomato roots are shallow and spread out so water round the plant, not the stem and never water the leaves or fruit as this can result in mildew or mould. Erratic watering can cause the fruits to not form, drop off or split so if you forget one day, better to just resume your regime, rather than chucking bucket of water on to make up for your mistake!

Pinch off any growth between the joints of the leaves so there's just one growth stem and let your plant make 6 - 7 trusses of fruit if it is in an grow bag or bed but only 5 -6 in a pot. Cut the top of the plant off when you have reached the correct number. If you just let it do it's own thing then you will have undersized tomatoes and short trusses so let the plant know who's boss! Stroke the flowers with your hand or shake the plant to help with pollination; this isn't crucial but it certainly does help.

Cut off any leaf branches below the first fully formed truss and cut off any suckers. When the first truss is properly formed then start cutting off further leaf branches. Lower leaves are just extra vegetation for bug infestation!

Keep a look out for any white fly, green fly, red spider mites on top and under the leaves. However small and innocuous an insect looks... Kill it before it sucks the life out of your tomato plant! White fly and spider mites are sap suckers and will do a hell of a lot of damage and reduce your crop. Conversely encourage hover flies, ladybirds and spiders as they will all eat your bugs!.... so basically, get to know your bugs!

I know it sounds all really complicated and such hard work but once you get the idea then home grown tomatoes will be the delight of your gardening life!

St. Thomas of Canterbury, Northlew

In 1170 the Archbishop Thomas Beckett was brutally murdered in Canterbury Cathedral. He was a popular cleric who had worked with King Henry II. He was a righteous priest and demanded fair dealings for the common people, especially over taxation. King Henry got more and more agitated when his old friend overruled his views on fair treatment for the ordinary citizen. One evening he was heard to mutter 'who will rid me of this turbulent priest?' Unfortunately, a nearby group of Knights also heard this casual remark. They had a hasty discussion, deciding that they were the right blokes to dispose of the poor Archbishop. Four of them rode in haste to the Cathedral and hammered on the massive door to gain entrance. A priest tried to warn the Archbishop, to give him time to escape. But he didn't. He decided to stop with his people and fight the King for justice for them. The Knights did their job well and Thomas lay dying in a pool of blood to the horror and grief of the people who had rushed to the scene.

King Henry was stricken with remorse when he realised what his careless remark had done. He travelled the length and breadth of the country doing penance. It is commonly supposed that he had no intention of such an end to the life of his friend the Archbishop. Three years after his death Beckett was canonised and his example of fairness and justice has guided generation after generation. Very many churches are dedicated to Thomas Beckett, including our own. This year our Patronal Festival will be on July 1st.
