Hello again,

As I write, work has just begun on the stonework of Hatherleigh's church tower. This apparent 'beginning' is the result of years of hard work behind the scenes, planning and fundraising by our committed group of vol-



unteers. So here's the headline; no people, no church! At present, three of my five churches are in the process of building works to preserve them for future generations. This all takes some serious commitment on the part of those who love them; there is no assistance from outside.

As we head into the season of remembrance, rapidly followed by Christmas, we enter a time when many people come to church for a couple of 'one-off' visits they make, and it is our delight to welcome you all. Sadly, for many churches, particularly in Devon, this is not a situation that can continue. When I last read the figures, some 400 of Devon's 600 or so parish churches have congregations of six or less, mostly averaging 80 + in age. Of course in our rural places where population is thin, not much more could be expected, but there is more to this at the present time.

After the enforced isolation and closure of churches during the Covid lockdowns, many people who had previously been church regulars have simply given up the habit and not returned. On-line services and resources have been discovered by many, and 'church on the sofa' in front of a screen has replaced meeting together. In truth, this is no substitute for the real thing; real relationships, real worship, real commitment from those who believe in Jesus Christ and his saving message for humanity and the world.

For me, the buildings are not the main thing, but 'being' the 'body of Christ' in the midst of our communities is all important. So, my invitation today is to all of you who have a faith, but for one reason or another have given up being a part of your local church: please come back! We need you, as brothers and sisters, fellow children of our one Heavenly Father, we are not whole without you, and our effectiveness is lessened by your absence.

Now, we've all been fed up with church from time to time [myself included] with many a good reason for departing. But we don't fix a broken thing by walking away, rather by picking it up and fixing it. Church isn't a thing we do, or go to, but it is who we are. So dear readers, be yourselves and return. Many of you will be dropping in for Remembrance Day or Christmas services; if it does you good then, the chances are it will do you good on other days too, so why not give it a whirl? I'll be looking out for you to give you a welcome,

Nights in November can be cold and dark. It's a perfect time of year for star gazing. One of the main events of the month is the opposition of Jupiter. It will be at its closest point to Earth for the year. It will be visible all night long. The night of opposition is early in the morning of the 3rd November. It will be bright for some time to come. In a pair of good quality binoculars you can make out the four brightest moons. Io, Europa, Ganeymede and Callisto. The planet will be low in the eastern sky in the evening.

Bob Southwick has tended his resignation due to health issues and we wish to thank him and wish him well

We therefore have 2 Councillor vacancies. If you're interested in becoming a Town Councillor please contact the clerk for details.

We are still awaiting news from Devon CC Highways Department about a 20mph zone through Town. If you would like to join a speed watch group please put your name forward. We only have 2 volunteers at present.

Having been repaired the Bus shelter is still awaiting painting. It was suggested that anti-graffiti paint be purchased and used to maintain the appearance.

HTC would like to thank the Moor Management Committee for their very generous donation of £2000 for the Town Christmas lights.

A HTC bench has been found for Jubilee Footpath although this is not the original bench. Mr & Mrs Sutton are still happy to instal this bench for us at that site and we wish to thank them.

Following our letter to the Hatherleigh GP Practice listing patients concerns we have received a response. The concerns have been passed to the newly appointed Practice Manager. We will inform residents when we have further responses.

Hatherleigh Market: Again negotiations to secure the Market for the people of Hatherleigh are still taking place. This is so important to our Town's future that all due diligence and consultations need to take place and this means the process is a slow one. The Market Working Group have another meeting scheduled for this month. As soon as we have more information it will be posted on the Hatherleigh Town Council website.

Rhino Play made a site to the Toddler Park and Island Park and a scheme of works to be completed has been agreed. This includes a new zip wire, new gates for the toddler park and new benches. These will be appearing shortly as the works are completed.

Councillors inspected Millennium Corner to agree what work should be done to improve the space and make it safe. Some flags were lifted as they were a trip hazard. It was agreed to form a working party to trim and tidy the planting and to lift the uneven paving and bed onto sand where possible to make an even surface.

The relevant Road Closures have been put in place for the Remembrance Day Parade through Town to the Church and HTC look forward to this event.

Dog fouling continues to affect areas of the Moor and we ask all dog owners to please clean up after their pets. To this end we will again ask WDBC for a poo bin on the Moor. They have previously stated that they have no capacity to provide and empty more bins but we can only keep asking.

Due to unexpected high costs Hatherleigh Visitor & Information Centre will run out of funds by the end of the year. A very dedicated group of Volunteers have kept it going for 18 months since the death of Charles Dumpleton. It has enabled local artists and crafters to display and sell their art, and provides information for residents and visitors. Do residents feel there is a need for an information centre in Town? Do have your say.

It's the time of the year when you want something comforting and luscious so why not give muffins a go.

Muffins

So easy to make, you don't even have to light the oven and filling them with a nice fresh poached egg, a dollop of Hollandaise sauce and a couple of pieces of really good bacon or ham is brilliant or go posh and have some smoked salmon.

To make 12 muffins that freeze really well you will need:

250ml milk +250ml hot water, 1 tsp yeast, 1 tsp sugar, 60g of butter or cooking marg, 750g of flour (half and half strong bread flour and plain flour), 1 tsp salt, 2 tbsp of fine polenta for dusting (optional but gives them a nice crunch)

If you have a bread maker then shove everything in on a dough setting but if not then combine the milk, water, yeast and sugar and let the yeast bubble in it for 10 mins and then put in the very soft butter/marg, salt and flour and knead, rest and rise as for bread. NB your bread maker may only take half the load so check your instructions.

When the dough is risen then splat or roll it out to an inch thick and cut out muffins with a circular pastry cutter.

Drench the muffin shapes in Polenta (or flour) and leave to rise for about 30 mins somewhere warm.

Heat a dry frying pan or griddle to a medium high heat and cook your muffins. They usually take about 5 mins per side but keep an eye on the first lot and how they are browning off on the bottom..... you may need adjust the heat or turn them over sooner and then turn them back again but if they have about 10 mins in total then they will be crispy on the outside and light and fluffy in the middle.

When you have lightly grilled, griddled or fried your bacon in the same pan then just toast the inside of the split crumpet a little in the same pan or grill, layer your bacon, your poached egg and your sauce, maybe a sprinkle of chopped parsley and black pepper and put the top on and be ready for the squidge when your egg oooooooozes out!

Disclaimer: I cannot be held responsible for the dribble down your chin or on your lap...... have a serviette or a bit of "posh" kitchen towel at the ready!

Crumpets

175g Strong white flour

175g Plain white flour

2 tsp yeast

1 tsp sugar

350ml warm milk

150-200ml warm water (not to be added all at once)

1 1/2 tsp bicarbonate of soda

1 tsp salt

a very little oil to smear the pan with

Dissolve the sugar in the warm milk and add a couple of tbsp of the flour and the yeast. Beat the mixture, cover and leave to stand in a warm place for an hour.

Add some of the warm water, the bicarb and salt to the mix and the rest of the flour and beat. You need to achieve a thick double cream consistency so you will have to judge if 150ml or 200ml is right.

When you think you have the right thickness after after giving a really good beat, cover and rest for another 20 mins. Lightly grease a heavy bottomed frying pan and some rings (my pan fits three rings or metal pastry cutters will do) and place over a medium heat and let the pan get to the right heat.

Drop a serving spoon full of mixture into each ring. Cook for 4 mins on the first side and then, using a spatula, flip the ring and crumpet and do for a further 3 mins on the other side.

This amount of batter will make "a goodly few" crumpets and you will have to see how many by the size of your ring but after the first batch you will have the measure of it.

With homemade crumpets you may not get as many air bubbles as the bought as we don't have a machine that pumps air into the batter filled rings before they get cooked but on the plus side they are much lighter and less chewy with no preservatives so you will have to decide if homemade wins out over Mr Warburton!

Both muffins and crumpets freeze well so once you get the knack of making them you can shove some in the freezer for another day.

On Sunday 5 November we'll be holding our




