

#### Hello again,

It is our failure to distribute fairly, our greed in taking more than we need and the wastage of our excess that causes the problem, even in difficult years. Harvest is a chance for each of us to look to ourselves; our attitudes towards consumption and generosity, and to help to make the world work more fairly for all.

Personally I would also like to thank everyone in these parishes who works so hard on the land, often in lonely and challenging circumstances, to draw from the ground the essentials we all need to live.



Notes from the Council Meeting held on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> September 2023. The next council meeting will be held on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> October 2023 at 7pm. For more information see our website www.hatherleightowncouncil.org/

Your 9 Councillors are Mark Reddaway (Chair/Mayor), Rachel Laycock (Deputy), Deb Laing-Trengove, Kay Walters, Donna Lewis, Callum Entwhistle, Graham Alford, Bob Southwick, Richard Burrow.

Sadie Harrison attended the meeting having expressed an interest to join HTC and was duly voted on as a Councillor.

Callum Entwhistle has now tended his resignation so we still have one Councillor vacancy. If you're interested in becoming a Town Councillor please contact the clerk for details.

During the Public Session Jenny Sutton asked if she and her husband Glyn could repair and re-site the bench that was on Jubilee footpath at their own expense. This was welcomed with gratitude by Councillors.

We have not received any offers of help to take over from Caroline Munn to continue her work raising funds and ensuring the Town defibrillators are maintained in good order. If any one is interested in taking this on please get in touch with HTC. We were very grateful to receive a generous cheque for £1000 from the Moor Management Committee to purchase a new defibrillator.

We are still awaiting a response from Devon CC Highways Department concerning our request for a 20mph zone through Town. We will continue to request further updates.

The Bus shelter has been repaired by Mr Alan Cranleigh. Painting and further works will be completed by Volunteers. Any ideas or offers of help would be most welcome.

Hatherleigh Market: The working group have had another meeting again attended by Officers from WDBC. We have now received the lease/purchase agreement from Kingswood Homes. This is now with HTC solicitors. It is still very early in the negotiation process to secure the Market for the people of Hatherleigh. As soon as we have more information public consultations will be held. As space is short here, a full explanation of the current position can be found on the Hatherleigh Town Council website. A printed copy will be available from the Information Centre in due course.

We have received a £5,500 grant from the Lottery Fund for the toddler park and £10,000 for Island Park. This will be used to replace the Zip Wire. Rhino Play will be making a site visit this week to finalise what is required. With grateful thanks to Donna Lewis and Adam Hill for their continued hard work.

Work is still required to Millennium Corner. Councillors have agreed to visit the site on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> September at 11am to agree a plan of works to make the most of this space.

The Community Orchard has received a grant of  $\pm$ 700 from Devon Wildlife Trust. This will be used to plant more trees and protect them with fences.

The railings outside of the post office need to be painted, this will be done by volunteers after we check with Devon Highways about permissible colour and safety considerations.

HTC have been approached by many residents with concerns over the lack of access to medical care provided by Hatherleigh Medical Centre. Whilst this is not within our remit we will write to the Practice and the Integrated Care Board to highlight the issues on Residents behalf.

Space is short here. A full account of meetings is available in the minutes on the Town Council website and notice board in Millennium Corner.

## The Night Sky October 2023

Nights are noticeably longer now that we have moved into October. They are often cooler and clearer too. New Moon Falls on October 14th. Faint celestial objects like galaxies and nebulae are best observed at this time. The bright moon light will not interfere with them. On Oct 20-21st we can observe the Orionid meteor shower. If you trace the tail of a meteor back through the sky they will appear to originate in the constellation of Orion. You should see some good shooting stars but there will be a half Moon in the sky. The hours of 11pm-4am are best when observing a meteor shower. This is because the night side of the Earth turns into the oncoming meteor stream.

On 28th October we can see a partial lunar eclipse. The Earth's shadow will just take a nibble out of southern part of the Moon. This time of greatest eclipse will happen between 20:35BST-21:53BST. The whole event begins at 19:02BST and ends at 23:26BST. Only 6% of the lunar surface will be covered by Earth's shadow. It is also the night of the full Moon.



What a wonderful turn out of people we had that came to view the `Pop-up-Museum on the weekend of the 16th-17th September in Old Schools, the first to be held since 1890! Some visitors even came on both days.

We were so lucky that people contacted us with regard to family items to exhibit, as well as things that had been rescued in the past from skips and fires and finds from on the Moor and things made in Hatherleigh bought from auctions. Some families had rare items that had been passed down and preserved, in fact there were one or two things that were listed in the original Pop-Up of 1890. Our own collections of documents, photos, old postcards and donated scrapbooks proved very popular and kept people reading even past our closing time, such was the interest!

It surprised many that Hatherleigh had so many shops selling just about everything that was needed, the townsfolk really were self sufficient right up to the early1960's as many of the documents and items on show stated and there were stories too of the fact that grandparents hardly ventured further than Okehampton and that was only for a special occasion! The workmanship of some of the trades like the clock makers, harness makers and masons were exceptional and it was no wonder they were sort after for their skills from far and wide.

We have to thank the people who came and helped set up and take down the displays on the Friday and Monday, and to those who loaned us their own items for showing, it was four very tiring but worthwhile days.

My Great Gran Rosa's Piccalilli Recipe

My Great Gran, my Gran, my Mum and now me!..... we've all made this recipe..... the only thing I have added is a bit of fresh ginger and some fresh green chilli. Probably each generation has added or changed a little something to suit.



This recipe makes 8lbs and is a great way to use all sorts of produce from the greenhouse and allotment. Yes, you can make green tomato chutney and runner bean chutney but Piccalilli has always been my favourite, especially with cold meat / sausages and bubble and squeak.

All together you need 6lbs of mixed veg of roughly equal quantity but you can adjust the recipe according to what you like more of: runner beans, cauliflower, green tomatoes, courgette or baby marrow, cucumber and onion. I have added kohlrabi, a little bulb fennel and some green and yellow peppers to make up the quantity sometimes.

Chop the veg into chunks (smaller or larger depending on what you like) Put in a big bucket or bowl and salt in layers and leave overnight or up to 48 hours. On the same day you do the salting make a sauce from:

6oz granulated sugar, 1oz turmeric (it's funny, turmeric was in the original recipe but that's not something you would think was around in the 1890's), 1oz ground ginger, 2 inch piece of fresh grated ginger (optional), 3 large mild green chillis (optional), 1oz dried mustard, handful of mustard seeds, 2 pints of white vinegar, gently heat this and leave overnight or for up to 48 hours too., When you are ready to make the Piccalilli, thoroughly rinse and drain the veg (don't forget this bit or you'll be drinking water for days!!!)

Sterilize enough clean jars in the oven 180 degrees for 5 mins and leave to keep warm. Put all the veg in a Maslin pan with the sauce. Heat gently to start and then up the temperature, finally bring to the boil and simmer for 10-15 mins (stir regularly). Add 1 and a half ounces of plain flour mixed into enough vinegar to make it runny (don't just add the dry flour to the mix).

Bring back to the boil, simmer for a further 3-5 mins, stirring all the time until all the veg is just tender and the sauce has thickened up.

Pack into your hot jars and wiggle a knife or skewer around to release any air pockets, leaving a little head room. Tightly lid the jars and as they cool a vacuum seal will be created meaning your Piccalilli will store well. Leave at least 3-4 weeks before eating but 6-8 weeks is better. I don't know quite how long it would last but it's always kept up to 2 years. Let's put it this way.... it's never gone off but we've just always eaten it by the 2 year mark however big a batch I make!

### The History Group

The latest meeting was held on Tuesday September 19 in Exbourne village hall. The speaker was Margaret Weeks who spoke about Devon Dialect - a Dying Language. She read pieces that she had written herself as well as pieces written by well known dialect writers, She also talked about many dialect words, their meanings and the length of times they had been used by Devonians. She was thanked by Sue Rose. The next meeting is on Tuesday October 17. The speaker will be Rev Leigh Winsbury who will talk about Hatherleigh's Vicar Uncovered. He was a biker in East London in his teens. Then he met up with three Christian biker evangelists and the rest is history. Visitors welcome £3 to include tea and biscuits. There was no meeting in August, but members visited The Old Mill at Jacobstowe (by kind of invitation of Linda and Kevin Talmage) and had a tour of the old mill and its workings. This was followed by Cream Tea in the beautiful garden.

This summer we have been busy fund raising with a series of local events. The Flower Festival to mark the King's Coronation in May was followed by a Service and tea at Ashbury Church in early June, then a Midsummer safari supper where guests moved between homes in the village for different courses. Our Patronal Festival and Fete in July with its re-enactment of the murder of Thomas a Becket (and famous Northlew tea) attracted lots of visitors. The summer was rounded off with a picnic in the churchyard to support Devon Historic Churches Trust and a Ploughman's Lunch in the Church Rooms. Fund-raising efforts so far have been focussed on the conservation of our much-loved Henry Willis St Cecilia Scudamore pipe organ which was built way back in 1859 for King's College Hospital Chapel and thirty years later installed in Northlew. Not surprisingly it's in need of some serious TLC to restore it to its former glory. The organ will be moved off site this autumn for work to the instrument itself and its paintwork. We await its return with keen anticipation – hoping it will keep us all in tune for the next few decades! Now we move on to raising funds for repairs to the church tower and roof – so watch this space.
