St John's Church Building Repairs & Digital Heritage Project Update

Following the amazing news that we have been successful in our bid for **£245,000** in grant funding from **Heritage National Lottery**, we are now starting a program of works. This work is for the essential maintenance to the stone work on the tower, improved disability access to the building, and a digital heritage project to record and preserve the heritage of St John's Church and make it available via an online heritage hub for generations to come. Keep an eye out for further progress updates throughout the year in the Parish Pump, on our website (www.stjohnshatherleigh.uk), and on our Facebook page.



BUILDING REPAIRS AND MODERNISATION WORK : Look out for scaffolding going up around the tower from the end of August as work to re-point the stonework on the tower in lime mortar gets underway. Fractured and deteriorating stone will be repaired and consolidated using current conservation techniques.

To coincide with the work on the tower a new floor will be put down in the clock room and the clock face will be repainted whilst the scaffolding is in place. While this work is going on the bell ringers are looking to take the bells down through the tower in October for important maintenance work and re-framing with metal frames.

Alongside this work will be disability access adaptations to the church - the north entrance will have a new, slightly larger ramp with a rail down the side to improve wheelchair access. Two pews at the back will have to be removed to provide the extra space needed. The south entrance will have better lighting and the upper part of the entrance door and side panel will be glazed to enable people to see the other side. Ornate grab rails will be beside each step, in keeping with the fabric of the church. A metal rail will be fixed to the granite up one side of the front path.

INTERACTIVE 3D VIRTUAL TOUR: As part of the digital heritage project, we will be creating a 3D virtual tour of St John's Church, with interactive 'hot spots' that when clicked will display more detailed information on the notable areas of the church.

AN AUDIO GUIDED TOUR : We will create an audio guided tour, to guide visitors round the church and graveyard pointing out noteworthy features and providing interesting insights into the history of St John's.

'LOCAL VOICES' - ORAL HISTORY RECORDINGS : Working with local volunteers we will research and record a series of oral histories from 'local voices' explaining the heritage, history and features of St John's Church and how it has been connected to the lives of the people of Hatherleigh through the years.

AN ONLINE HERITAGE HUB : We will be creating an online heritage hub on the St John's Church website where all the new material being generated from the heritage project will be archived.

QR CODE INFORMATION POINTS : We will be adding QR code information point signs inside and outside the church where visitors will be able to scan a QR code with their smart-phone to see more detailed information about points of interest.

PRIMARY SCHOOL LESSON PLANS: We're partnering up with Hatherleigh Primary School to develop a series of lessons to bring to life the heritage of St John's Church for a younger audience.

FUTURE PLANS FOR THE CHURCH : Funding still needs to be raised to provide a kitchenette and a toilet in the church to improve facilities and we're actively fundraising for this. We also plan to implement a permanent exhibition in the church detailing the conservation activities caried out following the 1990 storm damage and how the building has changed and been adapted throughout the years.

Nights start to get longer in September. The constellations of Autumn are now visible in the night sky.

New Moon falls on the 15th of the month.

On September 23rd the Autumnal equinox takes place. It marks the first day of Autumn in the northern hemisphere. The Sun will be right over the equator. The length of day and night will be roughly equal.

On September 29th there will be a supermoon. It is also the night of the full moon. The Moon will look slightly larger and brighter than normal. It is the last super moon of the year.

Greek Style Leftover Beef With Orzo

I bought a humungous great beef roasting joint because it was good value and when I'd dome the traditional roast, the remainder of the cooked beef I used for this great Greek one pot dish. Lots of Greek dishes are one pot or one tray. I saw on a website that "in olden days people didn't have ovens so they use to take a tray down to the baker and he would put it in his oven for a few Drachma." I remember doing that when I lived in Greece and I'm not that bloomin old for it to be counted as only done in "the olden days"!

You will need:

Whatever leftover beef you have left in large chunks as it will end up like "pulled beef".

3 large onions sliced and gently fried off in olive oil in your dish or pan.

Orzo / Kritheraki pasta (a pack or half a pack dependant on how much beef you have)

2 tins of chopped tomatoes or equivalent fresh

3 tablespoons of tomato paste or your own paste

1 heap teaspoon of sugar

1 large glass of red wine

1 stick of celery and 1 carrot finely chopped

1 teaspoon of cinnamon

Salt and pepper to taste



Lots of grated Parmesan to top (in place of the Greek Kefalotyri cheese)

After frying the onions in the pan, turn up the heat and pour in the red wine to let it boil.

Add the tomato paste, tomato, sugar, cinnamon, salt and pepper, celery and carrot

Pour in the Orzo pasta and stir to let it coat

Drizzle a little olive oil and place thew pieces of beef

Cover and cook in the pre-heated oven at 180 degrees for 30 mins. Check the pasta is cooked. If it's not quite done add a little boiling water and give it a few more minutes.

Remove the lid or foil and sprinkle with Parmesan and bake for a further 10-15 mins until crispy on top

If you're a grower then you've probably tried Butternut Squash. Out of all the squashes they are the firmest, sweetest and most versatile but they can be a bit hit and miss. I usually grow 3 plants and some years I've ended up with only 3 squashes but one year I had about 24! Although the squashes keep very well in a cool room if they are not damaged at all, you may be looking for some recipe alternatives if you do end up with loads!



3 of our favourite things are Butternut Squash Laksa and Butternut Squash Spicy Croquets and Butternut Squash and Chorizo filled pasta.... obviously I experimented with these recipes when I was landed with the 24 huge squash!

Butternut Squash Laksa

Blanche your cubes of peeled squash. Don't cook them too much or they will fall apart. Drain and cool.

Toss the cubes in honey, a good sprinkle of five spice powder, a sprinkle of chilli powder, a little salt and pepper and some sesame seeds. You will put these under the grill on an oiled tray or foil to colour and cook properly just before the rest of the meal is ready.

In a blender make a laksa paste of:

4 garlic cloves,

a fat thumb of ginger

as much chilli as you want (either fresh or dried)

1 tsp turmeric

a huge tablespoon of smooth peanut butter

juice of 1 -2 limes

1 tablespoon each of sesame oil, light soy sauce, Thai fish sauce

A bunch of spring onion, an onion or even leek plus a giant handful whatever suitable herbs you have, coriander and some basil but a little dill and lemongrass.

Mix your paste with chicken or veg stock and water to make up a litre. Cook and simmer and then chuck in whatever veg you have to hand, cut into appropriate pieces. You can use onion, mushroom, sugar snap, beans.... Use whatever looks good and you think fits with the dish. While you are doing this, grill your honey sesame squash and boil some flat rice noodles. when everything is ready, chuck it all in a bowl with a squeeze of lime and some fresh coriander.
