Hello everyone, and a happy Easter to you!

For Christians, this is when we celebrate the very heart of our faith and the amazing things that happened first time around.



Although some ancient prophets had raised people from the dead, as did Jesus, no one before or since has ever managed to bring themselves back from the dead under their own power alone. That death no longer has any permanent hold on us is the delight and hope of Christians everywhere. And to add to our encouragement, a week before his own trial, death and resurrection, Jesus brought his friend Lazarus out of the grave; demonstrating that his power of life was for ordinary people like us too, not just a miracle he could work for himself.

The night before his trial, however, Jesus was to be found celebrating Passover with his disciples. What we now call 'the last supper', has a history all of its own. This was, and still is, the annual 'freedom feast' of the Jews, remembering the time when Moses led the Israelites [or Hebrews] out of slavery in Egypt 1500 years earlier. God had told Moses that they should paint the blood of a lamb on their doorframes as a sign for the judgment on Egypt to 'pass over' their homes; giving the feast its name. They then made a hurried meal of bread without yeast and set out from Egypt immediately.

1500 years on, Jesus took those same symbols of deliverance and explained how they looked forward in time as well as backwards, and had been prophetic pictures all along, of what he would do. The unleavened bread; his body, without sin, broken for us, the wine of freedom; his blood shed, and the sacrificial lamb; himself, the 'lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world, slain for us.

The Hebrews sheltered from judgement under the blood of lambs on a door beam ; we shelter under the shed blood of Jesus, smeared on the beams of a cross. And the freedom Jesus bought for us isn't from slavery to another nation, but from the slavery of our own brokenness, fears and indeed death itself! It is these things we still remember today in the bread and wine of Holy Communion.

Both the parish church and the Methodists are holding a 'Passover' this year, on the Wednesday before Easter. At first I thought we should probably combine these, but with expected numbers, it's probably good that there will be a bit more room for people wanting to share the experience; do ask either church about remaining spaces.

Something to celebrate? Break out an egg!

Hatherleigh Town Council Precept Rise 2023/24 The Town Council has had to make the difficult decision to raise the precept this year after 3 years of keeping it the same level of £25,000. We are fully aware this won't be a popular decision in the current financial climate but your Town Council is in the same position of facing rising costs for the services it provides. We receive no other financial support and to ensure we can continue to support local facilities, local projects and pay for essential services we are asking for a small annual rise per household to cover bringing our precept level up to £35,000. For a Band D property this will be a household rise from £41.11 to £53.11. An annual rise of £12.00. Our costs have to cover maintenance and services for: Public toilets Island park/toddler park Bus shelters Street care Emptying of bins Ground maintenance (eg flower beds, grass cutting) Clerk/Insurances/website Millennium Corner Christmas lights Our main financial support last year was to help the Visitor Centre which we intend to continue this year, this being an important hub for the town. Also we hope to continue offering small contributions to help groups benefitting residents as we've done in the past eg community transport and local events. For the last 3 years we have been subsidising the Tuesday Market parking. When this began the Town Council believed this cost would only last 12-18 months. The decision has been made to cease this support to save this cost. Hatherleigh is comparably low in its precept level per household compared with other towns/villages and we are serving a growing population. Hatherleigh Town Councillors (a voluntary role) wish to continue providing the level of service we've been used to for the town rather than cutting back. We hope you understand the position we are in.

The March meeting was attended by Claire Birch a Community Safety Officer for WDBC. She gave a 10 minute talk about the 'Let's Talk' Program which aims to help parents and children deal with topics such as drugs, domestic violence, grooming and modern slavery. Work on the Hatherleigh website is complete and the site should be live very shortly. Visithatherleigh.co.uk

A Committee has been formed from all interested parties to co-ordinate the Town celebrations for the King's Coronation. The next meeting will be held on Monday 3rd April at 7.30pm in Old Schools. All welcome. HTC will provide Commemorative Gifts for Hatherleigh's children.

The Festival Committee have reformed under the Chairmanship of Stephen Carter and Callum Entwistle. The Festival will be a 3 day event in the Square on the 7-9th July. More information to follow. More information about all these events will appear in the Pump.

Jake Barrs has volunteered to be Hatherleigh Snow Warden and will undertake training under the Devon County Council scheme. A huge thank you to Jake.

This Council is investigating the idea of supporting two new working groups - Speed Watch and Neighbourhood Planning. If you would like to volunteer please get in touch.

We are still awaiting quotes for repairs to the bus shelter and are planning a refurbishment in the Spring. The bus companies have been contacted to try to get the bus timetables installed in the shelter.

We still await news from DCC Highways about the Priority Traffic Plan which includes a request for a 20mph speed limit through Town and Moor View.

The historic stone cross at the top of Park Road has been knocked or has fallen over. This is Grade Il listed and repairs to stand it back up will be carried out shortly.

Repairs have been made by WDBC to the damaged sections of wall in the Square.

The Community Orchard Team have met with Devon Wildlife Trust and are applying for funds to plant more trees and protect each with a guard. News of planned events will follow in the next few months.

The Footpaths continue to be inspected. Footpath 1 will shortly have it's stile replaced by a gate.

Reports of issues around Town can be made in person or by email and to the Visitor Centre where an HTC reporting book is held.

HATHERLEIGH GARDENING CLUB

Welcome to a new year of gardening! We started the year with an outing to the Snowdrop Festival at the Garden House, then our AGM followed, in March, by a talk on perennials which was well received. April sees us leaving the comforts of Old Schools again and heading out on the road, but not too far this time. On Friday April 21st, leaving Hatherleigh at about 2pm, we are off to 'Penny's Primulas' just outside Holsworthy. The nursery holds national collections of Primula Sieboldii and Epimediums as well as an interesting collection of ferns and other choice woodland plants. 

The Night Sky March 2023

Nights are now noticeably shorter. However there is still a lot to see in the night sky. April 6th is the night of the full he Moon's bright moon. At this time light will wash out the fainter deep sky objects

Around April 11th shortly after sunset you'll be able to spot the planet Mercury. It's the closest planet to the Sun.

April 20th is the night of the New Moon and it is at this time of the month that we can see the fainter deep sky objects like nebulae and galaxies.

April 22-23rd is the peak of the Lyrids meteor shower. The meteors appear to originate from the constellation of Lyra. You can look anywhere in the sky and you'll see meteors. The best time to observe is between 11pm-4am. It is at this time that the night side of the Earth faces into the oncoming meteor stream. The moon sets early so it should be a great meteor shower.







ITCHY FINGERS?

So many people have been asking for advice about growing their own so I thought I'd carry on my piece from last month for all you "newbie" growers. I've been very impressed by the people contacting me who have got their act together straight away and sourced pots and tubs from friends, farmers, auctions and tips. 3



people I've spoken to have managed to "acquire" greenhouses; 2 from elderly relatives who weren't using them anymore and 1 from a freecycling site..... we like free! April is a good month to start planting if you can do it in a greenhouse, conservatory or other frost free place because crops can take a long time to come through but if you don't have anywhere with a bit of shelter, not even a cold frame then don't let your itchy fingers get the better of you. We may have a warm spell in April - May and it's easy to think "let's get going!" only to find we have frosts in late May and all your little plants get damaged or killed.... heart-breaking! So, for April, if you have some kind of cover then start with a) some things you can get quick results from, b) some things that will take ages until you can harvest them and c) double croppers which are a winner because you can get so much from one plant.

a) All kinds of cut and come again lettuce varieties 4 - 6 weeks to first harvest Radish 5-6 weeks to first harvest. Early carrots 8 - 9 weeks to first harvest kept in tubs. Spring onions 8 - 9 weeks kept in tubs. Hardy fast growing herbs such as Dill and Coriander 6 - 8 weeks

b) Tomatoes 3 - 5 months depending on variety. Peppers and Chillis 4-6 months depending on variety. Such plants must be germinated in warmth and kept frost free. Leeks 5 months or more. Slow growing herbs such as Chives and Parsley over 3 months.

c) Beetroot. You can get usable roots after a couple of months but young leaves are great for salads and older leaves steamed for greens Headed Broccoli will take about 3 months to grow a good head but then you can leave the plant and it will produce baby heads and you can use the leaves as greens. There are some things that must NOT be started indoors for transplanting later. Root crops such as Carrots, Parsnip, Swede and bulb Fennel need to be planted where they are to crop so, there's no way round it, you are just going to have to keep your itchy fingers off those particular seed packets until all chance of frost is gone!

SPANAKOPITA

Greek Spinach and cheese parcels.... great for snacks, lunchbox or as a side for other Greek dishes.

If, like me you steam blanch and freeze any spinach you grow then it comes in very handy for recipes like this because you have to squeeze all the water out of any cooked spinach anyway or you'll just end up with a soggy mess. I squeeze and roll the spinach into balls about the size of a tennis ball and then freeze them and put them in a bag so when I want spinach I can get out as many balls as I need, give them a final squeeze, chop them through and off I go!

Ingredients for 12 parcels

2 packs of Lidl ready rolled puff pastry (traditionally Filo is used but Greeks also make them with their version of puff pastry..... you could make your own puff pastry but life REALLY is too short for that!) Lots of spinach leaves as they go down to nothing when cooked..... you will probably need a small carrier bag worth or if you have already blanched and frozen then 2 tennis balls!

1 1/2 blocks of Feta cheese crumbled up (the Lidl Greek Style Cheese is fine for this)

1/2 a tub of cream cheese (Lidl's!)

1 small onion (grated) (optional)

2 large beaten eggs (reserve a little for sealing and glazing)

A handful of herbs.... mostly dill and mint but you can also add in parsley, oregano, chives all finely chopped.

Lots of black pepper & go easy on the salt as the Feta is quite salty

Just a very little sprinkle of nutmeg

Mix all ingredients together in a bowl

Heat your oven to 180 degrees and oil 2 trays or cover them in the paper from your bought pastry.

Cut each pastry sheet into 6 squares

Plonk a good dollop of the filling in the middle of each parcel... usually best to do this with your hands so you can squidge it together better. Egg the edges so they will stick

and then fold over into a triangle and lightly sprinkle with flour so you can seal them without the thin pastry sticking to your fingers.

Arrange on the tray with a little gap between each, brush with egg and bake for about 25 - 30 mins.... make sure the oven is really hot and the filling is room temp or they will not puff up.



You can eat them hot or cold.

I am a member of the Exbourne Community Choir. Our wonderful Director of Music Pauline, without whom our choir would not exist, is retiring at the end of June.


