Well hello April,

That came fast, hot on the heels of the earliest Easter I can remember. So here we are on the far side of all the Easter



activity and celebrations; I do hope you managed to join in somewhere?

And what a celebration! Remembering what Jesus went through to set us free from sin, guilt and shame; buying us back from death with his own life, to give us back an eternity of peace and joy with him and proving it by rising from the dead!

Throughout the weeks of Lent, my churches have been journeying with the Israelite nation as they made their way through the wilderness after the miraculous escape from slavery in Egypt. (If you need reminding how this story goes take a look at the cartoon version 'Prince of Egypt'). We've been looking at the parallels between their journey and ours as we make our way through life. Here's the main thing; the big miracle has already happened; just as the Israelites escaped Egypt through the opening of the Red Sea, so we escape our doom through the opening of Jesus' arms on a cross. But that's just the beginning. The slaves had to learn what it meant to be a free people, able to rule their own land well and fruitfully, faithfully representing their good God to the nations around. Taking the slaves out of Egypt doesn't immediately take the Egypt out of the slaves, and they had to learn many lessons along the way. We have access to all the good things God has for us, but have we realised it? Do we live like it?

Learning how to live as a free, redeemed human in the good of God's love is what the journey of discipleship is all about. Only when we get a hold of this great adventure are we able to show others what God is like, and what a joy it is to be His.

Hatherleligh Lower Moor Pond

Thank you to the numerous volunteeers who turned out on a very wet March day to help with the Lower Moor pond work party. The pond now looks quite different. With willow and alder cut back from the edges to allow more sunlight across the water, it will improve the health of the pond and thus help the wildlife thrive, especially amphibians and invertebrates.



By clearing the scrub entiriely from one side of the pond a flight path across the water has been created for feeding swallows and bats.



Regular visitors to the pond may have noticed the sad absence of the breeding moorhens last year. It is hoped that a new pair may find their way to the pond, but in the mean time, we ask that dog owners keep their dogs out of the pond. Hatherleigh Lower Moor is a VERY popular dog walking area, with many dogs visiting this pond over the course of the day, everyday!

Did you know?

Disturbance to a pond by a dog churns up the bottom sediment, making the water murky and the wildlife value of the pond declines.



- Dogs jumping into the pond will disturb the nesting birds.
- And worryingly, recent studies have shown that tick and flea treatment used on dogs are in fact polluting our watercourses, not just for a few days after treatment but for the entire life of the medicated treatment (up to 3 months). These insecticides cause devastating effects on our water invertebrates. Without these water invertebrates our ecosystems fail to support life.

A Message from our Advertising Officer!

The Pump is now printed into 1400 copies each month and distributed in Hatherleigh and some surrounding villages. It may surprise you, it certainly did me since taking over responsibility for the Pump advertising at the



beginning of the year, that **each** copy of the Pump costs slightly under 50p to produce and print. These are our only costs, everyone involved in the Pump are volunteers. We are all aware of the economic environment over recent years that has led to pressures on all our finances, both personal and business budgets have been stretched to put it lightly. We are blessed at the Pump to have a loyal readership as well as a core of loyal advertisers. In hard times businesses have to watch their finances as we do our own and often any advertising budget can be the first to be cut. This is also true regarding the greatly appreciated donations that have been made. At the Pump it has always been the case that wherever possible advertising and features concerning our community groups, events and happenings have been published free of charge. We are all fortunate to live in communities where there is much going on, it's partly why we love where we live. In our balancing act, it is worth me explaining that our Pump magazine is made up of A4 sheets of paper, laid flat on the longest side and folded in half vertically. This creates the A5 size of the Pump we receive, each sheet folded creating 4 pages in our Pump. There are occasions where incorporating a free community Ad means that, a quarter or half page free Ad actually then leaves three and a half empty pages without income for (multiplied by our 1400 issues).

To enable us to produce the Pump the revenue has always come from advertising costs paid by our advertisers and the relatively small number of donations we have received. In some past years where there has been a surplus the Pump has even made donations to local worthy groups. This has meant that there is no financial cushion in the Pump finances. We have been actively trying to contact former and potential new advertisers to enable the future of the printed Pump to continue and we will continue to do so. We would encourage our readers to mention when using the services of one of our advertisers that you have seen their advertisement in the Pump then that would help them understand that there is a value to them from it.

Perhaps some may say **'why continue printing the Pump ?'** I believe that there is still some need for this to continue, not everyone uses the internet and social media ! There are still many people in our communities who avidly read the Pump each month as it's delivered and keep it to hand as a reference point for events and to search for products & services. The Night Sky April 2024

Clocks have now changed and nights are getting shorter. April is the month of the Lyrid meteor shower. This shower takes place on the night of the 22nd going into the morning of the 23rd. The best time to observe the shooting stars are between 11pm and 4am. This is because the Earths night side will turn into the incoming meteor stream. Around 15-20 meteors per hour spill be visible. The light of a full moon will mean that only the brighter fireballs and meteors will be visible.

April 8th is New Moon. This is a good time to see deep sky objects like galaxies and me nebulae as the moons light won't wash them out.

April 23rd is the night of the full Moon.

the NEW VICARAGE is on its way up. This time next year it should be well and truly occupied and the garden taking shape. We are delighted that the Hatherleigh firm of ERYANT & CHANDLER won the contract.

Not such good news from the CHURCH TOWER. A damaged down-pipe had to be replaced recently at a cost of £200 excluding 15% VAT. At that height the work demanded steeplejacks in a cradle. And at that height an alarming discovery was made. Three cornerstones were fractured, and other stone was crumbling. None of this could be seen from the ground. Fortunately we now have an architect on the PCC, Mr. Robert Harris. On his advice, an emergency meeting of vicar and wardens decided to authorise the steeplejacks to use their cradle to deal with the stonework threatening to crown unsuspecting passers-by. The cost has not been cheapwe are faced with a bill for £450 + VAT. But we have the satisfaction of knowing that the future has been saved a far heavier expense, probably running into some thousands.

But all is not yet well. A proper s urvey of the rest of the tower is imperative and the diocesan surveyor is being asked to attend to this as a matter or urgency.

This lovely old church is our heritage - and our responsibility. Please make the need for financing these repairs known... horizontally and vertically. The claiming of Philippians 4:19 now will ensure Psalm 122:1 in the future.

- There is 1 vacancy, if you are interested in becoming a Councillor please contact the HTC Clerk.
- Unfortunately the Medical Practice staff were unable to attend this meeting due to a personal matter so will be invited again to attend the next meeting to outline their plans for Hatherleigh.
- The School Head Mr Monger and Chair of Governors Mr Hill attended the meeting to outline their
 problems surrounding the School Entrance at drop off and collection times. After a discussion, it
 was decided for us to review the 2nd school entrance so that it could be used in the future and to
 explore a bus stop area on the school side for the school bus to drop off and collect pupils.

Fasolakia (which is just Greek for beans)

I know this looks like a "splodge" but it's an extremely tasty "splodge"! We are great at growing runner and French beans in Devon and whether fresh or frozen, this is a great recipe to use all that lovely produce. I still have lots in the freezer so I'm betting some of you do too.

You can have this on it's own with fresh crusty bread to dip and you can put a slice of Feta on each serving if you wish. It's a great accompaniment for lamb chops or pan fried chicken breast and very easy to make.

Prep your beans as normal and put them in large saucepan

Add 2 - 3 waxy potatoes peeled and cut lengthways into 6 pieces

Pour over a tin of chopped tomatoes and a small jar of sauce or large dollop of tomato puree.

grate a very large onion and add

add as much garlic as you like

a big glug of malt vinegar

a bigger glug of olive oil

a heap teaspoon of sugar

lots of crushed black pepper and salt to taste

lots of fresh or dried oregano

Bring to the boil and simmer for 40 - 60 mins, stirring occasionally.

Exbourne Neighbourhood Plan Update

Whilst it may seem that all has gone quiet on the Neighbourhood Plan front there has in fact been a lot of research taking place over the course of the last year or so. This resulted in the Neighbourhood Plan Group (NPG) presenting a DRAFT Neighbourhood Plan to the Parish Council in October 2023.

The Parish Council is currently reviewing the draft document and hopefully it will make its views known to the NPG in the very near future. The NPG will then consider its views. Further discussions and amendments may be necessary.

The Parish Council delegated the responsibility of creating a Neighbourhood Plan to members of the community, the Exbourne Neighbourhood Plan Group, however the Parish Council is known formally as the 'Qualifying Body, which means that, before the draft plan can go out to the community for consultation, the Parish Council must approve the plan. In the meantime I thought it might be helpful if I reminded the residents of Exbourne what an NP is and what it has to contain.

Many of you will recall that WDBC, following on from Government requirements, indicated that Exbourne should have 30 houses during the plan period of 2014 – 2034. WDBC agreed to count the 9 houses at Cliston View (formerly Woodclose) thus leaving 21 dwellings to be allocated. In preparing the draft plan the NPG has drawn on the responses from our various consultations, including the Community Consultation Day 2017 and the Site Allocation Consultation of 2021, and therefore the draft plan has taken into account the community's preferences and views as far as is possible.

The draft plan is required by law to contain certain information; an Evidence Base with supporting documents, a policy document setting out aims and objectives and a document detailing the justifications for any site allocations. These documents will be available during the public consultation.

The draft plan not only covers where and how many houses should be built but also covers matters concerning the natural environment, the historic built environment, public open space and transport and parking.

The draft plan has taken a number of years to produce. It is a complicated piece of work as it needs to adhere to Government Policy and WDBC's own plan (the latter is the Plymouth & amp; South West Devon Joint Local Plan – usually shortened to JLP).
