





Get Ready To Make Some Music

A vibrant new musical endeavour is coming to West Devon! If you play any instrument or if you love to sing this could be the opportunity you've been waiting for. Stand Sure Orchestra & Choirs are opening their doors in January 2024 and they're looking for you!



The orchestra and choirs will be focussing on mostly contemporary music with strong rock and pop ties...though there will be some gentler "modern" music too. "There are plenty of classical groups out there, but not many 'rock orchestras/choirs' and whilst we're not solely doing rock we won't be singing or playing anything in a traditional classical sense. I'm hoping to reach a wider demographic of players and audience by putting the modern emphasis in place" says Chris J Anderson whose brainchild the project is.

They are welcoming anyone who has a passion and enthusiasm for making music with others. They advise being around grade 5 (or equivalent) on your instrument but this isn't mandatory...as long as you can read music. People who want to give singing a go don't need any experience of singing in a group - they just need to be keen.

They are looking for all the traditional orchestra instruments but would also love guitarists, drummers, percussionists, saxophonists...in fact they won't turn anyone away. "A lot of orchestras and bands will only have a certain number of instruments per section. As a classically trained musician I totally get that, however, I believe the music should be for everyone to enjoy making and if I end up with four electric guitars, five flutes, seven clarinets and a triangle, they'll be put to use! I'm able to write and orchestrate music for the musicians I have" stated Chris.


SSOCs began its life in Wiltshire where Chris fulfilled a near 30-year dream by starting his own orchestra and choir in 2021. After playing and singing for groups most of his adult life Chris decided to seize the opportunity during lockdown to put the necessary plans in place to start. A necessary relocation to Devon meant that the group had to fold. "It was heartbreaking. We were just gaining momentum and a good following. We had six really good concerts under our belts and there was so much more I wanted to do. Moving to Devon was never on the cards as I had some sort of a life established in Wiltshire, however, it just wasn't practical to stay there any more so I'm getting a fresh start in beautiful Devon."

The choirs will be split into three groups. Those in primary school, those in secondary school, and adults. The primary school aged choir will be for those 7 - 11, the secondary school choir will be 12 - 18. The adults will be 16 and over. If any older young people want to join the adult choir they'll be very welcome.

Each group will work on their own songs as well as big group numbers and they'll be performed at our termly concerts. The first concert in March will be hits from musical theatre, in Summer it'll be The Beatles. In Winter there'll be a Halloween Spooktacular, and a Christmas Crackers concert. The orchestra will meet on a Sunday from 11am - 1pm. The choirs will meet on a Thursday; 5 - 6:30pm for Primary, 6:30 - 8pm for Secondary and 8 - 10pm for Adults. All meetings will take place at the Hatherleigh Community Centre starting 7th January 2024.

A termly fee is payable to cover all the necessary costs; which weekly works out cheaper than a swimming session, or, if you prefer, a cup of coffee and slice of cake at your favourite cafe.

The Night Sky December 2023

Nights in December and January are long and cold. It's a great time to observe the night sky. My favourite constellation to observe at this time of year is the constellation of Orion. Orion can be found towards the southern Horizon. The 3 belt stars of Orion make it easily recognisable. Below the 3 stars of Orion's belt you can see the Great Orion Nebula. To the naked eye its a misty patch of light. It's about 1500 light years away. It's what's known as a Stella nursery. New stars are being born in side it. They are formed out of the hydrogen gas within the nebula.

Binoculars help resolve the nebula a little more. As the light has taken 1500 years to reach our eyes we are seeing the nebula as it was 1500 years ago! December 22nd marks the Winter solstice and the first day of Winter in the Northern <u>Hemisphere</u>, Nights will slowly start to get shorter from this point onwards.



Christmas Swirls

I was talking to someone the other day and they were lamenting the fact that 2023 was yet another year when they hadn't got their act together in September to make their own Christmas Cake and Christmas Pudding; both of which things need time to mature. If you have also left it too late for those seasonal labours of love but you want to make a Christmas treat that will fill the house with the lovely smell of spices, dried fruits and marzipan then Christmas Swirls are a great one to try.



You will need:

A straight-sided roasting tin, greased and lined with paper

The zest and juice of an orange

4 tbsp of spirit such as Cointreau, Brandy, Whisky

170g of dried mixed fruit. Use the basic dried mix or add some chopped apricots, cranberries or anything else you fancy

Soak the fruit in the juice and alcohol for a good while and leave until your dough is made. 550g of strong white bread flour, 2 tsp easy bake yeast, 90g caster sugar, 1/2 tsp cinnamon 1/2 tsp nutmeg, 1 large egg, 250ml warm milk, pinch of salt, About 60g of nuts. You can use pistachio, almond, walnut, pecan. Break them up into smallish pieces, 250g-300g block of golden marzipan, a little melted butter, Icing sugar to mix with your left over juice and alcohol to make a drizzle

If you have a bread maker then chuck all the dough ingredients in a normal dough cycle or by hand follow the breadmaking instructions on the flour packet.

However you have made the dough, turn out onto a floured surface when ready and roll out until it is about 70cm x 20 cm. Now think "Swiss Roll" method. Drain your fruit and spread evenly over the dough, sprinkle your nuts evenly too. Make a long thin sausage of marzipan and place it along the long side nearest you and roll the whole thing up so the marzipan is right in the middle.

Cut your roll into 12 even pieces and line them up in your baking tray cut side down so they are just or nearly touching. Cover in cling film and leave for 40-50 mins in a warm place to rise (a good trick is to put your tray on a hot water bottle if you don't have a warm place).

When risen, bake in a pre-heated oven at 180 degrees for about 15-20 minutes dependant on your oven.

Brush the hot swirls with a little melted butter. Mix some / all of your soaking liquid with some icing sugar to make a thick drizzle to pour over the top.

There were 2 Councillor vacancies. Angela Capon and Clare Kemp put their names forward and were duly coopted on to the Council.

What a wonderful weekend, first Hatherleigh Carnival was as spectacular as always and then the Remembrance Day parade and service. Thank you to our wonderful Silver Band for all you do and Reverend Leigh for a moving service. Thank you to the Carnival Committee and all the helpers who made this event such a great success. I know they will give their own thanks elsewhere in this pump but HTC would like to add their thanks and to thank all our Residents who make Hatherleigh such a wonderful place to live.

We have had some news from Devon CC Highways Department about a 20mph zone through Town, but we still need volunteers to join a speed watch group to provide evidence that a 20mph zone is needed. If you would like to volunteer please put your name forward.

The mosaic in the Bus shelter has been repaired and we are awaiting a dry spell to paint the shelter to finish the refurbishment.

Following our letter to the Hatherleigh GP Practice listing patients concerns we have received a response. We have invited the newly appointed Practice Manager to come to a meeting to set out the improvements that the Practice are planning. We understand a new telephone system will be in operation from December.

Hatherleigh Market: You will have seen that the Friends of Hatherleigh Market, with local support and support from Devon County Council, West Devon Borough Council and Hatherleigh Town council are trying to set up a Community Benefit Society to apply for grants to buy the market outright for the benefit of the town. The group aims to raise £100,000 in pledges as 10% match funding from residents and traders. To this end leaflets offering you the chance to contribute to this scheme have been delivered and a public consultation meeting planned for 25th November at Hatherleigh Community Centre. A separate initiative is being set up to raise up to £200,000 to equip the market via crowdfunding and grant funding to fit out the building to make it weatherproof and fit for purpose as a trading and community space for all weather use. The Public meeting will have been held by the time this pump is published. Please keep watch for updates on the Hatherleigh Building Community Facebook page, and the Hatherleigh Town Council website.
