April edition is our 500th Issue. On that note an interesting fact... The original Parish magazine was renamed the Parish Pump in 1978 was A4 and 6 sides. These days we have anything from 42 to 62 A5 pages. In the 60s the magazine was only available to subscribers due to the cost of printing. We rely on our advertisers and donations to fund the printing these days and the costs are ever increasing. Meeth was added to the circulation are in 1987 and in 1995 1000 copies were circulated to the local parishes. When Neil Price took over as editor in 1999 he changed the format from A4 to A5 and increased the news within it, therefore moving forward from a church magazine to a community booklet of events and news from around the parishes.

In 2001 the pump became available online, and in 2009 Monkokehampton joined the circulation, followed by Northlew in 2010, therefore increasing the print to 1400 copies produced 11 times a year. More in next months issue!

On Lent.

Dear friends,

I find myself writing on a rare sunny day today, a reminder that Spring really will come along eventually after Winter which seems to have been going on since June!



And with Spring comes Lent; traditionally a time(40 days) for giving up something you like; an unhelpful prod in the ribs suggesting that Christians and churchy things are all a bit of a killjoy, (which has not been my experience at all). So what is Lent really all about?

In the bible, numbers always have significance and the number 40 stands for a period of time in which God is preparing something or someone for a purpose. The first one was the days of rain after Noah had built the ark [40 days and 40 nights]. Next comes the time of the Israelites' desert wanderings with Moses [40 years] and latterly the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness before beginning his public ministry. Like so many things, a meaningful and purposeful opportunity often gets reduced to something we can make easy rules about. In the case of Lent, an invitation to reflect, review our lives and see where we're heading becomes reduced to giving up chocolate!

So what could you do during Lent? Our busy lives don't often leave space for reflection on where we've been, what we've done, what has happened to us and where we're headed. Pondering these things is a valuable exercise that can save us from just living life by accident and repeating old mistakes. Those of us who follow Jesus will include him in a dialogue about our trajectory and purpose as we prepare to celebrate the amazing events of Easter, but time in reflection can be helpful for anyone; I'd recommend it.

Lynn and I recently went on a retreat at Lee Abbey in Lynton and gave some time to pondering the last year. It seemed to have flown by so fast that I couldn't think that much had been achieved. Then we took stock and realised why we were so whacked! We also had time to make some realistic targets, under God's direction for the coming days. Naturally, life has already thrown some spanners in the works, but we'll hold on to the general direction.

So why not take some time to ponder this Lent, you may find yourself taking up something new instead of giving something up.



Mark Reddaway (Chair/Mayor), Rachel Laycock (Deputy), Deb Laing-Trengove, Kay Walters, Donna Lewis, Richard Burrow, Sadie Harrison, Angela Capon, Clare Kemp

- Councillor Alford has resigned so there is 1 vacancy
- Hatherleigh Market: The Friends of Hatherleigh Market have received a positive result to their
 expression of interest for the Community Ownership Fund. Therefore they are able to submit a
 formal application.
- The amount of pledges have reached over £58,000, please consider a pledge if you haven't already
 done so.
- Further public meetings are planned to move the project forward. The next one is planned for Saturday 9th March 2-4pm in the Community Centre.
- The Market is so important to the Town please come along or support this initiative in other ways if
 you value keeping our Market. Space is short here so please go to the HTC website for up to date
 information.
- The Hatherleigh Practice Manager was unable to attend this meeting so will be invited to attend
 the next meeting to discuss plans for the GP surgery.
- Millennium Corner: DCC have asked if we wish to lease this area and be responsible for the repairs needed. Councillors felt that DCC as owners should be responsible for the repairs in the first instance and then would be open to leasing the area.
- Further works have been completed to Island Park and the Play Park. The Zip wire is installed and
 fully functional. Tension will need to be tightened again once it has had some usage. Thank you to
 Donna Lewis & Adam Hill for all their efforts.
- Further cracking and damage to the skate park is due for repair shortly but this is weather dependant.
- There have been complaints again about safety issues at the School entrance. The Headmaster and
 the Chair of Governors have been invited to the next meeting so that we can understand their
 position and how to resolve the issues around the school entrance.
- 20 is Plenty Campaign: A competition was suggested for Primary School Age children to enter to
 produce a '20 is Plenty' poster to be displayed around Town to help with the campaign to make our
 roads safer.
- There has been an increase in the amount of dog fouling around Town. PLEASE can all dog owners
 be responsible and pick up after their animals and place it in the bins provided. WDBC will be asked
 to place notices around Town to highlight this fouling issue.
- There is very little lighting on the road between the Co op and the Market Quarter. WDBC who own this road will be asked to assess this.

"Hatherleigh Community Wellbeing Fair, 3-6 pm Friday 8 March 2024

Everyone is warmly invited to come along to our free Community Wellbeing Fair in Hatherleigh on Friday 8 March.

Why a Community Wellbeing Event and what exactly is the Transitions Project? Knowing what services and help are available locally is not as easy as you think. It makes life much easier and much more enjoyable if you can talk to representatives of the groups and services face to face.

This is why the Transitions Project has been organising free Community Wellbeing events across Torridge and West Devon to help and encourage local people to find out about their local community groups and services for the last 6 years. (This one will be the 17th event we have held in a rural area; the last time we held one in Hatherleigh was January 2019). These events are designed to help residents gather useful information, find what support is available locally, provide inspiration for them to take up new activities, to make new friends and also to offer an opportunity to have their voices heard. By bringing community groups and services together under one roof, our aim is that we might also reduce social isolation, strengthen local connections and encourage networking.

Transitions is a partnership between West Devon CVS (see www.westdevoncvs.org.uk) and Wis£rmoney (see www.navigatecharity.org.uk). Navigate is funded by the National Lottery Community Fund to provide free, confidential money and debt advice across the rural areas of West Devon and Torridge for those unable to access mainstream support. We work together with community partners to improve rural communities' financial wellbeing and reduce social isolation.

At the event, we will produce a directory for everyone to take home; this will include contact details of all the services represented at the event, which we hope will cover a wide range of both statutory agencies and voluntary organisations relating to many issues and interests, including up to date advice on energy costs and digital inclusion, as well as promoting local leisure interests appealing to all ages. We will also provide free refreshments to everyone, stallholders and members of the public alike.



HATHERLEIGH HISTORY SOCIETY

Our February meeting contained three very different stories of growing up in Hatherleigh, this is a brief outline of two of the stories. The first was written by Thomas Abell who was born in 1848 in Buddle Lane, he was one of ten children, their father was a boot and shoe maker and they lived in two rooms over the pentis and blacksmith's shop and then moved two doors down, again two bedrooms, a kitchen, a small room and their father's workshop. They were very poor as Thomas's father took to gaming and drink. The older boys were sent out to work on local farms at very early ages and expected to work long hours, all for very little money.

The second story told by Violet Mallet Fulford William in her book `Underneath My Patchwork Quilt` was of a very different life. Born in 1888 in Cape Provence Violet`s father was a sheep and Ostrich farmer, her grandfather was Henry Mallet Veale of Passaford House. Henry paid a visit to the farm with his second wife and arranged to bring Violet aged 5 and her younger brother Ralph 3 back to England with him. Violet and Ralph were looked after by a nursery maid and had a fairly formal upbringing but enjoyed the freedom of the gardens and the farm and had a good relationship with many of the people who worked for the Veale`s. Food was plentiful with fruit and vegetables, milk, eggs and meat from the estate, this was also given regularly to many of the families of the workmen and women.

Both of these children went on to carve very full-filling lives for themselves. Thomas had his own building company in Exmouth and at the age of ninety was presented with an MBE. Violet later married the Reverend Henry Fulford Williams and supported him in his work in India during WW1 and then in Portugal before returning to England. We will be sharing their full stories on our Facebook page soon.





Happy Birthday Arthur

We don't have a huge amount of house plants but the ones we do have are really part of the family. House plants are normally given as gifts or bought for special occasions and because of that they can become really quite special. My husband says they're like pets but without the vet bills! Admittedly they won't fetch a ball or sit on your lap and purr but they need care and attention just the same.



Perhaps the best loved plant in our house is Arthur. When my husband was a teenager he bought a "cute" 2 leaf Swiss Cheese Plant (Monstera) and for some reason he named it Arthur. Arthur has been with him in 4 different houses and we worked out that this year he will be 40 years old so I thought I'd say happy birthday by giving him a mention in The Pump.

We have a 20 year old Weeping Fig (Ficus Benjamina) and an Umbrella Plant (Schefflera) which must be nearly as old. We have 2 Orchids that were bought as house-warming presents when we moved in here and a Christmas Cactus and a Spider Plant that were gifts for Christmas 2022.

Apart from being beautiful plants, all of them help cleanse the air in the home and all of the ones I've mentioned, apart from the Weeping Fig and Umbrella Plant are great for homes that suffer from condensation. The Monstera and the Spider Plant are particularly good for sapping condensation out of the air.

If you want plants for the bathroom particularly then a Boston Fern (Nephrolepis Exaltata) or a Money Tree (Pachira Acquatica) are good and for low light conditions the Victorian favourites such as Snake Plant, commonly called Mother-in-law's Tongue and Cast Iron Plant or Aspidistera are the best.

I would love to know if anyone in the town has a houseplant older than Arthur!
