Dear all,

At this point, I feel the need to apologise to the Hatherleigh residents for the church clock ringing out all sorts of erroneous times, confusing us all. So much for the restoration job. As I



write we're awaiting yet again, the return of the 'clock fixer' to come and solve the problem at last.

When I first came here and was trying to get on top of the garden in the little window of time I had before starting work proper, I remember the quarter hours ringing off at what felt like 5 minute intervals, reminding me how little I was accomplishing as time sped past. I've got used to it now, and miss it when it's not there, and get embarrassed every time it's wrong.

I wonder how much good it does us to measure time off in little chunks all day long: does it hurry us along, or give us a sense of security? Certainly our ancient forbears knew nothing of hours and minutes, only sunrise and sunset, and the things to do at hand in between. I'm not blaming the clock, but I wonder when you last stopped to smell a flower, listen to birdsong, or observe the constantly changing beauty of the sky? We are temporary creatures on this earth, even if we do look forward to eternity with God in hope.

So pull yourself up once in a while; take a moment to gaze at your loved ones faces; make the effort to tell them how precious they are, even if you feel silly doing it. Maybe make that phone call you've been putting off, or write that letter [if anyone does that anymore]. I can't tell you the encouragement it is when people take the trouble, often in their grief, to write their thanks to me.

For me, life is a balancing act, to determine the urgent from the important, and not forget the latter. So I encourage you to remember the important; those things relating to this life and the next, and make space for them for our time is limited. With that in mind I would like to repeat my constant invitation to our churches; you will be warmly welcomed, find space to reflect, and be encouraged in your eternal journey in the love of Jesus.

So may God help you to accept what is with peace and look forward in hope to what will be, but also to seize the moment to live!#

Outside Your Own Home:

1. If you are able, keep the area outside your own home free of self-seeding plants & grasses by pulling up visible weeds by hand, and sweeping away debris which provides the ideal environment for seeds to grow.

2. If you are able clear weeds from the area between the house and the pavement; local councils will not pull up weeds here, as this is a homeowner responsibility.

3. If you frequently park on the road, pull the weeds between the road and the pavement, near your property/car, and sweep away any debris, as local authority vehicles are unable to use their equipment to sweep and clear these areas due to the prevalence of on-street parking during the day.

4. If you have a neighbour or family member who can't manage these activities themselves, consider doing points 1-3 for them too.

These relatively small individual actions can create one big community action that will contribute towards keeping our whole town looking tidy and welcoming for locals and visitors.

Hatherleigh Bellringers

Hatherleigh Bellringers took part in the six-bell Okehampton Deanery Competition at Bridestowe on 7th June. We haven't rung in a competition for a while and it was the first time for three of our ringers, Jess Lewis, Mark Reddaway and Zoe Wonnacott. Our two intermediate teams came in 2nd and 3rd. Congratulations to all.

Competitions are judged on the quality of ringing and, as outlined in the May Pump, this requires skill and practice. Ringing a pattern of notes on church bells and systematically changing these patterns (known as change-ringing) is made possible because of the way in which church bells are hung. Activated basically by means of a rope, pulley and a wheel, a church bell swings a full circle in one direction, and swings back in the other with the clapper striking the bell on each swing. The weight of the bell itself does a lot of the work. Good ringers have a high level of control and patterns of bell notes should change without gaps or clashing.

This style of 'full-circle' change-ringing only became common after the Reformation in the late 16th – early 17th centuries. According to archaeological reports, Hatherleigh's church tower was built in the mid to late 15th century. As the whole point of a tower was to hang bells, we assume that bells were hung in the completed tower. But the first tower-hung bells at Hatherleigh are not likely to have been hung with a full wheel. A full wheel, and change-ringing, probably came later.

Bellringing has a long history and now that we have restored our bells we'd like to

keep this ancient tradition alive in Hatherleigh. If you'd like to come along on a Wednesday evening just to see what we do, please contact us through our Facebook page or phone Mark Wonnacott on 07870 307441. If you would like to learn to ring, or you're a ready-made bellringer and would like to join us, you are also warmly welcome to get in touch. You don't have to live in Hatherleigh to ring our bells!

Samuel Poole was a wool dyer living in Tudor Street, Exeter, in the later 18th century. His notebook offers a colourful insight into daily life on Exe Island and the importance of a network of leats which powered the many textile related businesses.

The Night Sky July 2025

July days are long and nights are short having recently passed the June Solstice. It is possible to spot Mercury low in the West on and around the 4th July. Wait until after the Sun has set. Mercury orbits the Sun in just 88 days. Full Moon falls on July 10th.

New Moon falls on July 24th and it is at this time that fainter celestial objects are best observed. If you look towards the southern sky you can see the bright star Antares. It is part of the constellation of Scorpio. We are looking more towards the centre of our galaxy.

July 28th going into early hours of the 29th will see the Delta Aquarid meteor shower. There will be dark moon free skies as it sets early. This means we could see up to 20 meteors per hour at its peak.

As well as spending time developing their 3-year-old ¾ acre garden including building ornamental ponds, and a waterfall, at Mowhay, Merton, Neil also has the role as social media for the NGS, and Kerry is the assistant county organiser for North West Devon, she has an enthusiastic passion for gardening and has designed and planned their own garden. Kerry's journey into the Nation Garden Scheme, started some 8 years ago, living in Hampshire when she convinced the county organiser to include their small suburban garden into the Scheme. The couple moved to Devon taking many of their plants with them, as the owners of their home were not interested in gardening.

The NGS was founded in 1927 by Miss Elsie Wagg of the Queens Nursing institute who came up with the idea of raising money for district nursing through the nation's obsession with gardening, opening privately owned gardens in on selected dates for charity.

The scheme has raised over £70 million, since it began and now opens over 3,500 gardens a year. Since 1948 and the creation of the NHS it has changed the nature of the support it gives, now supporting Marie Curie, Macmillan, Hospice UK, and many others. Neil and Kerry were thanked by Liz for their enthusiastic, fun and very entertaining talk. Members were soon taking the yellow brochures to plan their garden visits which are open until the beginning of November.

The Secret Life of Strawberries

If you've been growing your own strawberries this year then you have either already harvested or are harvesting now, so when the last strawberry is eaten, what to do with your plants then?



Definitely don't chuck them on the compost and buy new next year. If you bought young plants then they will have at least 3 years more cropping from them if you do the right things now and if you are in control of what happens to them from now until the next crop then you may well find you have as good, or even better strawberries next year.

Once you have harvested, the worst thing you can do is just ignore the plants and hope they'll produce loads of fruit next year.... they won't. If you have grown strawberries in a bed and had problems with every other creature eating your berries before you get to them or problems with mould then I would recommend growing them in 2ltr pots; this is what I do and now the crop is over, the pots are standing in a watering tray which I keep topped up with a soluble feed so the plants can bulk up for winter and make lots of baby runners too. I keep the pots weed free and take off any dead leaves. If they put out runners I just ensure the base of the running plant is touching the water and when they start putting out some sturdy roots I cut them from the mother plant and pot them up in a 1ltr pot and let them sit in a feed tray too.

You may think "why am I lavishing all this attention on a plant that's not producing anything for me?!" but the magic is that between harvest and going dormant for the winter, the crown is already growing the budlets for next year's harvest. You can't see the budlets and when the rest of the plant goes dormant over winter, they do too but when conditions are right next year they will spurt into action and produce your fruit. A few weak over wintered budlets means smaller, weaker, fewer fruits next year.

When it's time for the plants to go dormant, mix a little compost with some chicken manure and lightly dress the top of the pot but do not cover the crown. Place the pots on any bare patch of soil that you have liberally sprinkled with chicken manure and only then can you set about the hard work of totally ignoring them until next year. If you follow these simple steps you will ensure that your initial purchase goes on producing plants and fruit for years to come and, if you have not grown strawberries yet, then I would recommend that you buy your strawberry plants in the late summer so you can have control of your crop for next year (you'll also find the plants will be a lot cheaper too!)
